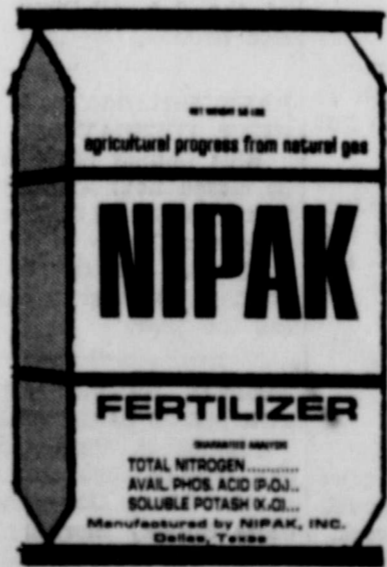

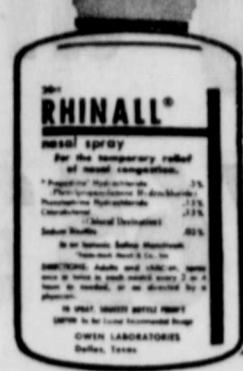

It abolishes the theory of private property. Its greatest deterrent is the teachings of the Bible, for Christianity and Communism can not co-exist. Therefore, the Church must be first undermined and then destroyed for Communism to flourish.

Its weapon is psychological warfare—no fighting, the skilled use of modern psychological propaganda, a science discovered by Russians to influence the minds of men by manipulating the leadership of nations into destroying their own resistance. Abraham Lincoln said, "If destruction be our lot, we must ourselves be its author and finisher."

Communism is a highly organized conspiracy, a system of hypocrisy promising one thing and doing another.

What can we do? We can become more conscious of our enemies by education, learning to think for ourselves, exercising our religious faith, by informing ourselves, being more united as patriotic citizens, by detecting Russian subversion words against Americans and American organizations that are fighting Communism.

There is only one field in which the Communists out distance the Americans and that is in psychological warfare. Its strategy, "Supreme excellence consists not in battles but in breaking the enemies' resistance without fighting," J. Edgar Hoover was the first to expose the prime weapon of Soviet conquest. He defined it as a "Red Attempt to influence American Opinion."

The women of Communism cook in common kitchens and work in factories, in mines, on the highways, build railroads, and as common farm laborers. Mmes. Norman Duren, John Patterson, T. J. Collier and RV Geeslin sang "God Bless America" as a prayer as the concluding number of the program.
