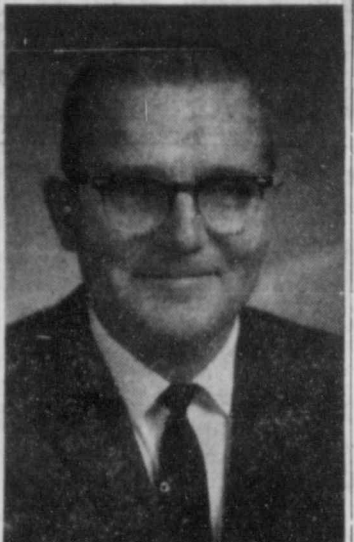

Norman G. Duren, Goldthwaite businessman, civic and church leader, was sworn in as Acting Postmaster for Goldthwaite, in ceremonies at the Post Office at the close of business last Friday evening.

He was selected from a list of three eligibles for the position to be presented to President Johnson for the permanent appointment to the postmaster-ship here according to Congressman O. C. Fisher.

29 Park Boosters Contribute \$497; Maintenance Fund Drive Continues

Twenty-nine booster of Mills County Park have contributed a total of \$497.54 during the past four weeks after announcement was made by the committee that funds were needed for park up-keep this year.

The park committee has provided funds for caretaker to insure park maintenance for the

past several years through voluntary contributions from interested citizens.

When the committee originally started the drive it was with the idea of getting a minimum of 100 interested persons to donate on the basis of \$1.00 per month, or \$12 a year, to do the job.

During the past several years a number of park booster have contributed more than the \$12. This has been a great help and has made the drive successful without personal solicitation campaign.

Last year the committee raised \$1,307.45. This took care of the park maintenance for the season and provided a few extras that are always needed.

Four weeks ago the committee opened the fund drive with an appeal for "At least 100 persons to contribute a minimum of \$12 to insure park maintenance for this year."

The response has been gratifying, according to park committee chairman, W. P. Duren, and the committee is hopeful that the \$1,200.00 will be forthcoming soon.

Goldthwaite and most of the Mills County area received some additional rain last Saturday night. Some sections of the county reported more than one inch of rain while some areas reported receiving none.

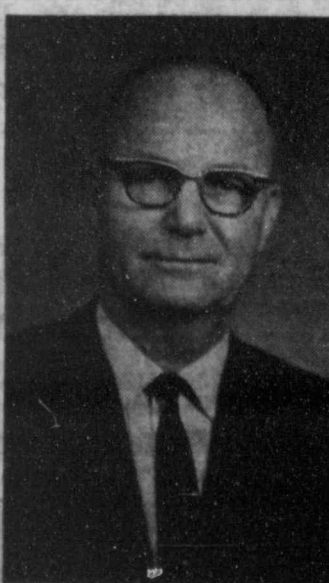
Goldthwaite measured an official .27 inch Saturday afternoon and night. Harry Allen reported. This brings the total for the month of March to 1.04 inches.

