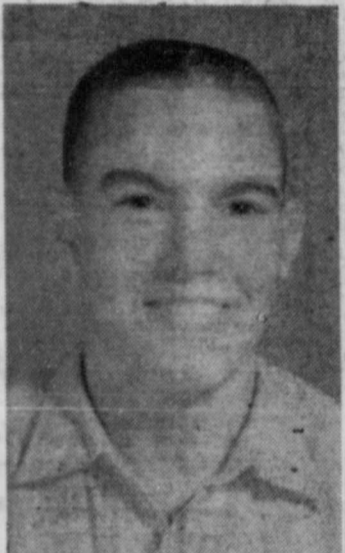
L. B. Burnham, chairman, and Clyde Cockrum, executive director, met with the council during the regular session Monday night and gave a progress report.

Nine hundred and twenty-one people in Mills County received a total of \$660,228 in social security benefits in 1965. E. Glen McNatt, Officer-in-Charge of the Brownwood social security Branch Office, revealed today, an increase of \$69,648 and 44 people over 1964.

A large part of the increase in payments resulted from changes made by the Social Security Amendments of 1965, McNatt said. Those changes which were in addition to the new program of health insurance for the aged, included a 7% increase in monthly benefits retroactive to January 1965; benefits for widows as early as 60; benefits for full-time students between 18 and 22; benefits for some people over 72 who hadn't worked long enough to get social security before; and the payment of disability insurance benefits to workers who are unable to work because of a disability that lasts 12 months or more.

"In addition," McNatt continued, "a good many older people, upon applying for medicare, found they were eligible for regular social security benefits, too. All in all, the 1965 figures for Mills County include 521 retired workers, 35 disabled workers and their families, and 272 wives and children of retired or deceased workers. In addition, 93 widows, widowers, or dependent, aged parents receive benefits. The average monthly social security benefit for Mills County beneficiaries amounted to \$70.64 in 1965."

"These figures," McNatt said, "show how wide the protection offered by social security has become. Just about every man, woman, and child in Mills County has in social security the assurance that loss of income because of retirement, disability, or death will not result in destitution — and now with medicare the aged have the assurance of help with the costs of operations or medical services."



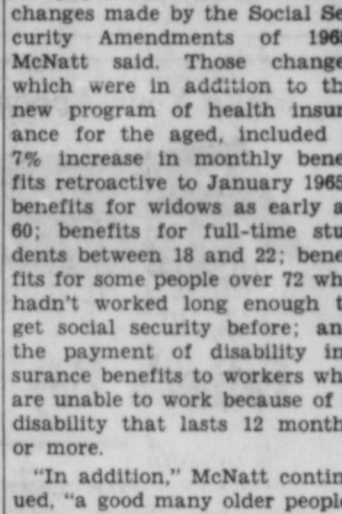

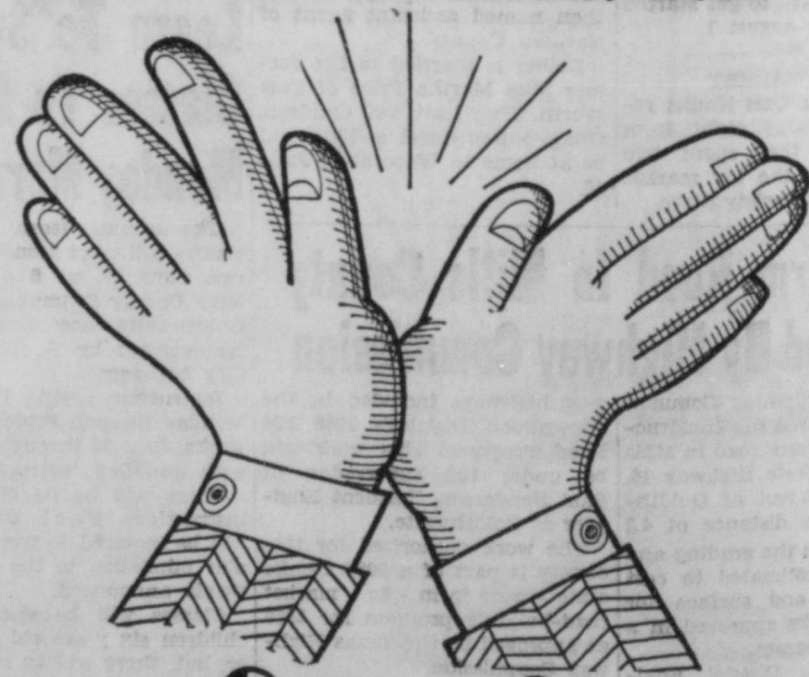

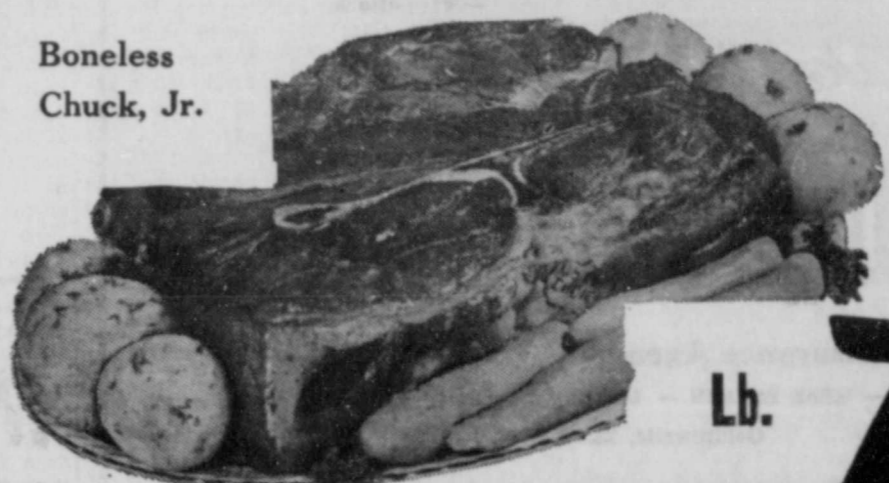
