The two official groups discussed plans for development of the water supply system that will be financed by the \$425,000 water bonds approved by voters Tuesday.

Bob King, representing Joe J. Rady & Associates, engineers, and Henry Keller, representing The First of Texas Corp., bond firm, met with the council and water district supervisors.

Plans are expected to move ahead on the project as fast as details can be worked out and plans and specifications can be undertaken.

The group discussed terms of the proposed contract between the city and the water district for the purchase of water and operation of the system.

## Angora Goat Show, Sale Here Friday And Saturday

Friday and Saturday of this week will be two big days for goat and mohair producers of Central Texas.

Members of Central Texas Registered Angora Breeders' Association will have their seventh annual show and sale at the Show barns in Goldthwaite.

Goats will be in their pens by 9 a. m. Friday and will be judged starting at 9:30 o'clock, by Armer Earwood, national known judge, of Sonora, Texas, for the

champion buck and doe of the show. Mr. Earwood will place the top 20 bucks and the top 10 does starting at 1:00 p. m. Friday.

The sale will be held starting promptly at 1:00 p. m. on Saturday.

There will be a barbecue dinner served on the ground.

The sale will offer 118 bucks and 35 does which were selected by Stanley Lackey of Junction. The 118 bucks were selected out

of 240 and the 35 does were picked from 78. Mr. Lackey has selected the sale goats for the association several years and commented that the ones selected for the sale this year are the best group the sale has ever offered.

The goats offered for sale have been consigned by 20 Angora breeders. The association has about 60 members in Mills, Comanche, Hamilton, Coryell, Brown, Lampasas and San Saba counties.

The Central Texas Registered Angora Goat Breeders' Association was organized for the purpose of improving the Commercial and Registered Angora flocks in this area and for the convenience of those in need of better stud and range bucks and top quality does, according to Col. V. Z. Cornelius, president of the association.

## County Disaster Committee Makes Request For Drought Program Aid

The Mills County Disaster Committee composed of E. L. Burkett, chairman; George Reese and Marlis Barker, members, held a meeting Wednesday morning, August 28, at the ASCS Office and requested by telephone to the State Disaster Committee in College Station that Mills County be included in the Drought Programs of grazing diverted acres under the Wheat, Feed Grain, and Conservation Reserve Programs. Also, that the county be eligible to receive surplus grain sorghum for feeding purposes at a reduced rate.

A meeting of a number of producers in Mills County will be held Thursday, August 29, at 9:30 a. m. at the Mills County State Bank Community Room to review the situation in the various parts of the county.

If this group of producers determines that conditions are such that a Drought Program is needed in Mills County, the County Disaster Committee will proceed to file a formal written application with the State Disaster Committee.

## Appeal Made By CROP Officials For Cull Animals To Be Sold

August 30 and September 6 have been set as Sale Days at the local auction by the Mills County CROP board meeting in session last week.

Proceeds from the sale of animals for CROP will be used to purchase canned meat to be distributed by Church World Service, CROP, which had its origin in the Friendship Food Trains after World War II, continues to serve as a person to person effort to share food.