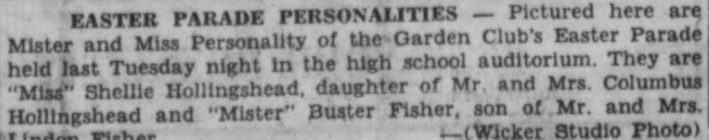

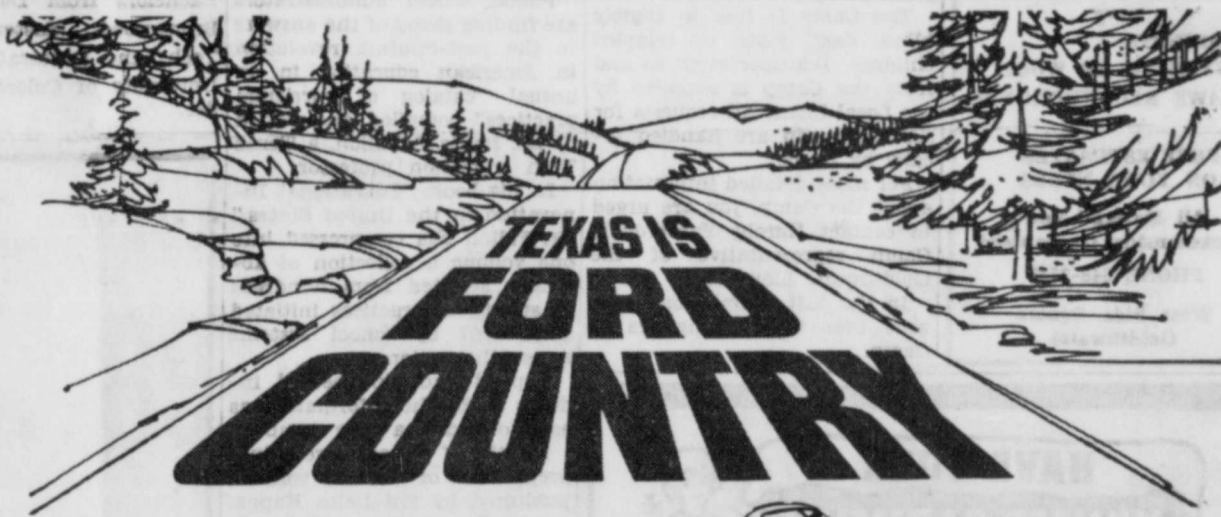

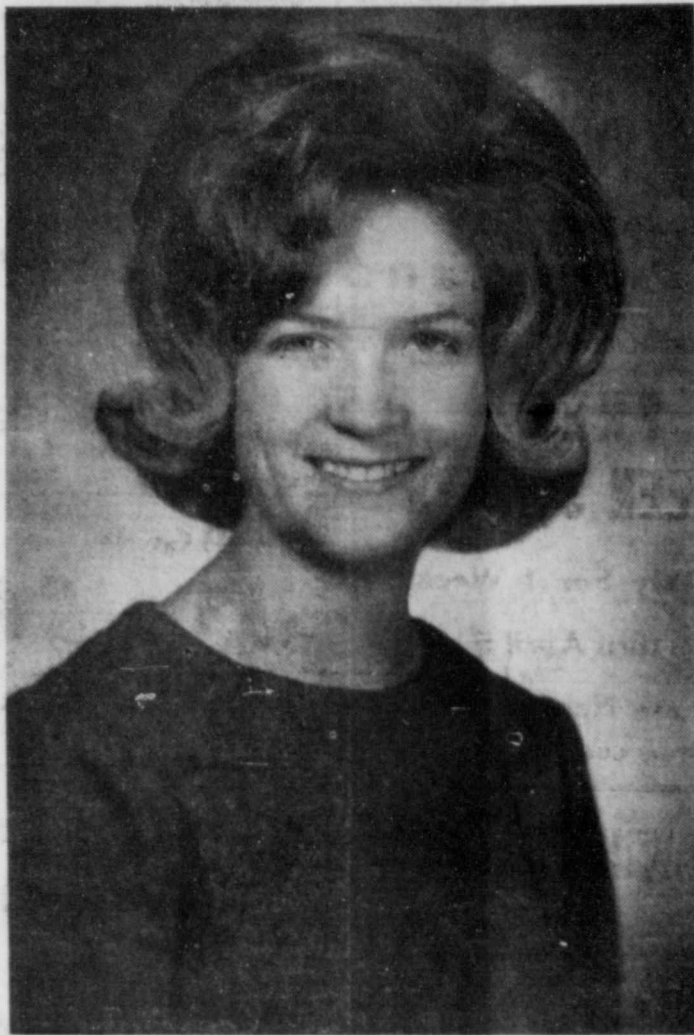

Months of research went into preparation of the first volume, published by Phi Delta Kappa. popularity of the initial edition prompted the publishers to commission Dr. Fallon to conduct the necessary research to bring the chronology up to date, thus covering a full decade of significant changes in schools in all 50 states.

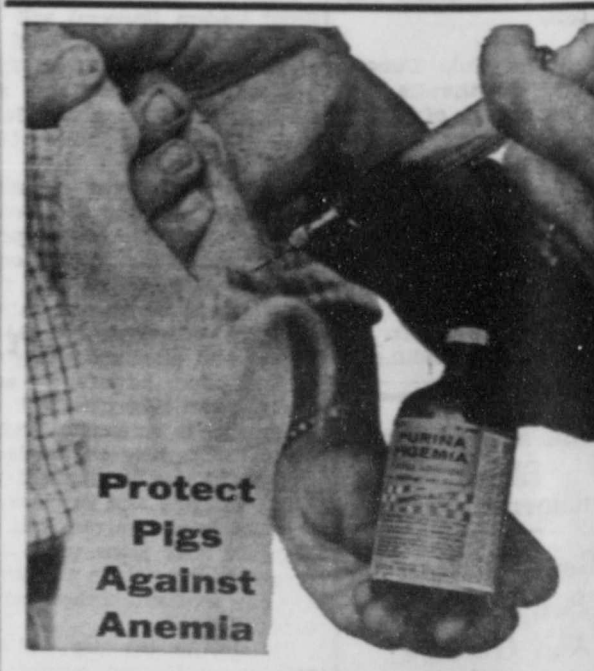

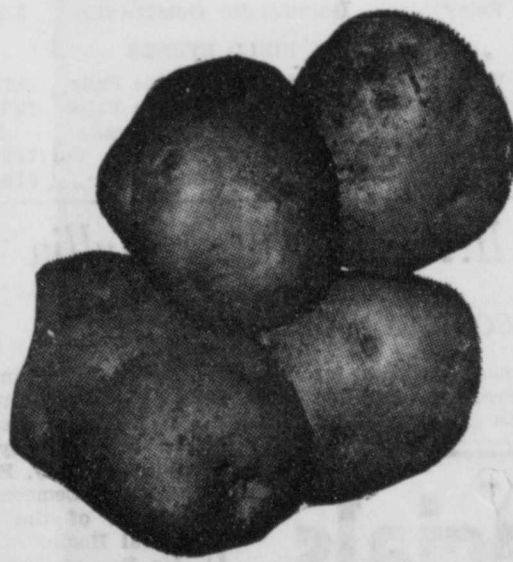
