Eagles To Tackle Armadillos Friday At San Saba In 1965 Season Opener

The Goldthwaite Eagles will open their 1965 grid season Friday night when they will tackle the double A San Saba Armadillos on the 'Dillos' field.

504 Students Enrolled Here On First Day

Goldthwaite Schools enrolled 504 students on the first day of school, Supt. LeRoy Beard announced Monday evening.

Of this number 259 enrolled in elementary school and 245 in junior and senior high.

The number of students enrolled the first day is more than enrolled the first week of school the past two years. Last year 492 were enrolled the first week and in 1963 there were 479.

Supt. Beard stated that several more are expected to enroll before the end of the first week.

Game time is 8 p. m.

Both of the first two games this season will be played away. The first in San Saba and the second week they will travel to De Leon.

The first home game will be on September 17 when the Eagles will play host to the Johnson City Eagles.

Last year the Eagles lost to the San Saba 'Dillos' 14 to 0 before going on to district and bi-district.

Coach Jackie Williams said Tuesday that the Eagles are looking good and hopes are high for Friday night.

The sports department of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram has picked Goldthwaite for first place in the state for class A.

Coach Williams has 18 lettermen back from last year, with seven of them possible offensive starters and nine on the defensive side. Eight of them were all-district last year.

Those desiring to purchase season reserved tickets may select theirs while they last at the PCA office.

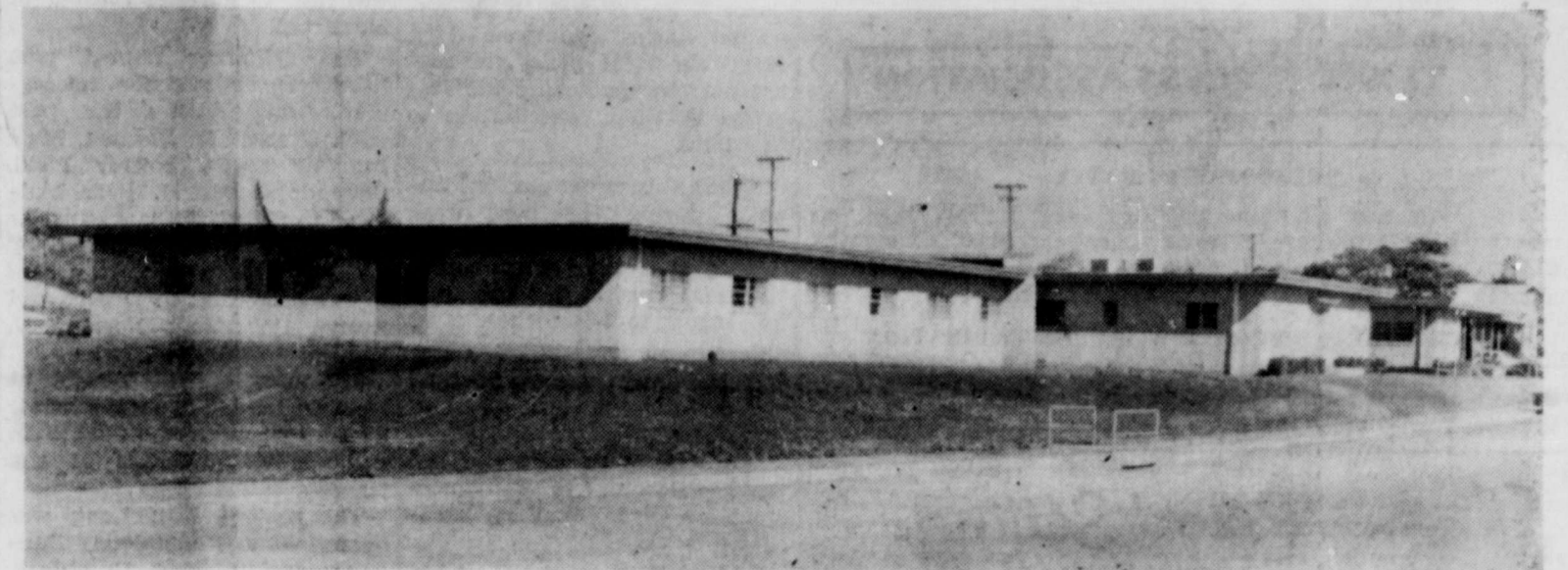
PARADE AND PEP RALLY SCHEDULED FOR TODAY

