**Survey Work Continues On Water Project**

Survey work for the Goldthwaite water improvement system is moving ahead on schedule, it was announced this week by W. C. Barnett, city manager.

More than one hundred core drillings were made the past week taking samples of soil to determine the best and most feasible location for the off-channel storage reservoir.

Soil analyses are now in the process of being made and survey work will continue during the next two weeks, to determine right-of-way and the river location for pumping facilities.

Tentative plans call for the off-channel storage reservoir to be located on the Floyd Sykes property.

Engineers are working on plans and specifications for the project.

Bonds are in the process of being prepared and printed now and will be sold to the best bidder on Monday, October 7.

**FILTRATION PLANT LOCATION SELECTED**

Site for the filtration plant has been located and definitely established. The filter plant will be on city property located west of the Goldthwaite Memorial Cemetery.

The plant will be constructed at the corner of highway 16 and farm road known as "Lover's Lane," on the north side of the highway. Locating the plant on city owned property will eliminate the cost of purchasing plant site.

The fighting Eagles successfully survived the Dublin aerial attack last Friday night in a football thriller. In the opening seconds of the first quarter the Eagles drove 63 yards in twelve plays for the first tally of the game. The Dublin Lions, however, not to be out done, tied the score within minutes of the start of the second quarter. With 10:36 left in the game the score was still tied, each team having made another tally. But a beautiful pass from Eagle quarterback Gene Gray which deflected off the hands of end Clyde Cockrum into the arms of halfback Jim Childress made the Eagles soar to an 18-12 victory over the Lions.

With 5:28 remaining in the 1st period the score was Goldthwaite 6 and Dublin 0. There were no serious threats the remainder of this period, but on the first play of the second quarter Dublin quarterback Gary Sharp threw a pass to halfback Danny Prater who went 85 yards to pay dirt. A quick pass from Sharp to fullback John Turney was unsuccessful for the PAT and the score was tied 6-6.

On the kickoff the Eagles returned the ball to the 50 and when the clock read 5:19 the score read Goldthwaite 12 and Dublin 6. Again the try for extra points was unsuccessful. The Lions were threatening again before the end of the quarter, but a strong Eagle defense held them until the clock ran out.

In the second half a 52 yard run by Turney set up the second Dublin TD with 10:36 remaining in the game. Again the score was tied 12-12.

The winning toss from Gray to Childress came in the last quarter and the Eagles held for an 18-12 victory.

This makes the Eagles' second win of the season, having defeated San Saba in the opener. This week will be the first home game when they take on Evant.

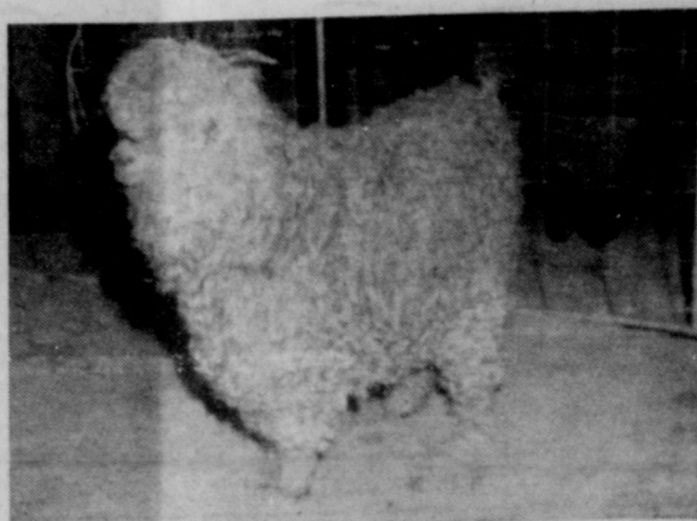

need of repairs.

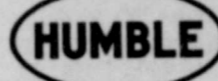

lime and fertilizer and air  
soil until 15th of October.

Plants should be ready for

of October.

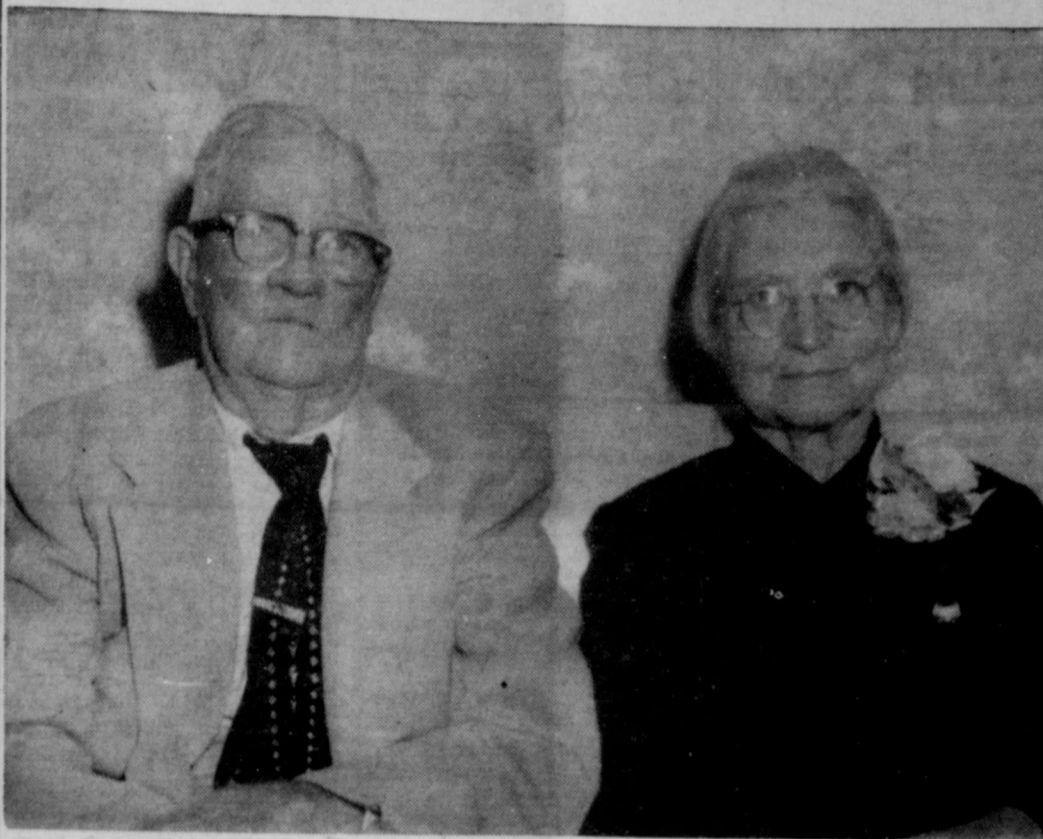
Mr. Biddle was a deputy sheriff of Tarrant County until he suffered a stroke in 1960.
