Pumping installation at the river will be sufficient to fill the settling basin, or storage reservoir, in 16 to 18 days. This will allow for pumping water when it is at its best and it will not be necessary to take water from the river when it is flooding or when it is low in

Storage reservoir will cover 10 acres and will be 10 feet deep, holding 100 acre feet of water. After allowing 41 acre feet for evaporation and siltation this will provide enough water to run the city of Goldthwaite from two to three months without pumping from the river.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION TO BE the Constitution of the State of Texas, amending Sections 51-a and 51-b-l of Article III so that the same shall consist of one Section to be known as Section 51-a; providing that the Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance to and provide for the payment of same to (1) citizens of Texas who are needy aged persons over the age of sixty-five (65) years of age who are permanently and totally disabled. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEG-ISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: ISLATURE OF THE STATE OF

Section I. That Sections 2 and 4
of Article VI of the Constitution
of the State of Texas be amended
to read, respectively, as follows:
"Section I. Every person subject
to none of the foregoing disqualifications who shall have attained the
age of twenty-one years and who
shall be a citisen of the United
States and who shall have resided in
this state one year next preceding an
election and the last six months
within the district or county in which
such person offers to vote, shall be
deemed a qualified elector: provided
that any member of the Armed
Forces of the United States or component branches thereof, or in the
military service of the United States,
may vote only in the county in which
he or she resided at the time of entering such service so long as he
or she is a member of the Armed
Forces; and provided further, that
before offering to vote at an election a voter shall have registered if
required by law to do so. The Legislature may authorise absentes votlng. This Amendment shall take effect on December 1, 1963.




