

Mullin School District

There is to be a tax election on Saturday, September 4, to decide if the trustees of the Mullin School District shall have the power to levy a local maintenance tax of up to \$1.50 per \$100 valuation in the Mullin School District to maintain the Public Schools. This tax may never exceed the figure of \$1.50.

The district owes \$81,900.00 in bonds.

The payment on the principal plus interest will never exceed \$6,442.50 and that will be in the year 1970. A debt service tax of 0.35 on the present valuation will provide sufficient funds for the payment of the bonds and interest.

This will be a total tax of \$1.85 per \$100 valuation and this would be the maximum unless you as voters - vote on and pass another bond issue or unless the valuation of the Mullin School district should decrease.




