**HEARING TEST  
Set For Goldthwaite**

Free, Electronic hearing test will be held in Goldthwaite. Anyone that has a hearing problem of any kind is welcome to come in for the test. Pictures of the ear showing how the ear works, and why a person loses his hearing, also the nerve system of the ear that is connected to the brain, to tell us what we have heard. Each person is tested with the latest electronic machine that can pinpoint in what part of the ear they are having trouble and what can be done to help them. Each person can see how a simple operation on the ear has let thousands of people hear again. 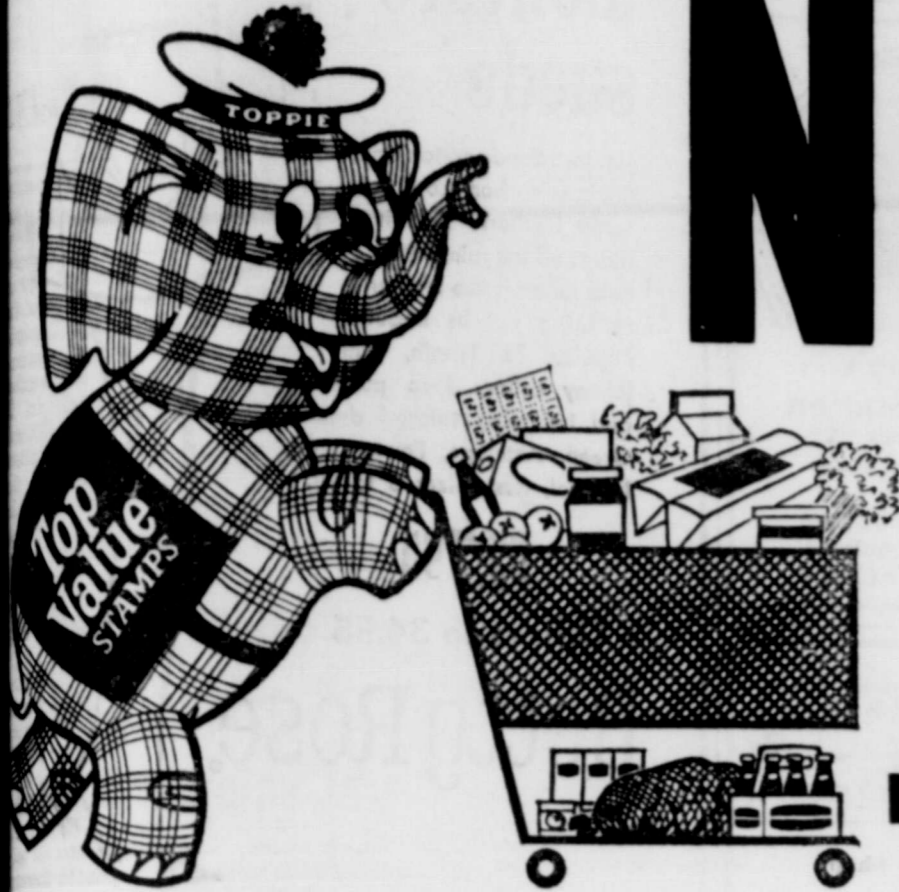

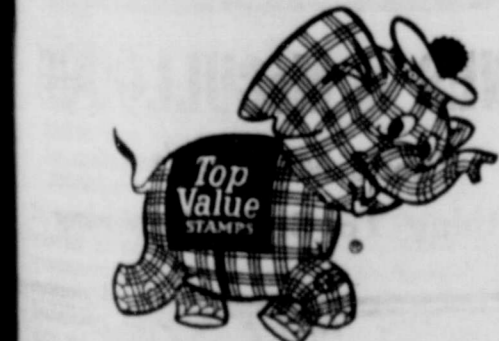

stars as Dan Blocker, Lorne Green, Anita Bryant, and President Johnson was there also. The Jamboree closed with another huge campfire where President Johnson spoke to them. At the end of his speech, there was a huge candle lighting ceremony.

The next morning they left for home following the same route they had traveled going up. This hot dry country looked pretty good to get back to. At the end of their trip when they arrived in Brownwood on July 23 they had traveled over 4,000 miles and through 15 states and the District of Columbia.
