Engineering representatives have been on the scene and working with city officials in selecting location for the proposed off-channel storage reservoir which is expected to be at the Sykes location.

Core drilling got underway Wednesday and as soon as the off-channel storage reservoir location is selected work will move ahead. Survey crews are expected to be here next week.

Bob King, representing the city's engineering firm, stated Tuesday night that if everything goes well, it is hoped that the system may be in operation by the middle of next Summer.

tionist.

Smith, who is assigned to the SCS to assist the Brown-Mills Conservation District, said that the new publication lists the opportunities for outdoor recreation close to home, gives suggestions on how to find them, and describes the farm and ranch people who will be your hosts. It tells about campgrounds, vacation farm and ranches, swimming and boating, fishing and hunting. Just walking and enjoying nature are there for your asking.

A copy of this publication may open up ideas for enjoying outdoor fun right in your own neighborhood that you never realized existed.

A Mills County Disaster Group Meeting was held in the Community Room of the Mills County State Bank last Thursday with George Reese serving as discussion leader.

This group consisted of a good representation for all county areas.

The purpose of the meeting was to hear thoughts and ideas of the group in order to present their recommendations with the application for Mills County to the State Disaster Committee.

Lee W. Tabor discussed the Disaster Program regulations. A discussion period was held.

Each individual present gave a report on feed conditions from the area which he represented. After the discussion it was the decision of the group that Mills County be included in a drought feed grain program.

The Mills County Disaster Committee consisting of Edgar L. Burkett, chairman; George Reese and Marlis Barker, members, met Tuesday morning, September 3, at the ASCS office. At that time application was signed and submitted to the State Disaster Committee requesting that Mills County be declared a disaster area and that the county be eligible to graze soil bank and diverted acreages. Also, that the county be eligible to receive surplus feed grains at reduced prices. The group requested that goats be included as foundation livestock, and that grain cubes be made available for feeding cattle.
