## **Mullin Voters** Approve School

Mullin School District voters approved a tax increase for school maintenance by a vote of 132 to 104, according to un-official returns of the special election held Saturday.

The special maintenance tax election was the second one held in two weeks. In the first election on Saturday, September 4, the issue was defeated 96 to 94.

The proposition approved by year 20-14. voters will give the board of trustees the authority to assess ad valorem tax of not to exceed \$1.50 per \$100 valuation for local maintenance. Bonded indebtedness will be in addition to the local maintenance tax.

The district owes \$81,900 in bonds which requires 35¢ per \$100 of present assessed valuation for paying off the debt.

If the maximum of \$1.50 per \$100 valuation is assessed by the trustees for local maintenance the total tax assessment will be \$1.85 per \$100 valuation.




