He was chosen on the all district football team for the past three years, being a unanimous choice the last two years. He also was named on the class A All West Texas team this past year. Benningfield played only six games the past season before suffering a broken collar bone injury. He made 1,024 yards rushing and scored 98 points, just six points less than the leading scorer in the district. Not only is he an outstanding athlete but he also maintained an A average in his school work which is one of Rice's requirements for their athletic scholarships.





\$1,868.20 Added Screwworm Fund **During Past Week**

Livestock producers in Mills County contributed \$1,868.20 to the Screwworm Eradication Fund during the past week, according to report from Glynn Collier, treasurer of the County Animal Health Committee.

This brings the total contributed in the county to \$20,467.98, the report shows. Goal for Mills County is \$24,000, and the committee is moving ahead with the drive to reach the goal.

Favorable reports have been streaming into the Mission headquarters for several weeks. leading Foundation trustees to state they have no doubt that the necessary funds will be collected. The Foundation announced last month that livestock producers and sportsmen must raise the remaining \$1,000,000 of a \$3,000,000 goal by March 1 to keep the three year eradication program from being halted.

Progress report from Foundation headquarters for the past week included the following: "Although weather prevented fly dispersal in many areas last week, 69,422,500 sterile flies were released for a program total of 2,243,072,860. Two twin-engine aircraft have been borrowed from the Forest Service to help fly the barrier from Del Rio to the Arizona-New Mexico line until other multi-engine planes secured for the program are delivered. The barrier between those two points is now about 70 miles wide."



Payroll during the year totals \$145,812 which is paid to 43 members of the faculty and employees.

Annual budget for Goldthwaite school system this year is \$200,172. This does not include lunchroom operations.

There are 25 teachers and administrators in the school system.

The school system operates six buses and two private carriers driving approximately 102,000 miles per year.

Estimated value of school buildings, land and equipment and all physical facilities of the district would run in the neighborhood of \$700,000. These include Elementary School, High School Gymnasium, Stadium, Agriculture Building, Storage Building, High School Lunchroom and approximately 80 acres of land.

Total enrollment for the 1962-63 year has now reached 494 pupils for both high school, junior high and elementary school.

Goldthwaite Schools operate two modern lunchrooms serving an average of 420 meals daily and total expected for the year of 73,500.




