





> Also, to provide young people that can be worn proudly; to help young people develop grace, good posture and habits of good grooming. All of these are taught in the Clothing Subject Matter Units which Adult Leaders teach to the 4-H girls.

To enter the County Revue the girl must be enrolled in one of the 4-H Club's Clothing Units and must have completed requirements of the planned program to participate in the county revue.
