The regular meeting of the City Council was held Monday night in the city hall.

W. C. Barnett, City Manager, presented monthly operating statements of receipts and disbursements for the various departments.

He also reported on the swimming pool opening and gave a progress report on the water project.

The pipe line has been completed with the exception of final tests to be made.

The off-channel storage reservoir is about two-thirds full at this time. Records show that 42,000,000 gallons of water have been pumped from the river into the storage reservoir.

Work should be completed this week on the pumping station at the storage reservoir, and within the next week or so valves and fittings will be installed to complete this phase of the project.

Brick laying on the main story at the filter plant is continuing under way this week and part of the water pump is moving along on schedule.

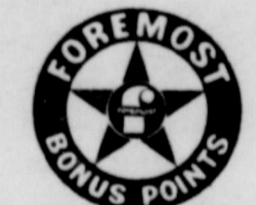

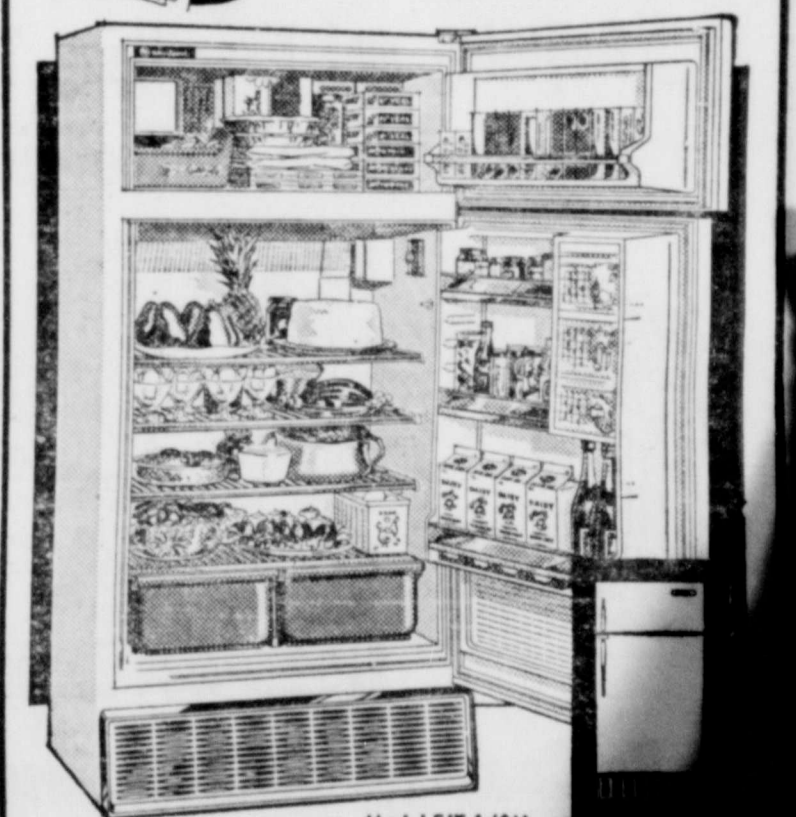

Mohair Carpet Makers From England See Their First Angora Goats Here

Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Tankard from Keighly, eleven miles from Bradford, England, who have been making mohair rugs for a number of years, saw their first Angora goats at the ranch of Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Nickols, west of Goldthwaite, last Wednesday afternoon.

Mr. Tankard wrote Mr. David Watters, president of The American Angora Goat Breeder's Association, several weeks ago that he and Mrs. Tankard would arrive by boat in New York about the 5th or 6th of May and that they would like to see some Angora goats.

This is the first trip of the Tankards to the U. S. A. They visited the World's Fair while in New York. Then they went to Washington, New Orleans,

Houston, Dallas, and then came to Goldthwaite. They visited friends in most of these places that they had met in their travels.

Mr. and Mrs. Tankard, owners of a rug and carpet manufacturing company, the J. L. Tankard Co., Ltd., of Bradford, England, began their business thirty-two years ago. Mrs. Tankard said that they started with one hand loom. Today they own nine large mills where they employ 850 workers. Mr. Tankard stated that they manufactured about ten thousand rugs a week.

