The 1965 rainfall was more than in 1964 when 31.62 inches was neasured here. Rainfall during the year 1965 by months follows: January 2.82 February 3.70



GOATS-Billy Kids and Doe Kids.

FAT BARROWS - Light and Heavy Weight. There will also be a Gilt class.

HORSES-There will be seven classes in the horse show: Three halter classes including colts foaled in 1965; colts foaled in 1964; and two's and over. Four performance classes including reining, barrel racing, rescue race and pole bending. The horse show will also have an outside halter class for those who may want to show.

Ribbons will be awarded each place except in the horse classes where there will be only six ribbons per class, show officials stated.


