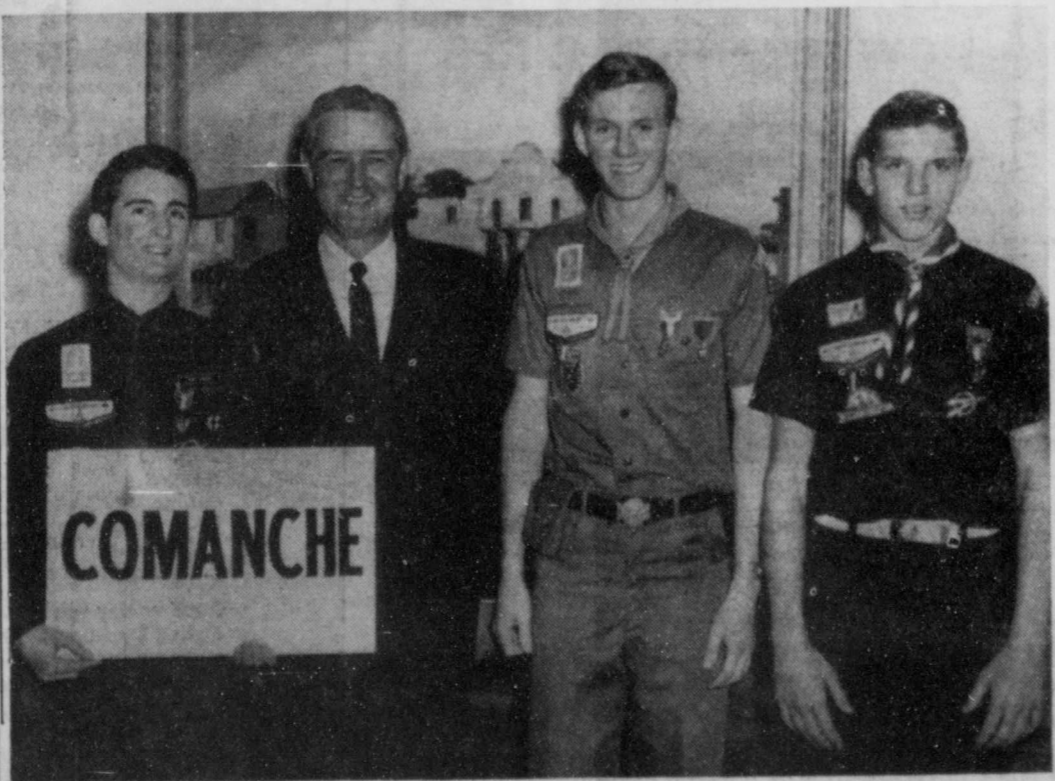
Harms has been attending a Ford Marketing Institute in Waco on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the past two weeks.
