

Jones, the first to reach us at the scene of the accident, for remaining helpful throughout the day, and to Dr. Childress and staff for prompt and efficient aid; to the bank representative for his extended courtesies to place possessions in his vault; to Landrum and Collins Motor Co., for the many helpful courtesies shown us, and to the ambulance crew-especially to the driver when he gave these words of encouragement. 'Now, don't worry, Mrs. Carrell, you are not alone. This is a small town; but a friendly town and anyone who can is ready to help you. Anyway they can help they will if you just express it. Just take it easy-you have no need to worry.' He was so right.
