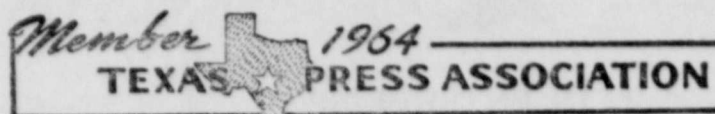

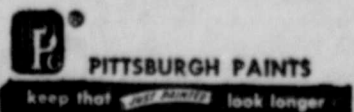

News From Your COUNTY HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT

These first few months since I have been with you as Mills County Home Demonstration Agent have been rich rewarding months for me as I hope they have been for all of you of Mills County.

The County Home Demonstration Council has meant very much in the planning and carrying out of all activities concerning them this year. A County Home Demonstration Council is a committee elected by the home demonstration clubs of the county and responsible to them and to the county home demonstration agent. The council and the officers—Mrs. H. J. Leonhard, chairman; Mrs. L. C. Bunting, vice-chairman; Mrs. Norman Duren, secretary, and Mrs. Nelson Waggoner, treasurer, have done a splendid job of carrying out all home demonstration activities.

The home demonstration clubs attended the 4-County Camp in Comanche and Mrs. Nelson Waggoner was elected chairman for the 1964 Camp to be held in Goldthwaite. Other activities this past summer were the annual Family Picnic at Mullin and a workshop on Summer Care of Shrubs and Trees.

In September Mrs. Ruby Ross, T. H. D. A. Chairman, and Mrs. K. B. Henry attended the state T. H. D. A. meeting in San Antonio and came back with many interesting and worthwhile activities to share with all of the club members.

An achievement day Birthday Luncheon was held in the Methodist Fellowship Hall in October. Each club showed the many things they had done throughout the year. Also, in October the agent and eight club ladies attended a Clothing Consumer Day Meeting sponsored by the San Saba Clothing Committee in San Saba.

Training meetings were held and the agent gave demonstrations to all of the home dem-

onstrations clubs. Many other activities took place but these were a few of the highlights for 1963.

The 4-H activities were highlighted by a clothing workshop this past summer followed by the Mills County 4-H Dress Revue. Two girls from our county attended and took part in the District 4-H Dress Revue in Stephenville and placed with blue ribbons in each of their divisions. We're very proud of all of the 4-H'ers who take part in so many activities. Remember the Youth of Today are the Adults of Tomorrow.

The first week in July the agent and three girls attended District Camp in Brownwood. August was the time for working on 4-H Records, picnics and swimming.

With the beginning of school 4-H activities slowed down with 4-H night meetings and District 4-H Council meeting in Clifton attended by the agent and Lynda Cook from Star.

In November the agents, a boy and a girl and their parents from Mills County attended the annual Gold Star Banquet in Stephenville. This was a very memorable night for two wonderful 4-H'ers.

Training meetings were held for the adults in 4-H subject matter areas as will be the situation throughout the coming year.

The Mills County Written Program which was begun before this agent came was mimeographed and copies are in our office for anyone wishing to learn more about their county. 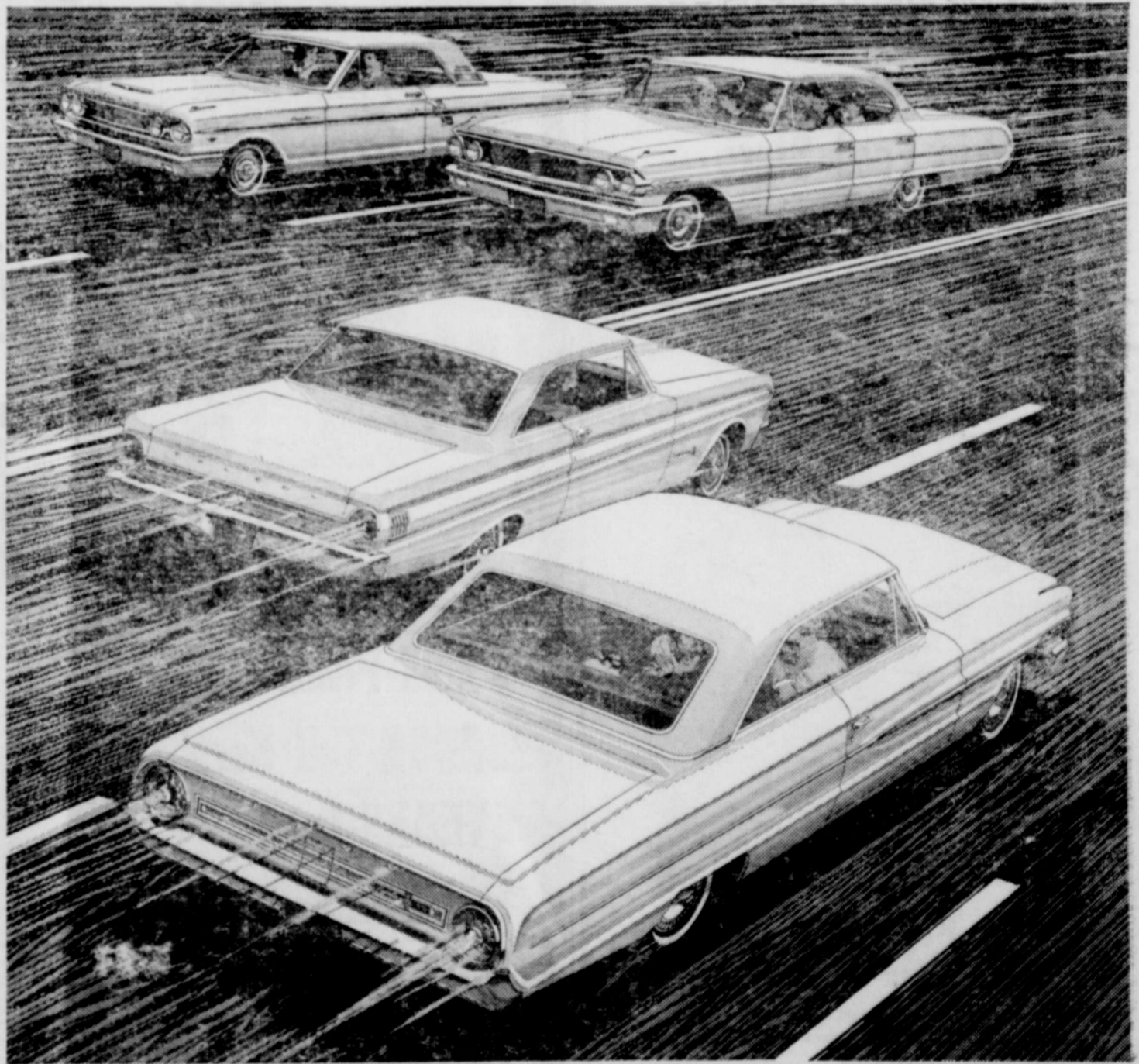

