## School Census Shows Decrease In Mills County

The School census count for Mills County as of January 31, 1964 shows a decrease of 34 scholastics from the count a year ago, according to official figures certified by County Judge and Ex-Officio County School Superintendent, Cecil Egger.

Total nose count for the four school districts this year is 833 while on January 31, 1963 it was 867 and on January 31, 1962 it was 837. The count went up 30 from 1962 to 1963.

Goldthwaite district lost four, Mullin lost eight and Priddy lost 25 from last year while Star district gained one.

"Man ever since he has devised a way of counting has used numbers in his daily life.

He has used numbers to count flocks of sheep, to build abodes or temples, and used them in many other ways. The pyramids, pride of Egypt, were found to be only one-half inch off when measured by archeologists and architects. The foundation for most buildings today is the subject of arithmetic and probably will be forever.

"Arithmetic is used in almost every occupation. Doctors, druggists, business men of all sorts use arithmetic as a basis for their business.

"Numbers are used to represent formulas and compounds in the life of scientists. It also serves as the basis for rockets, moon probes, and other planetary expeditions. Tractor salesmen use numbers to find discount on farm equipment of all kinds. Shoe salesmen use numbers to fit people with shoes, and numbers are also needed to buy our clothing and other body wear. Architects need arithmetic very badly to design homes and buildings of today.

"Arithmetic is now needed by every student to even apply for a college education. Furthermore, jobs are so difficult to get that without a college education and sometimes special schooling the student cannot find a job and therefore cannot raise a family and may even end up digging ditches.

"Now many subjects taught are based on arithmetic. One such subject is science. Elements, compounds, formulas and other scientific applications are represented by numbers.

Man uses numbers to date objects and numbers are used on our calendars, in books, and in many other places.

"One illustration to show how important numbers are is the case of a small child. Children have fun counting toes, blocks, books, toys and other articles that the child uses in fun and in play. This will help him as he grows up.

"Man also uses numbers in telling time. The face of a clock is circled with numbers. These numbers and hands on a clock tell man when he must start to arrive at social events, when to pick up the kids at school, and many other times of the day. It also informs man when to eat and when to sleep.

"Man also uses numbers in his money system. He must know how much money he has in order to sustain his daily needs. Such articles as a vehicle, clothes, a home and the children's needs are thought of when man uses money to purchase items.

"Therefore man must have essential knowledge of arithmetic because: (1) to get a job, (2) to learn time, (3) to know the calendar days, and (4) to know the basic money rules. Without these four basic rules man cannot succeed amply in life. He can be shortchanged at stores and can become one of the lower class of people. Also without these rules he will be 'looked down on' by people and never be a part of civic organizations, or social events. Therefore, arithmetic is one of the most important subjects."

The success of four Kingsville  
High School students who plac-

Karen, 7, and David, 5, are the children of Mr. and Mrs. W. V. Horton Jr., who have a long string of show honors to their credit, as exhibitors of fine stock while in 4-H club work and in open shows since.

The steer the youngsters exhibited to the San Antonio championship this year was a Mills County animal bred by Horton Hereford Farms, owned by their Hereford breeder grandfather, W. V. Horton Sr., and sons.

A full brother of "Champ" was grand champion steer at the Houston Stock Show in 1962 and a half-brother was the Champion Junior Show steer at the Fort Worth Fat Stock Show of 1964.

Mr. Schwartz stated that the design of these specially made boots will be most ornate and unusual so that posterity will have evidence of the accomplishment by the Horton youngsters for generations to come.

The Mills County Historical Survey Committee has received two additional monuments for the graves of Civil War Veterans buried in the county. A white marble upright monument has been placed at the grave of James Thomas "Uncle Jimmie" Guthrie, 1840-1914, in the Trigger Mountain Cemetery. The stone was ordered by his grandson, Arnold Reynolds. Mr. Guthrie fought with the 13th Texas Brigade. The other, a flat gray granite monument, has been placed at the grave of Mr. Rubin A. Harris, 1840-1903, in the Center City Cemetery. Mr. Harris fought with Company A of the 12th Texas Cavalry. The monument was ordered by his granddaughter, Mrs. Harve Willson.

Six monuments have been received by the Historical Society and two more have been ordered. Mrs. J. F. Barnes of Walnut Springs has ordered a monument for her grandfather, Joshua Jefferson Pollard, Co. C, 39th Regiment, Georgia Volunteer Infantry. He was captured by the Union troops at Vicksburg. Mrs. W. O. Holland has ordered one for her father, F.

B. Minor, who served with Captain Wayne Bishop's Command as a mail carrier. Mr. Minor is buried in the Look Out Cemetery and Mr. Pollard at Center City.

Additional information is needed to complete applications for Thomas G. Vines, Mullin Cemetery; A. J. Price and John M. Green, North Brown Cemetery; and F. M. (Mead) Whitten, Center City. The Cemetery Committee earnestly requests the cooperation of all citizens of the county or anyone interested in the county in locating and securing markers for the graves of Veterans of the Civil War buried in the county whose graves are not permanently marked.
