Reese stated that prompt action is taken whenever an infestation is confirmed. In most instances, additional sterile flies are dispersed over the infested farm or ranch and livestock near the infested premises are sprayed at program expense. "When samples are received with no information as to where it was collected, no action can be taken," the county agent said. "This could permit addi-

tional infestations to develop

because no special sterile fly

and spray treatment can be

given to the area." Eradication officials report less than 20 per cent as many screwworm infestations have been experienced during the first four mounths of 1963 as during the same period last year. If livestock producers continue to inspect their animals at least twice a week, treat wounds and infestations, collect samples and report cases, officlais feel there should be no reoccurrence of heavy infestations as experienced last year.

House Bill 11, which creates a Texas Tourist Development Agency for the purpose of further publicizing Texas in order to attract more tourists, has been signed by the Governor. 