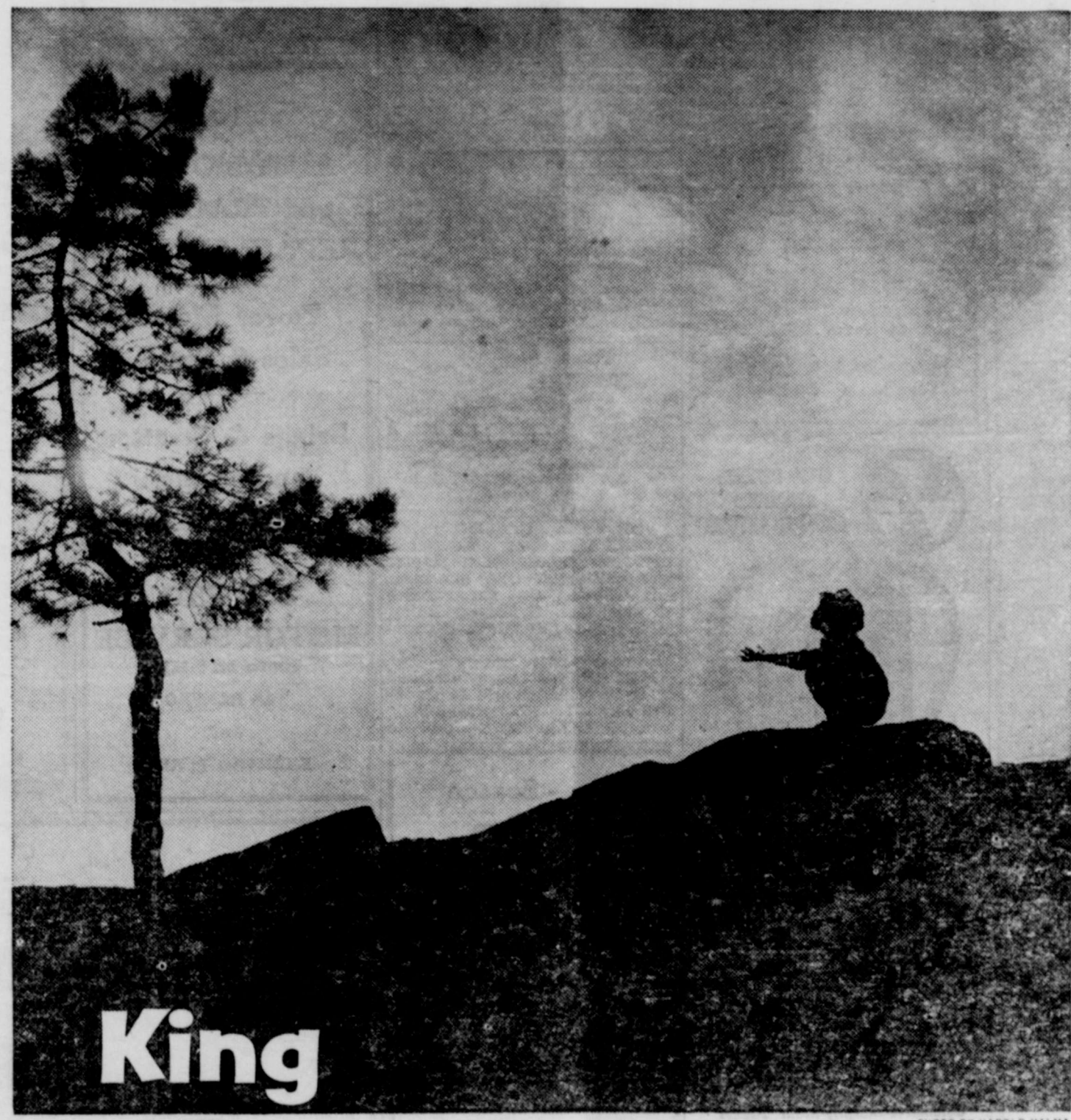
