Open House Sunday For New Water System

Public Is Invited To Inspect Treatment Plant And Reservoirs

Open house will be observed this Sunday from 2 to 5 p. m. for public inspection of the new water supply system for the city of Goldthwaite.

Included in the new system are river pump station, two off-channel storage reservoirs with pump station, water treatment plant and pipeline from the river to the reservoirs, treatment plant and the city to connect with distribution system.

CONSTRUCTION COST
The system was constructed at an approximate cost of \$425,000.00. Voters of the city and Mills County Fresh Water Supply District No. 1, approved the bond issues in special election held in August 1963.

COLORADO RIVER
The newly completed water supply system has now been put into operation.

The enumerators will be trained in a special 4-day home study course designed to prepare them for the farm census, their crew leader said.

More Rainfall For Goldthwaite

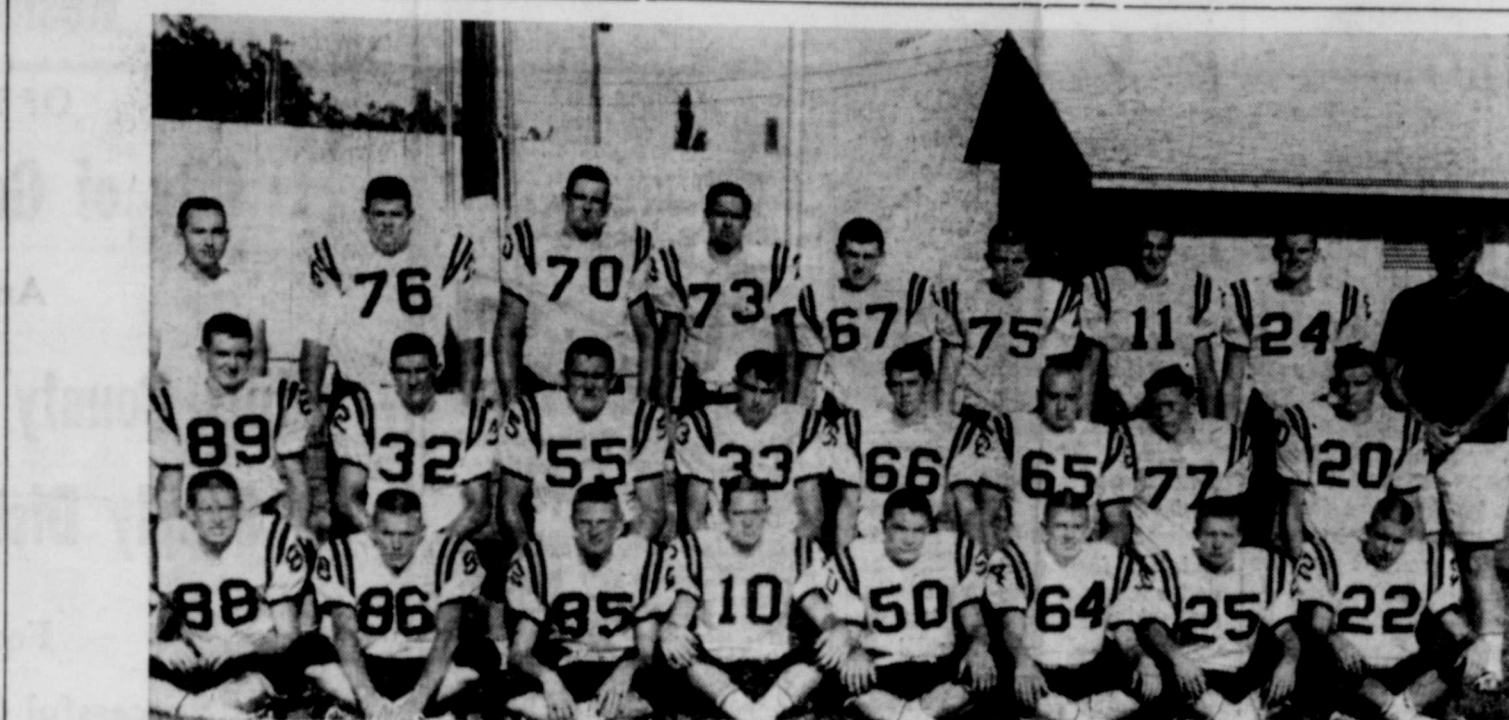
Goldthwaite received more rainfall the past week to boost the November total to 1.98 inches, according to official record kept by Harry Allen.

