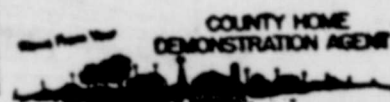
## Program For Landowners Is Presented Here

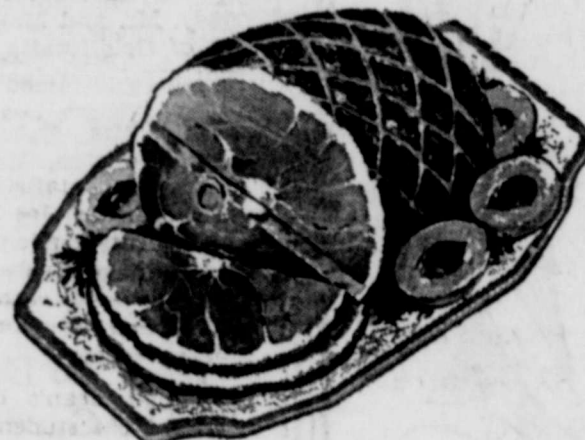

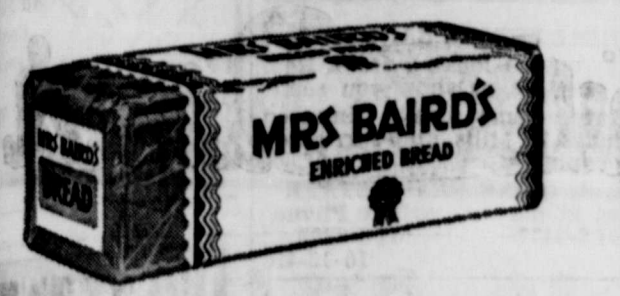

**Redistricting**  
All bills to reapportion congressional, state senatorial or legislative districts will go to standing subcommittee in both the House and the Senate.

Rep. Gus Mutscher of Brenham decided to try for objectivity. He picked chairmen from opposite sections of the State from every section subcommittees will be studying.

He named Rep. Gene Hendryx of Alpine to the Area I subcommittee handling redistricting of East Texas; Rep. Menton J. Murray of Harlingen to the Area II subcommittee on North Texas; Rep. Red Simpson of Amarillo to the Area III subcommittee on South Texas; and Rep. James Slider of Naples to the Area IV subcommittee on West Texas.

Senate subcommittee on State Senate redistricting measures is heavy with representation from the western part of the State and the lower Gulf Coast. At the insistence of the committee at large, Sen. Louis Crump of San Saba, chairman of the Senate Redistricting Committee, appointed himself chairman of the studying subcommittee.

Then he picked Sen. Dorsey Hardeman of San Angelo; Sen. Bruce Reagan of Corpus Christi; and Sen. William T. Moore of Bryan to serve with him.

Senator Crump also will head the congressional redistricting subcommittee composed of Sen. Ralph Hall of Rockwall; Sen. Abraham Kazen of Laredo; Sen. Martin Dies Jr. of Lufkin; and Sen. George Parkhouse of Dallas.

House committee approved submission of constitutional amendment to repeal the poll tax as a voting requirement in Texas elections.

Texas cities and counties would be authorized to pass strong anti-discrimination laws and to set up human relations councils to enforce a broad state civil rights policy by persuasion, order or civil court injunction in a bill introduced by Rep. Paul Haring of Gollad.

Salaried county officials in counties with populations between 15,000 and 20,000 and property valuations of at least \$80,000,000 may get raises up to \$2,600 a year under a bill by Rep. Dick Cory Victoria.

Texas is not getting its share of research funds for studies of problems of the Aging, a representative of a federal agency told the Governor's Committee on Aging.

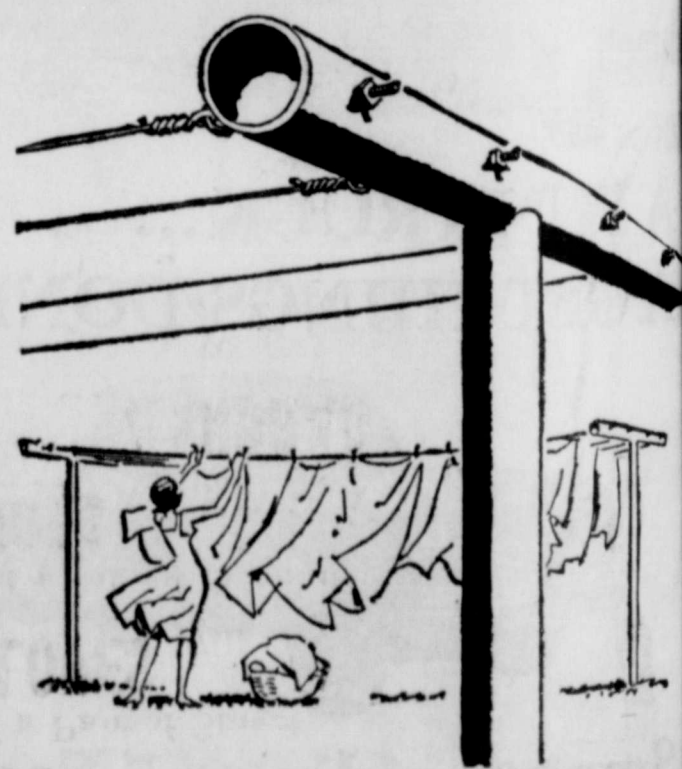
