Letbetter's Parachute Team Claims Precision Jumping World Records

Fort Bragg, N. C. (AHTNC)—Staff Sergeant Bobby W. Letbetter, 30, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Letbetter, of Goldthwaite, Texas, is a member of the U. S. Army Parachute Team that claims 60 new world records in precision parachute jumping.

Sergeant Letbetter helped the team make the projected records in a series of day and night jumps at Lincoln, California, in March and early April.

The records include 42 previously held by the Soviet Union, 9 by East Germany, 3 by the United States, and others by Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia and Canada.

Technical data recorded on barographs carried by each jumper has been validated and released to the Parachute Club of America.

Upon certification of the jumps by the Federation Aeronautique Internationale (FAI), the United States will hold 93 of the 128 possible records in parachute jumping.

The 128 records are in two categories—64 day jumps and 64 night jumps from altitudes of 600, 1000, 1500 and 2000 meters (1969, 3281, 4922 and 6562 feet). Individual and group jumps, delayed and without delay, are made at each altitude. All the new records are for

group jumps.

The target for the jumps is a small red disk approximately six inches in diameter located in a one-meter square formed by four white panels. Distances from the disk are measured in meters, and for group jumps of three to nine jumpers the record is determined by the average distance from the target.

The lowest average distance from the target in the new records was 19 meters (7 1/2 inches) by four jumpers in delayed jumps at 600 meters (1969 feet) altitude in day time.

The 12-member competition squad which set the records was commanded by 1st Lt. Jack C. Helms of Kannapolis, N. C.

Major James I. Anderson of Burlington, Wis., is the commanding officer of the Army Parachute Team, the Golden Knights, which was organized in 1959.

Current members of the team have jumped from 53 different U. S. and foreign-made aircraft, using 49 different parachutes of every known U. S. and foreign design.

They have demonstrated their precision jumping skill in 36 states, 7 foreign countries and 14 foreign cities.

Sergeant Letbetter, who entered the Army in December 1954, is regularly stationed at Fort Bragg, N. C., with the team.

He was graduated from Goldthwaite High School in 1953 and attended Texas Technological College in Lubbock. His wife, Marie, and two children, Sharon and Bobby, are with him at Fort Bragg.

OFFICERS ELECTED

Officers were elected when the local group held their annual meeting last week to make plans for the season.

Charles Conrad was re-elected president, Ed Thornton was named vice president, and L. J. Ward was re-elected secretary-

treasurer.

The six Goldthwaite teams are as follows: 9 and 10 year group—team one, Cubs; team two White Caps, 11 and 12 year group—team one, Tigers, team two, White Sox, 13 and 14 year group—Pony League; and the 15 through 18 year group—Goldthwaite Seniors.

Conrad announced that 99 boys have signed up and more are expected. Officials expect to have 125 Mills County boys taking part in the program this season.

Officials have issued an appeal for voluntary adult leadership and help to carry out the program. Not only financial help is needed but just plain work like mowing and cleaning the field, they stated, in pointing out that two or three can't carry the work load.

All games will be played at night with double headers scheduled nearly every night of play. Some games are scheduled for 6:30 p. m.