Eagles Rip Marble Falls 42-0; District Champs For Second Year

This game gave the Eagles an unblemished 4-0 district record with all of their district opponents being unable to score against them.

Goldthwaite's fine halfback, Jimmy Ball, a senior with tremendous running speed, had a fabulous night, gaining a total of 234 yards rushing, over half of the 437 total yards rushing.

Coach Jackie Williams' Eagles, in getting their second district championship win, turned in a beautiful all-over team effort—getting good running from Jim Childress and Charles Blackburn, good defensive line play and fine offensive blocking, and excellent kicking.

The Eagles came up with one touchdown in the first quarter, three in the second, one in the third, and wrapped it up with one more in the fourth quarter.

In about the middle of the first quarter Ball carried the ball in runs of 21, 21, 19, and 6 to get the Eagles in scoring position. Fullback Jim Childress finished off the last 15 yards and racked up 6 points for Goldthwaite. The extra points were

Goldthwaite will be designated as the home team and Baird is designated the visiting team. Goldthwaite chose the west side of the stadium and Baird will have the east side.

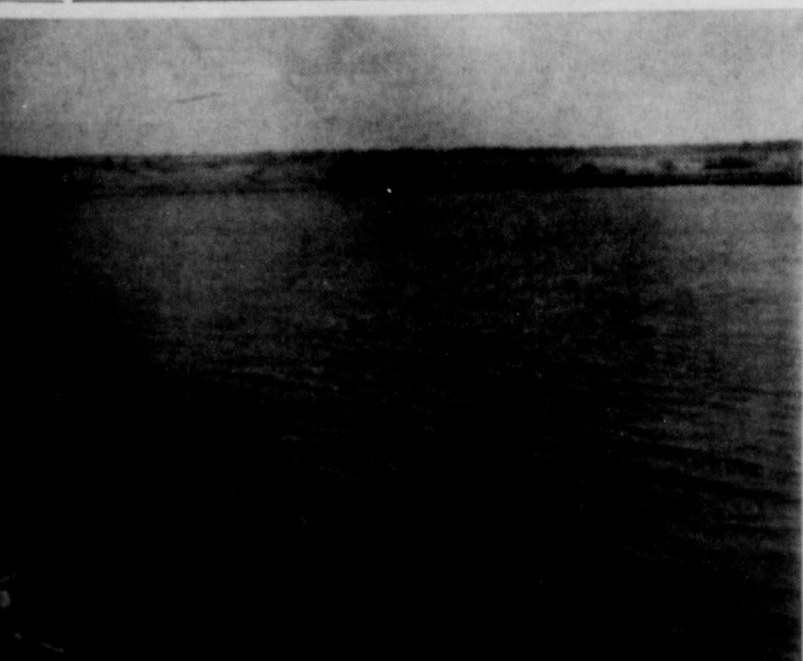
In case of a tie score winner of the game will be determined by, 1, penetrations, 2, first downs, 3, total yardage, in that order.

Details for the bi-district play-off were worked out and agreed to Saturday afternoon by school officials from Goldthwaite and Baird at a meeting in Brownwood.

