

Jorrie had resigned February 1, and his successor has been named. Willis' place was automatically vacated when he filed for the Senate. His successor, too, has been named,

The decisions also will apply to a Port Arthur city councilman, Bob Wyde, and to a Fort Worth constable, O. L. Watson Jr., both of whom had filed in the Democratic primary for legislative seats.

Attorneys for two big discount stores challenged Sunday closing laws. Shoppers World Inc. of Corpus Christi claimed any type of article may be sold on Sunday if customers sign a certificate that their purchase is necessary to their welfare, health or safety. Spartan stores' attorney attacked the 1961 blue law's constitutionality.

In the Third Court of Civil Appeals, a 1960 ordinance by which LaPorte annexed 12 square miles of territory in Harris County won approvel in a decision reversing the trial court.

Redistricting Hearing Set

Houston federal court has set the showdown hearing on congressional redistricting for Friday (March 27).

"We will be ready," said Atty. Gen. Waggoner Carr who had anticipated an early setting.

Outcome of the case will determine whether Texas must hold statewide elections for all congressmen or perhaps hastily redraw congressional boundaries in a special session of the Legislature.

U. S. Supreme Court has upheld the Houston court's October 19 finding that present districts are unconstitutionally drawn in favor of rural areas. It has permitted the state to go back to the lower court, however, to explain problems involved in statewide congressional voting after the regular election process already has been set in motion.

Houston court has held - and the Supreme Court agreed that districts must be based as nearly equal in population as is feasible. Texas districts, if absolutely equal, would contain 416,000 population each, They

now vary from 216,371 to 951,527. State Democratic administration wants to delay effect of the ruling until the next regular

Katherine Arnold Attends Medical Records Institute

Katherine E. Arnold, office manager for Childress and Cruzcosa Clinic and Hospital, attended the Basic Institute for Medical Record Personnel conducted by the American Association of Medical Record Librarians in Dallas last week.

Parcel Post Rate Increase

reminded residents of Goldthwaite that an effective date of April 1 has been set for new domestic parcel post rate increases.

The parcel post increase approved recently by the Interstate Commerce Commission and averaging about 13.1%-is expected to yield about 75.4 million annually.

Catalog rates will be increased approximately 13% and will produce added revenue of about \$2.4 million if 1962 volume is maintained.

The higher rates do not affect air parcel post or international parcel post.

Postmaster Fairman said she has been advised by Postmaster General John A. Gronouski that the decision of the ICC will assist the Post Office Department in carrying out its objective of reducing the drain on the Federal Treasury by \$100

The last parcel post increase was on February 1, 1960, the postmaster pointed out.

To illustrate the effect on the new rates here, Mrs. Fairman noted that a six-pound parcelwhich is average weight - for local area delivery will cost 37¢ instead of 32¢.
