1965 San Saba County Pecan Show Will Be Held Friday And Saturday

Plans are practically completed for the 11th Annual San Saba County Pecan Show to be held on December 3 and 4, in the Ranchman's Tower in San Saba," announced Ace Howell, President of the San Saba County Pecan Growers' Association, which co-sponsors the show with the Extension Program Building Committee.

Indications are for the largest pecan show ever held in San Saba County due to the record crop being harvested at this time. Last year's show drew 222 entries, the largest show ever held, and this year's show should be larger.

Judging the pecans will be J. Benton Storey, Secretary-Treasurer of the Texas Pecan Growers' Association, College Station; Johnny Harris, President of the Texas Pecan Growers' Association, Hamilton; Robert Kenning, District 7 Farm Management Specialist from San Angelo; and Hollis Bowen.

All pecans will be on display on Friday and Saturday and the public is invited to the show. Counties eligible to participate in the show include Brown, Mills, Lampasas, Burnet, Llano, Mason, McCulloch and San Saba. Entries from these counties are eligible to compete for ribbons and trophies. An entry shall consist of 1½ pounds of

each variety to be entered. Entries must be entered by 12:00 p. m., Thursday, December 2.

Four large trophies have been donated by the National Pecan Shellers' and Processors' Association, and the Texas Pecan Growers' Association to be presented to the Grand Champion pecan of the show, and to the Champion Shelling, Inshell, and Native. Rosette will be awarded to the reserve champion in each division, and ribbons to the first three places in each variety.

Miss Connie Bagley was selected Pecan Queen and will reign at the Pecan Show. Her princesses will be Misses Marsha Harkey and Jane Sterner.

Another phase of the Pecan Show will be five classes of food exhibits, junior and adult, made with pecans, namely cookies, pies, cakes, candies, and breads.

Card Table Exhibits featuring the use of pecans, will make up the third phase of the annual show.

Entries will be accepted from adjoining counties in all phases of the show, and ribbons awarded to the first three places in each division.
