## Mills County Designated As Drought Area

The Secretary of Agriculture has approved Mills County to be eligible to graze or hay Soil Bank Land, according to announcement by the ASCS office in Goldthwaite.

An application to graze or hay this acreage must be filed and approved prior to using such acreage, the announcement pointed out.

A reduction in payment must be made if payment has not been made or a refund of part of the payment must be made where payment has been made to the producer.

Diverted acreage under the 1963 Feed Grain and Wheat Stabilization Programs may be grazed without a reduction in payment beginning Oct. 1, 1963. For additional information producers should contact the ASCS office in Goldthwaite.

Also Mills County was designated as an emergency area and eligible to receive surplus feed grain at reduced rates for eligible livestock.

The ASCS office was expected to have forms and instructions to start accepting requests for feed grain on Wednesday, according to Lee W. Tabor, office manager of the Mills County ASCS.

"The Lions Club has been responsive to the needs of the community. This has been and will always be the primary aim of the club in a program of service to the community," Cruzcosa stated.

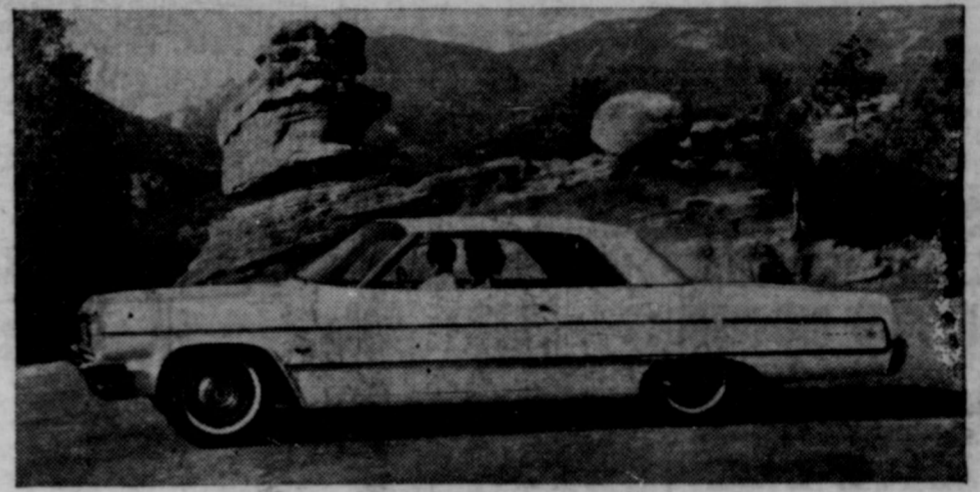
Activities and programs for the coming meetings are the following.

The three teams running ahead of Goldthwaite in the Class A list of the top ten are: 1, Albany, 2, New London, 3, Pearlman. Those following Goldthwaite in the 10 include: 5, Seagraves, 6, Jefferson, 7, White Oak, 8, Rosebud, 9, Ingleside, 10, Hull-Daisetta and Munday (tied).

The Goldthwaite Eagles picked up their third victory of the season by defeating the Evant Elks 52-6 here Friday night.

Recovering an Evant fumble on their own 25 Eagle halfback Jim Childress dashed 75 yards for the first score of the evening. This is very much the way the entire game went.

Fullback Harlan Jernigan scored the second TD ending a 60 yard Eagle drive. A quick pass from quarterback Gene Gray to Childress for the extra points made the score 14-0.

Cecil Campbell ran 63 yards for the next TD with Childress making the extra points. The score stood at 22-0 at the end of the first quarter.

In the second period Cecil Campbell scored again on a 90 yard run and the extra point attempt by James Cook failed, leaving the score 28-0.

At halftime the Eagles led 34-0 after Jimmy Ball ran 52 yards to pay dirt.

The Elks picked up their lone 6 pointer in the third quarter when Don Comer intercepted an Eagle pass and ran 70 yards to the goal line.

The Eagles bounced back, however, and Jerry Rountree carried the ball 51 yards for a TD and then tackle Gene Auldridge kicked a 3 point field goal making the score 44-6.

Gray picked up the final 6 points and Rountree carried for the PAT adding another 2 ending the game at 52-6.

The rushing averages for the evening were as follows: Gene Gray 10.6; Harlan Jernigan 17.6; Jim Childress 44; Cecil Campbell 39.7; Jerry Rountree 17.2; Jimmy Ball 28; and Tommy Hudson 10.2. The total rushing yardage was 498 yards.