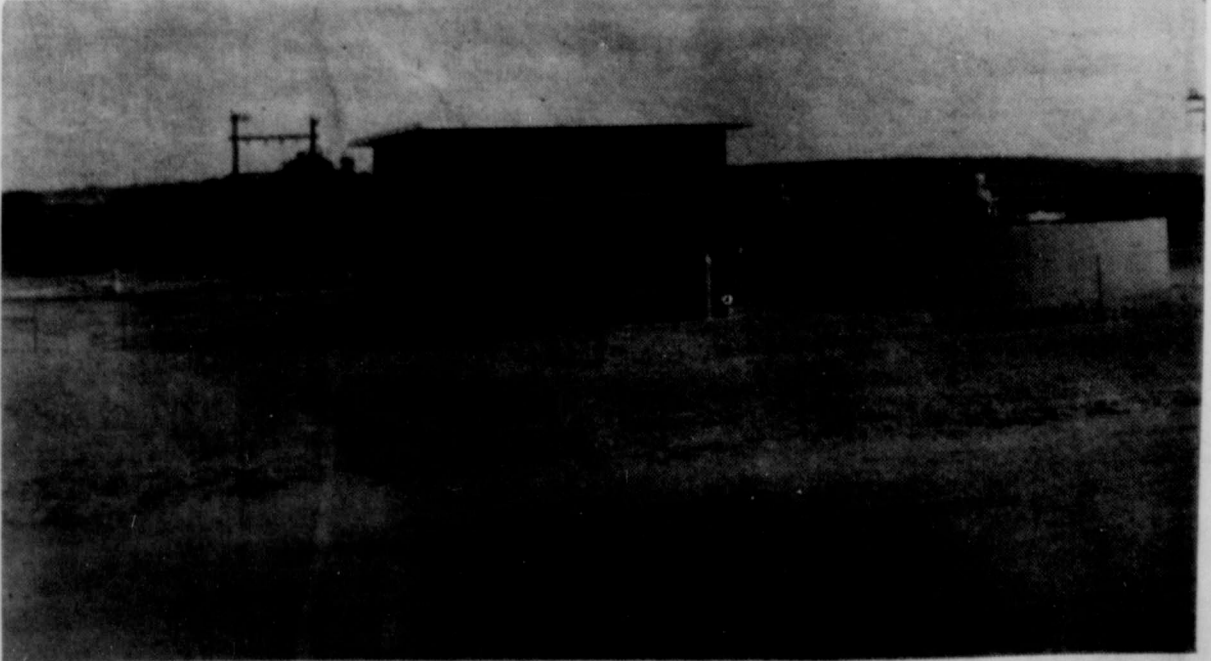
PEP RALLY

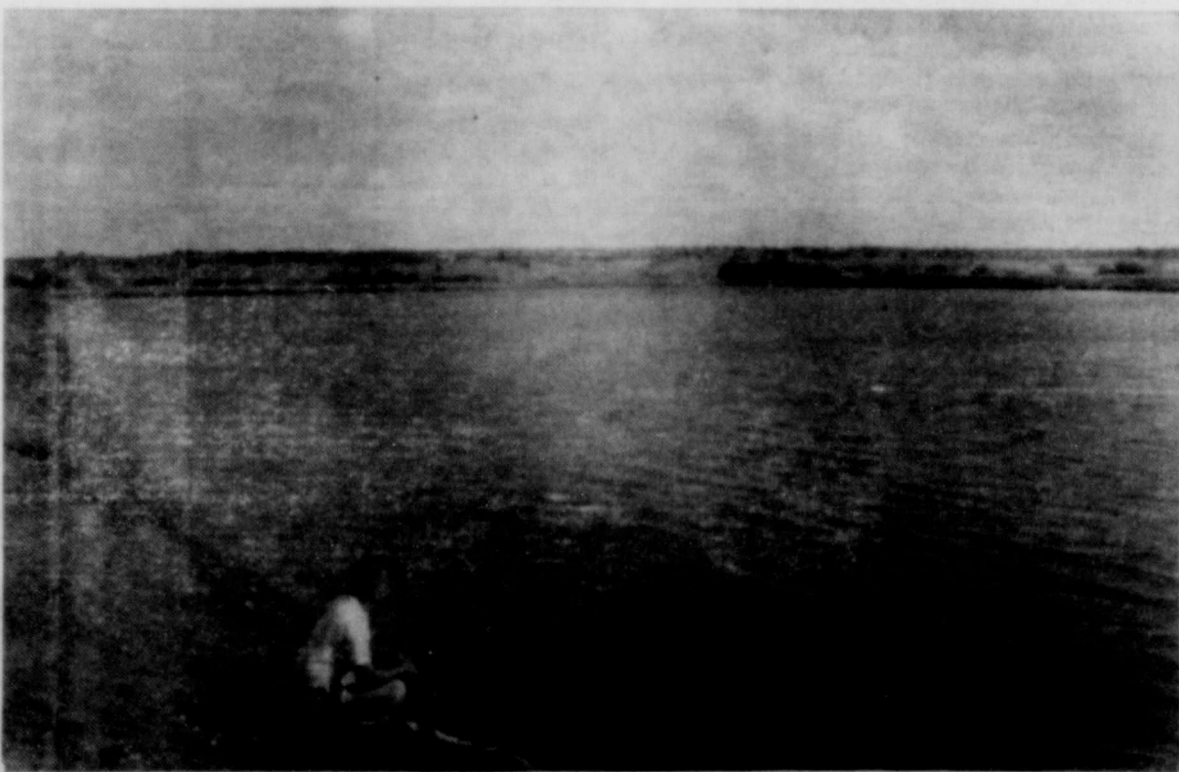

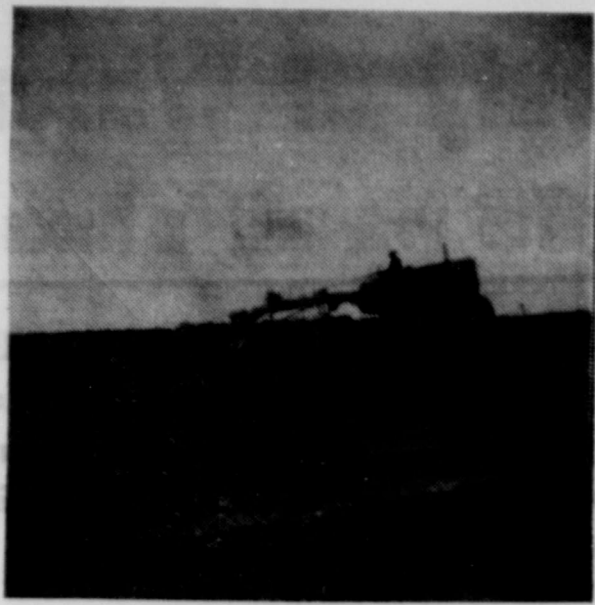