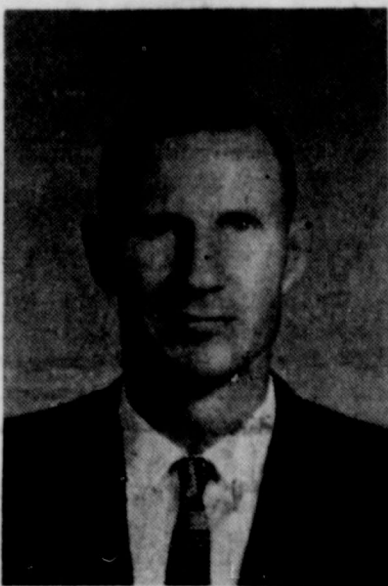

Public Is Invited To Visit Hospital At Open House This Sunday Afternoon

Invitation has been extended to the public to visit Childress & Cruzcosa Clinic & Hospital this Sunday afternoon, September 5, during open house.

Dr. M. A. Childress and Dr. C. S. Cruzcosa and members of their staff will be hosts in showing the new addition that has been added to the hospital. The project which cost approximately \$125,000.00 is now open and in full operation.

Announcement was made in July 1964 by hospital officials that plans were being made for construction of the addition covering an area 73 feet by 66 feet in size to provide 10 additional beds.

Capacity of the hospital at that time was 22 patients, with 25 or 26 in case of emergency.

With this new addition the capacity of the hospital is now 32 patients, and 35 or 36 in case of emergency.

The new wing consists of 6 private rooms and two double rooms. All have private baths.

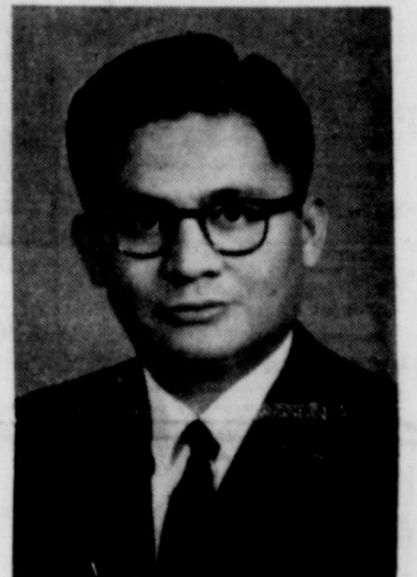
In addition to the eight rooms for patients there is also a new operating room and new obstetrical room.

There is also a large basement to house heating and cooling units and provide storage area. The project also covered a number of changes and improvements in other departments.

The hospital was opened by Dr. M. A. Childress when he constructed the new clinic and hospital building in 1959. The first unit provided six beds along with consultation rooms and clinical and hospital facilities. It was then Childress Clinic and Hospital.

In 1960 a new wing was added providing for 16 more patients and other improvements. This brought the total capacity to 22 patients.

Dr. C. S. Cruzcosa joined the hospital as its surgeon in 1960. On January 1, 1963, Dr. Cruzcosa and Dr. Childress formed a partnership and the name was changed to Childress & Cruzcosa Clinic & Hospital.

Amendment Election Next Tuesday To Increase State Senate 31 To 39

Valley voters, along with all Texas, will go to the polls next Tuesday, September 6, to cast their ballot on a constitutional amendment to increase the membership of the State Senate from 31 to 39 members.

The special constitutional amendment election is the first scheduled this year. The amendment will be in November and 10 proposed amendments will be voted on.

The polls will be open from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m. next Tuesday. Mills County citizens will vote in fewer precincts since five were eliminated and annexed with others.

