Plans Are Outlined And Mills County Mohair Promotion Committee Named


Promotion Council, called here on Monday night, December 13, by temporary chairman, George Weddell, was attended by approximately thirty commercial producers in Mills County. The meeting was successful and evervone agreed that they must form a broad organization to follow through on research and the promotion of mohair. It was also agreed that without an organization of this type, the mohair industry would have little chance in competing with other fibers now in use, especially in America

At the meeting held in Junction, Texas on November 11, the rules governing the Mohair Promotion Council were approved. and it was agreed that five cents per head would be the desired assessment for each pro-

ducer. Every time a county raises \$500, one member of the county will be selected to serve on the Mohair Promotion Council. At this writing, Mills County has raised nearly \$500. Most of the producers present and contacted think that this county should at least raise \$1,500, which will give the counnty three members on the Council. Mills County has some 85,000 goats, and Texas has about 4,-800,000 goats.