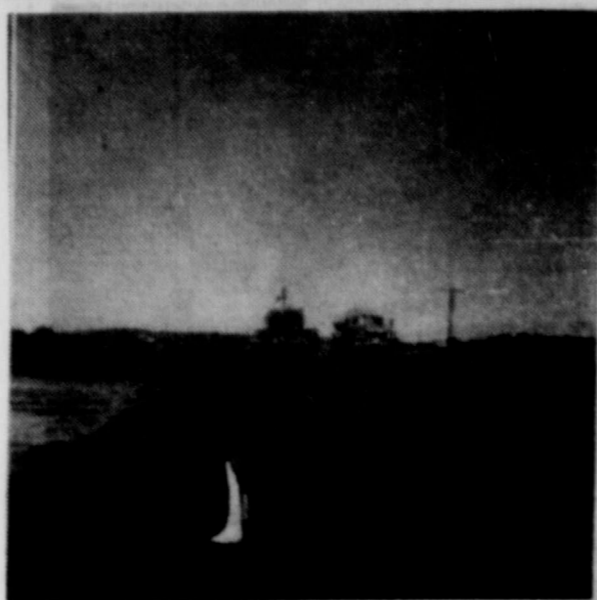

Dirt Moving Machinery Shown Here in Action as Construction got underway on Off-Channel Storage Reservoirs near Colorado River.



