KISS AND BLOW—As a Saturday Evening Post editorial puts it, "Right to work" laws have received both a kiss and a blow in recent weeks."

The blow is found in a decision made by the National Labor Relations Board concerning Indiana's rights to work law—a law which, like similar laws in 18 other states, says that a worker may or may not join a union, as he voluntarily chooses, and in either case have the right to work at his trade. The board held that a union-inspired device known as the "agency shop," under which workers must pay fees equal to union dues even though they are not union members, is legal.

The kiss, on the other hand, came from a much higher authority than the Board — the Supreme Court of the United States. The Court upheld a decision of the highest court in Kansas—another right to work law state—holding that the "agency shop" requirement is an evasion of the intention of that law.

It is difficult to see how any reasonable person can agree with the Board's action or quarrel with the Supreme Court's. Congress—when it authorized state right to work laws in the federal Taft-Hartley act—clearly intended that the wishes of workers in the matter of union membership be respected, and that coercion by either union or employer should be outlawed. Those wishes certainly extend to the payment of dues or fees. Right to work would be a hollow protection indeed if a man had to pay for real or fictitious benefits and services he didn't want and didn't get.

Her ad featured some blouses and coordinates which are a product of "Patty's Of Texas." The ad said "Patty's" instead of "Patty's".

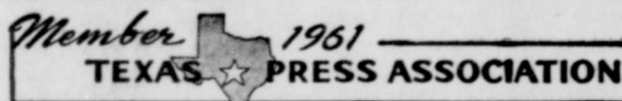
