**25 YEARS AGO—**

Fire, thought to have started from sparks from a burning trash fire, destroyed a double garage in Goldthwaite, Wednesday afternoon at the home of Mrs. Florine Renfro on Reynolds Street. An expensive kitchen cabinet, several quilts, and some winter wearing apparel which had been stored by Mrs. Renfro in one of the garages, were destroyed.

County Judge R. J. Gerald, who is ex-officio County School Superintendent, this week received \$5,000 in transportation funds from the State Department of Education for Mills County Schools. He also received a per capita payment of \$2.00 which brings payments for the current year up to \$13.

In the annual city election Tuesday only 33 votes were cast in Goldthwaite. The following were elected:

Mayor, H. G. Bodkin; Aldermen, P. P. McCullough and R. L. Steen; Secretary and Attorney, F. P. Bowman; Treasurer, Grover Dalton.

**50 YEARS AGO—**

Work was commenced Thursday on the new Santa Fe railroad depot at this place and a large force of men are employed in preparing the foundation and making preparation for the building of the structure.

The government report of

cotton ginned in Mills County shows that there were 17,131 bales ginned of the 1914 crop, against 9,006 of the 1913 crop. The receipts at Goldthwaite up to the time the Eagle was put to press were 8,714 at the public yard and 4,527 at the Farmers Union yard and the same date last year the public yard had received 3,160 and the Farmers Union yard 3,998.