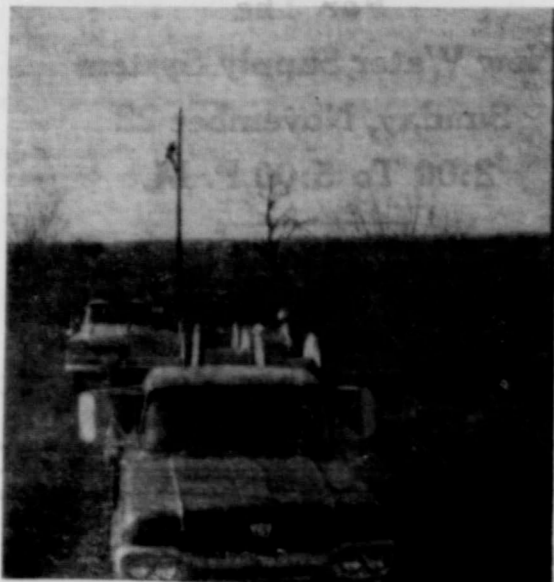

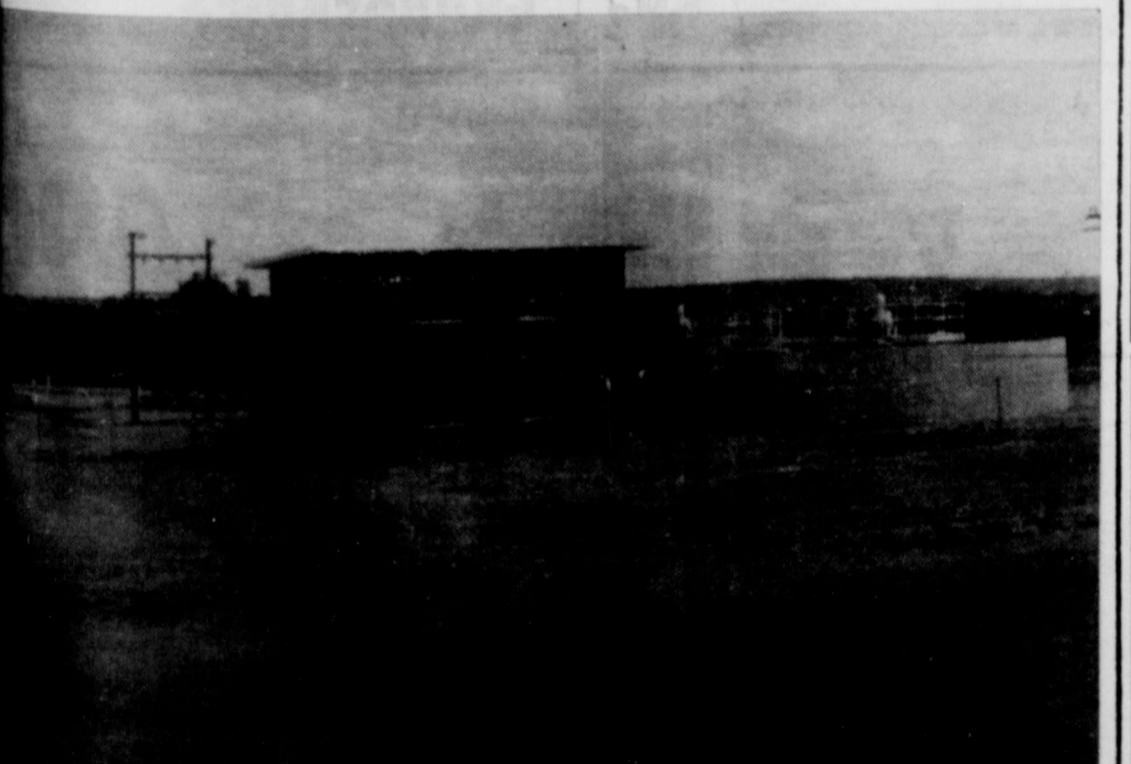

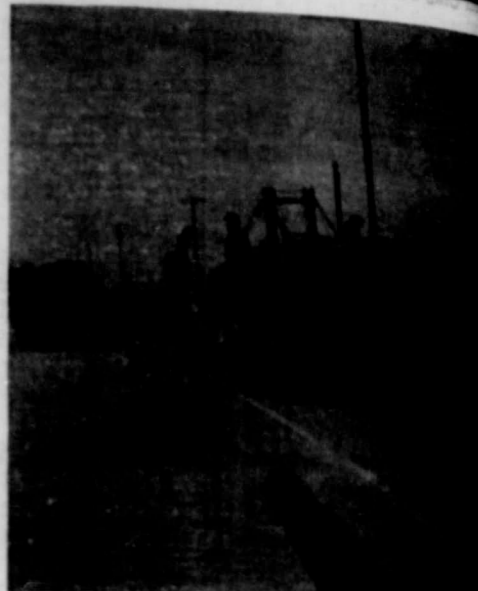

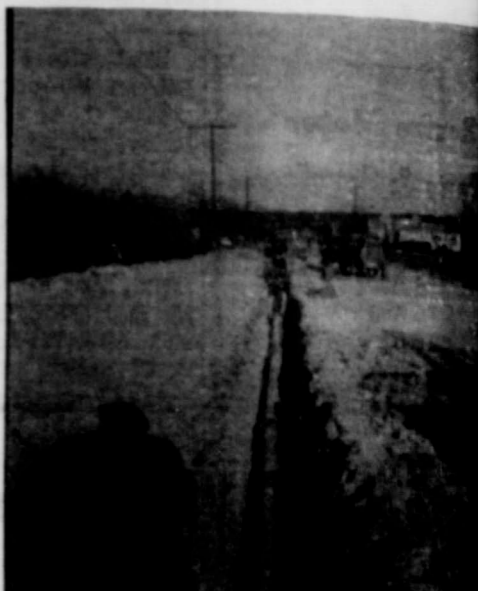

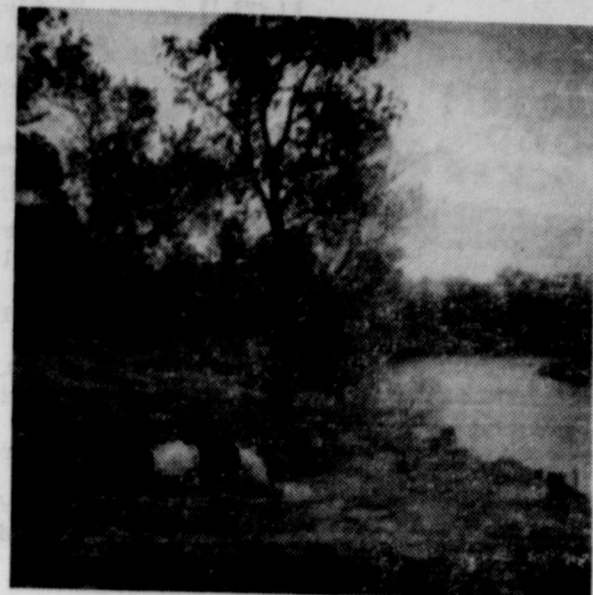

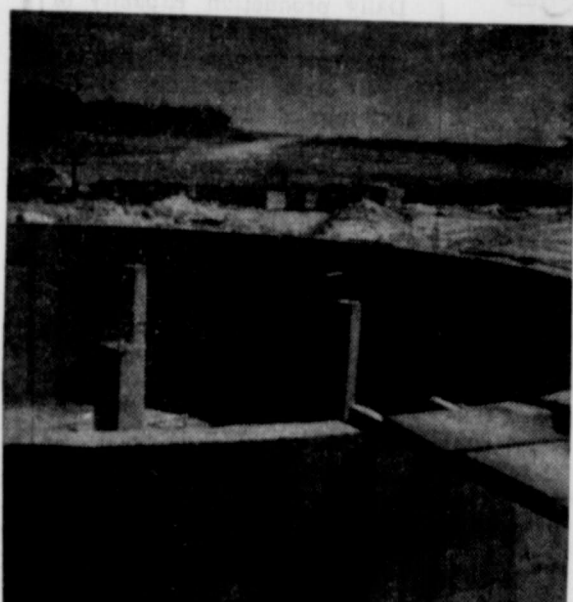

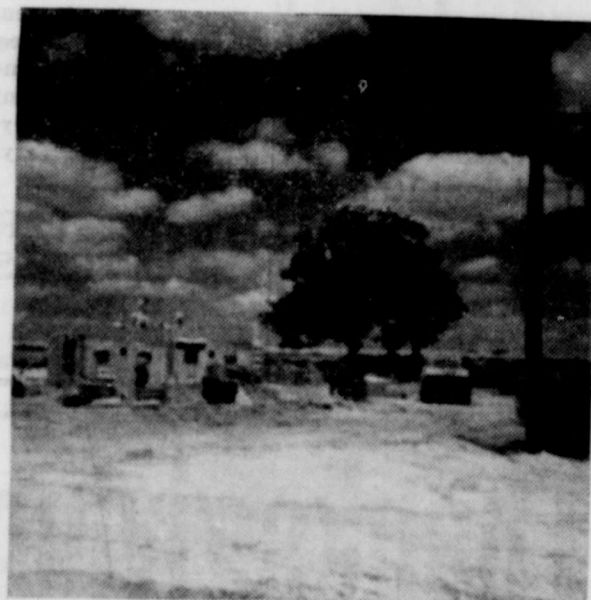

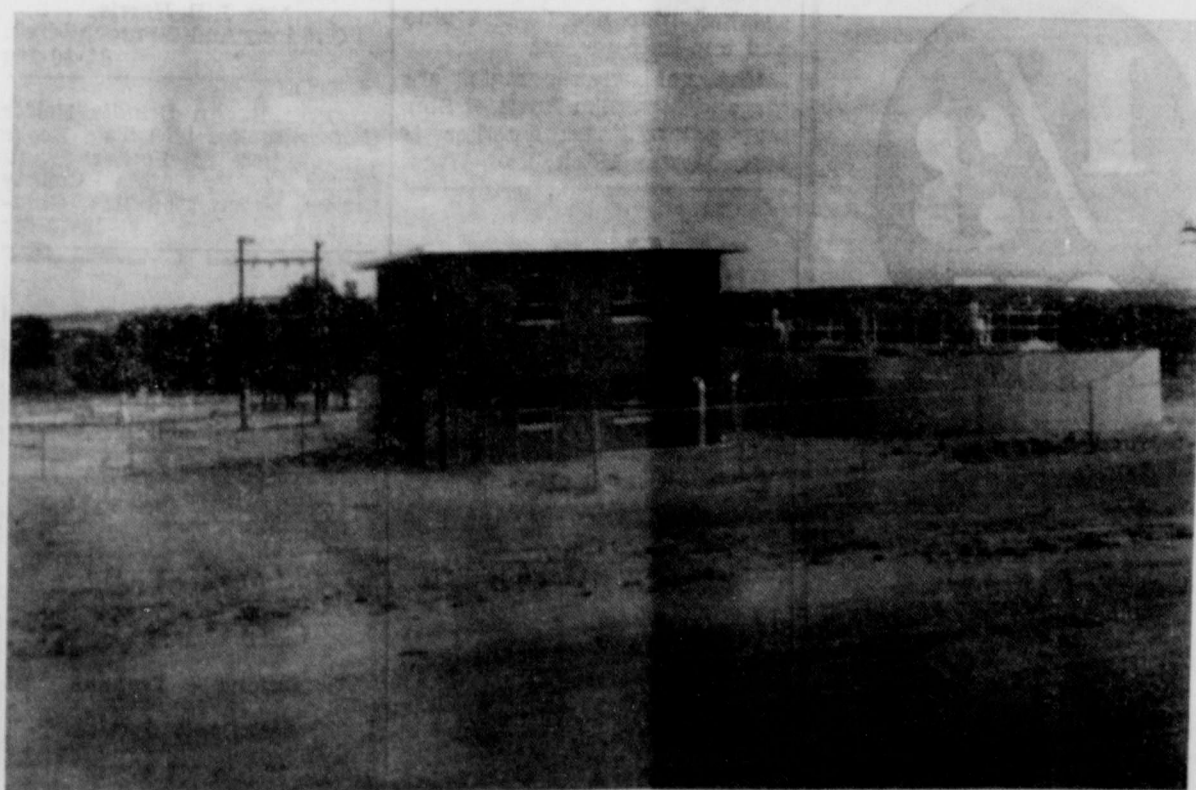

WATER—

TESTING
Testing of lines and operation of the system on a trial basis got underway in July. For the past three months the system has been given final and finishing touches as late equipment arrived in preparation for placing it into full operation and open house.

RIVER PUMP
The river pump station has a capacity of approximately two million gallons per day operating on a 24 hour basis. This is far beyond the expected consumption of the city and allows for selective pumping which will insure the city choice water supply when it is at its best in the river.

RESERVOIRS
From the river the water is pumped into the two off-channel storage reservoirs. The two reservoirs have a capacity of 120 acre feet of water—or approximately 40 million gallons. With allowances for seepage and evaporation this is a good six months supply for the city under present rate of consumption.

TREATMENT PLANT
Water is pumped from the storage reservoirs to the water treatment plant. This is done with two pumps, one with a capacity of one-half million gallons per day and the other with a capacity of 750,000 gallons per day.

Water arrives at the treatment plant where it goes through a rapid mixing chamber for chemicals. Then it goes by gravity flow through the filters into two settling basins. From the settling basins it goes by gravity flow into the clear well and then it is pumped into the distribution system of the city.

The water treatment plant is what is known as a Rapid Sand Gravity Filter System.

CAPACITY
Capacity of the settling basins is approximately 60,000 gallons each and the clear well capacity is approximately 150,000 gallons. This gives treatment plant a storage capacity of approximately 250,000 gallons. This is in addition to the city's storage tank on top of the mountain which holds 500,000 gallons.

Daily production capacity of the water treatment plant is approximately one-half million gallons on a normal day with a maximum of 750,000 gallons per day.