Changes effected with the annexes are as follows: Compey Mt. box 20 annexed to Mullin box 8. Olive box 18 annexed to Mullin box 7. Rock Springs box 12 annexed to Big Valley box 11. The Big

Valley box was also moved from the old school building in the lower valley to the basement of the Baptist Church building in the upper valley.

Ratler box 13 and Regency box 14 annexed to Ridge box 16.

The proposed amendment to increase the number of state senators appears to be favored in the rural areas of the state which are seeking to retain their representation in state government during a time when re-districting is on order.

Voters will cast their ballot either "For" or "Against".

The Constitutional Amendment increasing the membership of the State Senate from 31 to 39 members, retaining the present membership of the House of Representatives, requiring apportionment of the Senate according to population, and deleting the limitation that no single county is entitled to more than one Senator.

Miss Jernigan was present for the show and sale and took part in awarding the prizes and trophies to show winners of the 1965 Central Texas event.

Reserve champion billy was shown by Charles Cornelius, Goldthwaite, 3rd place by W. V. Horton, Jr., Star, 4th F. W. Perkins, Brownwood, and 5th by V. Z. Cornelius, Goldthwaite.

First place doe was shown by V. Z. Cornelius, and the buyer was Dr. T. C. Graves, Goldthwaite, who paid \$340.00 for the winner.

Reserve champion doe also was shown by V. Z. Cornelius, 3rd place by Charles Cornelius, 4th by W. L. Alexander, Goldthwaite, and 5th place by Johnny Martin, Lampasas.

The top three billys by one breeder were shown by F. W. Perkins and the best three does by one breeder by V. Z. Cornelius.

Total sale amounted to \$9,107.00, Raymond Casbeer, secretary-treasurer, announced Monday. A total of 97 bucks and 30 does were sold.

The top ten bucks averaged \$213.50 while the top 25 bucks averaged \$133.00. Price paid for the top 10 does averaged \$95. The sale average for bucks and does for the entire 127 head sold was \$71.71.

Mullin School District To Vote Saturday On Maintenance Tax Raise

Taxpayers in Mullin Independent School District will vote in a special maintenance tax election this Saturday, September 4.

The special election will be held at the school and polls will be open from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m.

Proposition to be voted on is whether to increase the maintenance tax to a maximum of \$1.50 per \$100.00 valuation of taxable property.

The district has a present tax rate limit of \$1.50 per \$100.00 valuation for local maintenance and bonded indebtedness combined.

the school board of trustees may assess ad valorem tax of not to exceed \$1.50 for local maintenance. Bonded indebtedness would be in addition to the local maintenance tax.

In announcing the special election members of the board stated that they feel the move is necessary if there is a school to be maintained in Mullin.

The bonded indebtedness of the Mullin District requires 35¢ per \$100.00 valuation which would make the total tax \$1.85 per \$100 valuation if the maximum of \$1.50 for local maintenance is assessed, according to school officials.

There is to be a tax election on Saturday, September 4, to decide if the trustees of the Mullin School District shall have the power to levy a local maintenance tax of up to \$1.50 per \$100 valuation in the Mullin School District to maintain the Public Schools. This tax may never exceed the figure of \$1.50.

The district owes \$81,900.00 in bonds.

The payment on the principal plus interest will never exceed \$6,442.50 and that will be in the year 1970. A debt service tax of 0.35 on the present valuation will provide sufficient funds for the payment of the bonds and interest.

This will be a total tax of \$1.85 per \$100 valuation and this would be the maximum unless you as voters — vote on and pass another bond issue or unless the valuation of the Mullin School district should decrease.