Mr. and Mrs. Tankard have traveled extensively in Europe and have been to North Africa. They expect to make a trip to several countries in Europe and go all the way to Turkey during the later part of the summer. Most of us know that Turkey is the native home of the Angora goat. Mr. Tankard stated that the Turks will not show visitors their goats for fear that they will cast an evil eye on the goats.

Mr. Watters took Mr. Tankard to Hollis Blackwell's warehouse for a visit with Mr. Blackwell and Y. B. Johnson, while Mrs. James McClement entertained Mrs. Tankard in the Farm Bureau office. Mrs. Watters drove to town and joined them. The Watterses took Mr. and Mrs. Tankard to Yarborough and Duren Dry Goods because Mr. Tankard expressed a desire to purchase a "Texas Straw Hat" similar to the one Mr. Watters wore, although he said Englishmen seldom wore hats.

Then Mr. and Mrs. Watters drove the Tankards to the Nickols ranch after which they joined Mr. and Mrs. Vance Cornelius at McLean's Coffee Shop for dinner. They visited in the Cornelius home for sometime and then spent the night with Mr. and Mrs. Watters and children.

Mr. and Mrs. Tankard lived on a farm for a number of years and were interested in everything about our countryside. The Watterses showed them some of their sheep and goats the following morning before they left at 9:30 a. m.

The Tankards plan to visit the Carlsbad Caverns and go to California and then back to New York where they plan to sail for home on the Queen Elizabeth around the first of June. Mrs. Tankard said they expected to drive their little English car about eleven thousand miles in America.

Mr. and Mrs. Tankard liked Texas people better than New Yorkers. Mr. Tankard said the hospitality of Texas people was wonderful and that they would go home with a different opinion of America than they had before they came.

Mrs. Cornelius said they thoroughly enjoyed the Tankards and described them as such down-to-earth people. Mrs. McClement said that she really enjoyed them too. The Watters family found them to be wonderfully warm and friendly, unusually interesting conversationalists, and they liked them very much. They hope that if the Tankards ever come back to the U. S. A., they will honor them again with a visit.

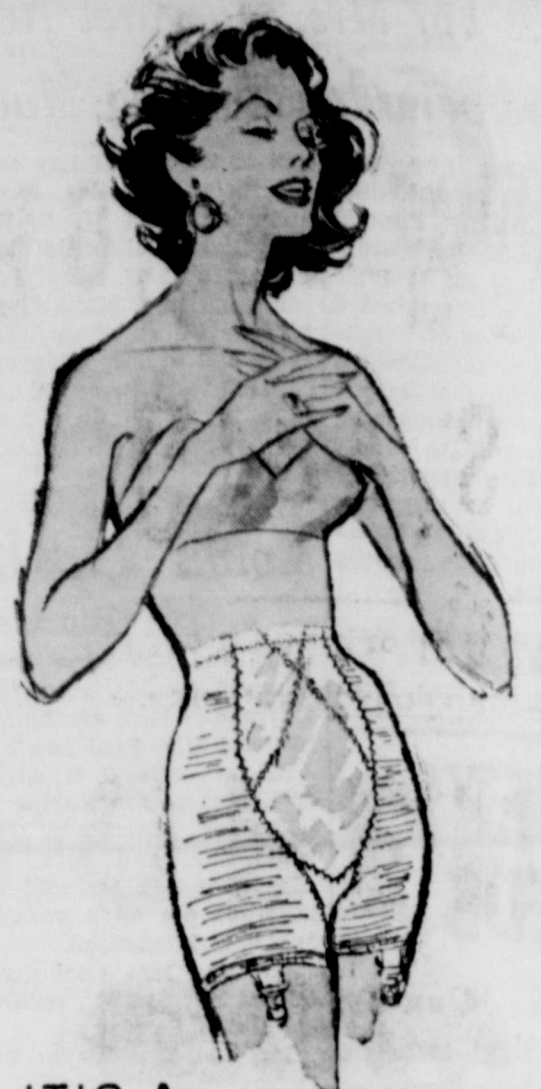
