## Civil Service Exam Announced For Post Master In Goldthwaite

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced plans for examination for Postmaster at Goldthwaite. The job pays \$6,888.00 a year.

Applications to take the examination will be accepted until Tuesday, January 25, the announcement stated.

Competitors for the postmaster vacancy in this city must have at least three years of experience (education above high school level may be substituted for 1½ years of experience) showing that they have the ability to conduct and manage the community's postal business efficiently and to supervise employees so that customers are satisfied with the service.

Competitors must also show that they are of good reputation and that they can deal with the public agreeably and effectively.

Applicants must take a written test, to be given in Brownwood, Texas. Those who pass will be assigned final ratings on the basis of this test and on their experience and fitness for the position. They must have

resided within the delivery of the office for one year immediately preceding the closing date of the examination. In addition, they must have reached their 18th birthday on the closing date for acceptance of applications. Persons over 70 years of age cannot be appointed.

All qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, creed, color, or national origin.

Complete information about the examination requirements and instructions for filing applications may be obtained at the post office in Goldthwaite. Application forms must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. 20415, and must be received or postmarked not later than the closing date.

## Bank Deposits In Goldthwaite Still Going Up

If the trend of bank deposits is any reflection on the economic picture in Goldthwaite and Mills County then the local business community is getting healthier all the time.

Deposits in Mills County State Bank show another increase over the past year, according to statement of condition appearing in this issue of the paper. Condensed statement for December 31, 1965 shows deposits of \$6,631,982.39 while at the year end of 1964 deposits were \$6,339,097.25.

Loans and discounts also show a nice increase over a year ago with \$3,810,904.75 this year compared with \$3,409,993.25 at the end of 1964.

Total resources of Mills County State Bank in December 1964 were listed at \$6,974,099.25 as compared with \$7,313,742.13 on December 31, 1965.

## Farmer's Tax Guide Booklet Is Now Available

The 1966 edition of the "Farmer's Tax Guide" contains tax information for farmers and is now available. Ellis Campbell, Jr., District Director of Internal Revenue for northern Texas, announced today.

This booklet can be obtained free of charge from county agricultural agents or at the nearest Internal Revenue Service office.

It is written in non-technical language and contains numerous examples showing how the tax rules apply in actual situations. A completed sample of a return form is included.

The "Important Dates to Remember" section tells Texas farmers when to pay income and social security taxes, file returns, and meet other Federal tax requirements. A section on record-keeping tells farmers what records they need to keep and describes an easy method of keeping track of income and expenses.

The "Farmer's Tax Guide" was written primarily to help farmers prepare their 1965 tax returns. It is useful as a tax reference guide throughout the year.

Four performance classes including reining, barrel racing, rescue race and pole bending. The horse show will also have an outside halter class for those who may want to show.

Ribbons will be awarded each place except in the horse classes where there will be only six ribbons per class, show officials stated.

