**City Water Users Get Reduced Summer Rates Next Four Months**

City water users were granted a special gift by the city council meeting in regular session Monday night.

The council approved reduced summer water rates to be in effect for the next four months, May, June, July and August. Official notice of reduced rates appears in this paper.

Reduced summer rates are now in effect and will apply on the next meter reading on May 20 with June 1, billing and will continue through the August 20 meter reading with September 1, billing.

Under the summer rates minimum water users will receive a special package of an additional 500 gallons, from 2,500 gallons

to 3,000 gallons, for the minimum charge of \$2.00.

The rate charged per 1,000 gallons on water used over the minimum of 3,000 will be reduced from 65 cents to 50 cents per thousand during the four months period on an experimental basis.

This summer rate represents a reduction of approximately

20 per cent for all water users.

The city now has an ample supply of water and this move by the council in reducing the rates for the summer months is some encouragement to residents of the city in keeping up lawns, flowers, shrubs and trees.

For the past 20 years Goldthwaite residents have heard the cry each summer: "Use Less Water." Now the message is, "Use More Water and Beautify Your City."

**COUNCIL APPROVES LOW RENT HOUSING**

- 2: Resolution approving application for preliminary loan for low rent public housing, and

This action was taken by the council after the matter had been under study for some time. During the period of study members of the city council visited a number of cities to investigate low rent federal housing projects.

Representatives from Fitch and Holcomb, Architects and Engineers, Houston, met with the council to discuss details for a low rent housing project.

Work has been started on grading and base in preparing Live Oak Street for paving which is to be done this summer.

**Many Residents Are Not Aware Of  
Social Security Benefits Available**

"Many people in this area are not aware of all the benefits afforded them under social security throughout the United States," Jack Calvert, social security district manager in Temple, stated today.

"Some people think that social security only provides retirement benefits," he continued. "They don't know that social security also provides benefits for workers and their families in case of the workers' disability or death."

"In fact," Calvert said, "we say that social security provides three-way family protection against loss of income. Those three ways, again, are in case of retirement, disability, or death."

Social security benefits are not automatic; however, you must apply for them. There are more than 600 social security States where you can get assistance in making a claim for social security benefits.

In addition, there are many other locations where social security representatives meet with the public to take claims or furnish information. Information regarding the locations of the social security offices and other contact points may be obtained at your post office.

"People who have questions about social security should get in touch with us," Calvert said. "That's why we're here. Our staff is trained to answer your questions. In addition to claims assistance, your social security office issues social security numbers and informs wage earners, self-employed people and survivors of deceased workers of their rights and responsibilities under the social security law."
