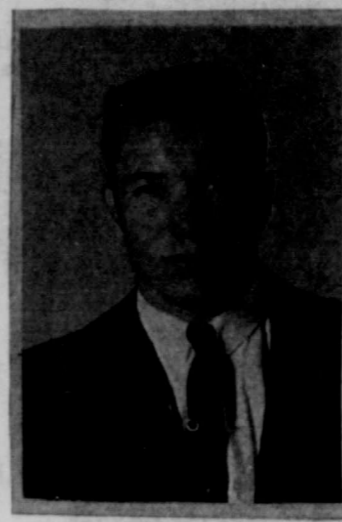

## Livestockmen Are Urged To Send Information With Samples

Livestockmen sending larvae specimens to screwworm eradication headquarters at Mission are urged by County Agent George Reese to be sure the information sheet that should accompany the sample is filled out completely and accurately.  
Eradication officials have reported that numerous samples are received with no information included. Some have been identified as screwworms.  
Reese stated that prompt action is taken whenever an infestation is confirmed. In most instances, additional sterile flies are dispersed over the infested farm or ranch and livestock near the infested premises are sprayed at program expense.  
"When samples are received with no information as to where it was collected, no action can be taken," the county agent said. "This could permit additional infestations to develop because no special sterile fly and spray treatment can be given to the area."  
Eradication officials report less than 20 per cent as many screwworm infestations have been experienced during the first four months of 1963 as during the same period last year. If livestock producers continue to inspect their animals at least twice a week, treat wounds and infestations, collect samples and report cases, officials feel there should be no recurrence of heavy infestations as experienced last year.

**Your REPRESENTATIVE Reports**

The bills that your representative has fought hard to pass in the past four years have finally passed by the House and are awaiting the governor's signature. It makes San Angelo your year, State substitution in 1965.

Two years ago I was one of the co-sponsors with Representative Forrest Harding of Tom Green County of a similar bill which passed the House but died in the waning days of the session due to a filibuster in the Senate.

Many students from our 65th District have attended or are now attending the San Angelo College. San Angelo College offers one of the finest facilities and plant facilities to the State of Texas. The final passage, after a long and bitter debate, was by a favorable vote of 80 to 62. This is a most significant day in Texas education. It means that the young people of our area are going to have an even better opportunity to acquire baccalaureate degree education.

The new college was endorsed by the State Commission on Higher Education and had the support of Governor John Connally, Lieutenant Governor Preston Smith, and Speaker Byron Tunnell. Even so the San Angelo College bill, marred by personality conflicts in the House since it received committee approval last month, was presented and followed by biting personal privilege speeches from House members who opposed the legislation.

The followed pieces of legislation, which were supported and/or sponsored by your Representative have passed the Legislature during the last 10 days:

House Bill 11, which creates a Texas Tourist Development Agency for the purpose of further publicizing Texas in order to attract more tourists, has been signed by the Governor. Since the Highland Lakes are in our District and ours is an area of much wild life and fishing recreation, this bill will be a direct benefit to our District.

H. J. R. 30, which will submit to the people of Texas a Constitutional Amendment providing for a mandatory reapportionment of the State's Congressional Districts after each census by the Legislature and provides for a board to do it in the event the Legislature fails, passed the House last Tuesday.

H. B. 31 is the major transportation bill being considered by the Legislature this session and is a measure which redefines the definition of a "motor carrier" in such a way as to make enforceable violations by illegal, "hot cargo carriers," in the oil field areas. This measure, after a stiff fight, passed the House by a favorable vote of 67 to 62 and is being considered in the Senate. Since I was one of the two co-authors of the measure in the House, our own Senator Louis Crump is handling this measure in the Senate.

House Bill 457, which provides stiffer penalties and greater enforcement against "hot check" givers, has passed the House and is pending in the Senate.

S. B. 223, which clarifies immunity of an employer from liability for damages over and above statutory benefits on account of injury or death of an employee and clarifies the immunity of workmen's compensation insurance carriers from liability for damages as a result of accident prevention activities, passed the House last week and is awaiting the Governor's signature.

Finally S. B. 338 by our Senator Louis Crump, which would authorize the penitentiaries to manufacture products to be used only by State agencies, is probably one of the most important bills to be passed during this session of the Legislature. Not only will it save the State hundreds of thousands of dollars in the years to come, but it will provide excellent vocational and rehabilitation training for the new inmate in our State prison system.

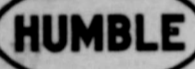

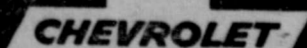

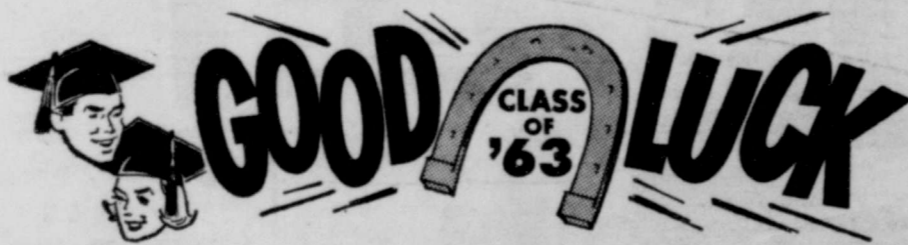