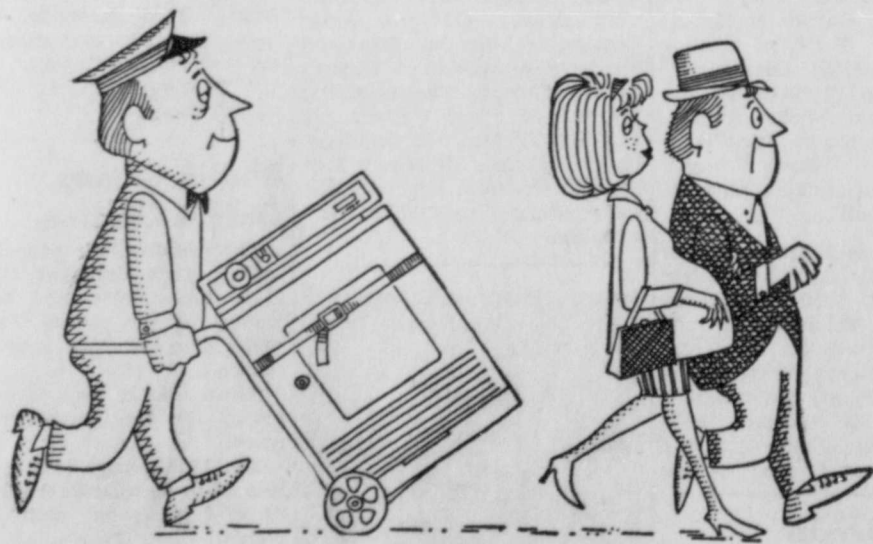

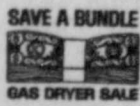

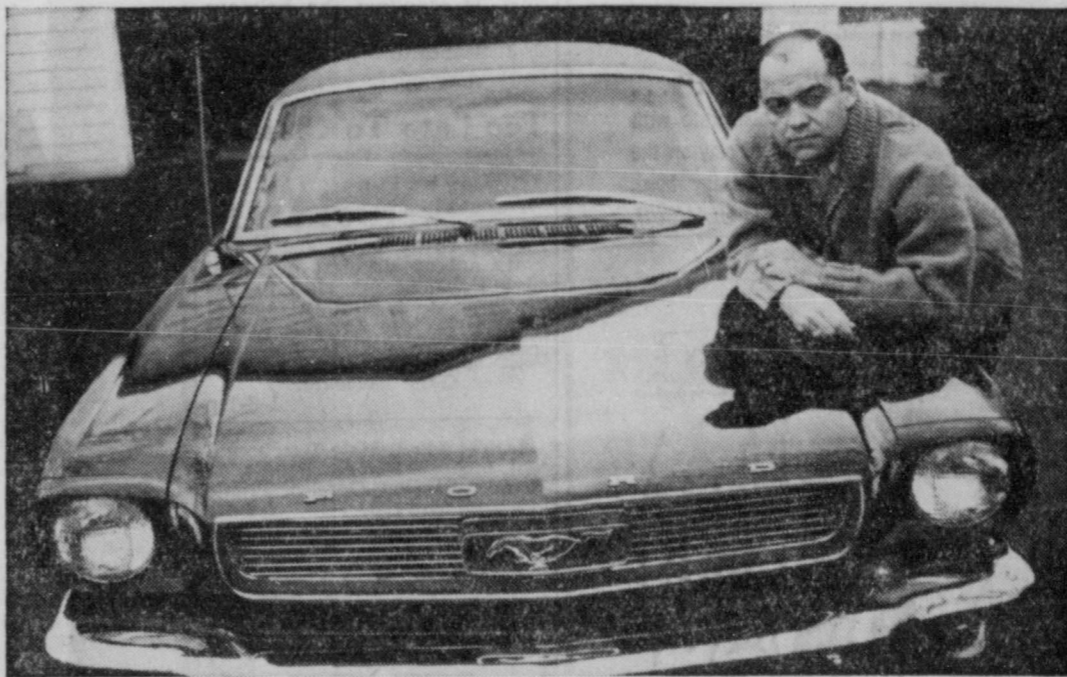

## Mail Appeal Starts March Of Dimes

The March of Dimes asked everybody in Mills County an important question today.

"If enough of them send back the right answer," said Chapter Chairman Director, Miss Greta Sue Hines, "there will be more help and hope for the babies born next year with birth defects."

The question, contained in the March of Dimes mail appeal that went to area homes, is asked by hundreds of thousands of American mothers each year:

"Why did it happen to my baby?"

"Unfortunately," declared Miss Hines, "the scientists are unable to give a specific answer except in a few cases. They know how to detect and control certain body chemistry defects which cause severe mental retardation. They also know that many expectant mothers who contract German measles — as in the massive 1963-64 epidemic

—will give birth to defective babies. Most of these children can benefit from medical treatment.

"But until science learns more about the hundreds of birth defects which occur in some 250,000 American babies each year, the best help we can give these mothers is a gift to the March of Dimes," the campaign leader said.

She noted that the March of Dimes is the largest single national source of private support for research and care in birth defects. Included in this program are more than 50 March of Dimes-financed treatment centers where teams of medical experts are developing better methods of treating birth defects victims.

"Your response to the March of Dimes mail appeal," added Miss Hines, "can bring closer the day when far fewer mothers will have to ask that tragic question, 'Why?'"