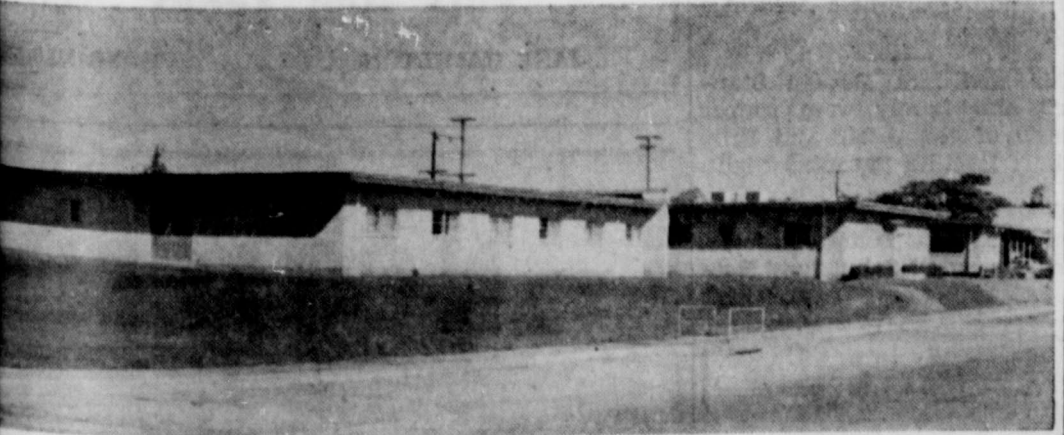

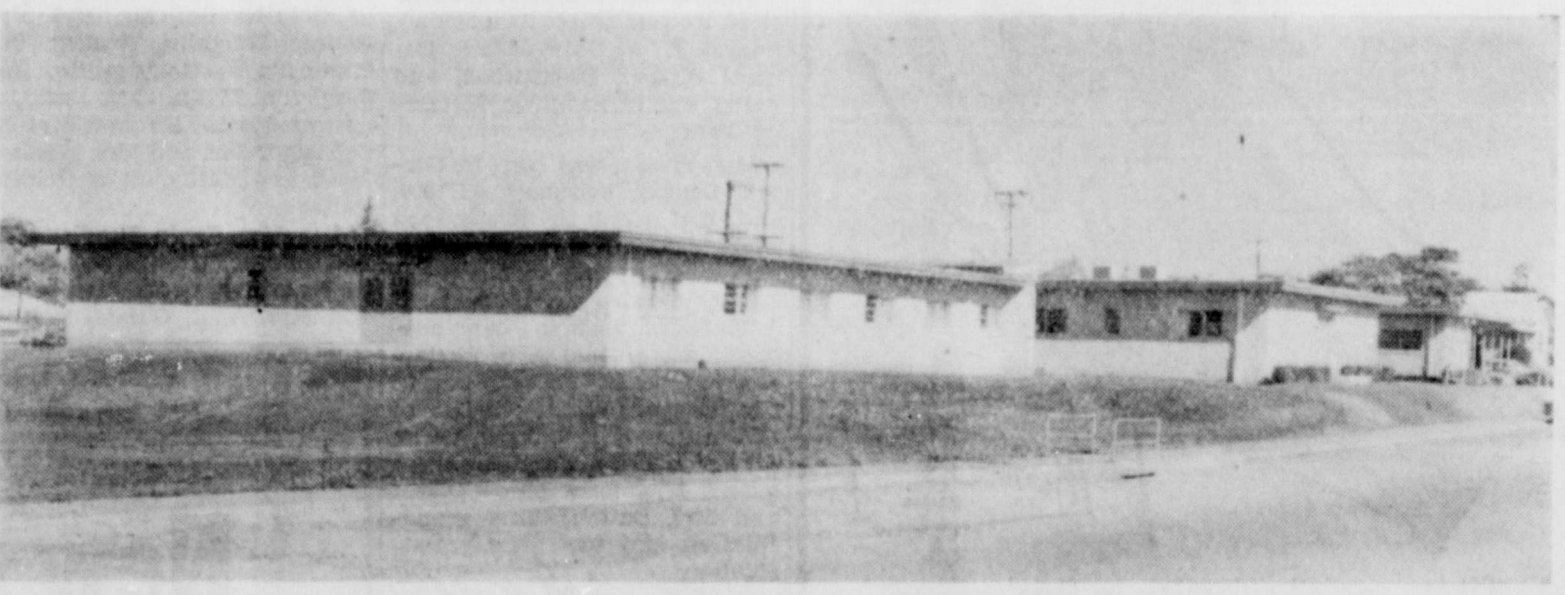
