Goldthwaite High School took first in the district meet held here last Saturday, qualifying 8 people for the regional meet next week Saturday, April 22.

Field events gave Coach Jackie Williams' Eagles a great lead as they took first in every event but the broad-jump.

The shot and discus men gave their teams 36 points as they finished 1, 3 and 4 in the discus and 1 and 3 in the shot. Ted Jones led the discus contestants with a toss of 129' 8". He was followed by teammates Mac Rowlett (3) and Gaylon Jernigan (4). In the shot Rowlett heaved his best of 51' 1/4" for a 1st, followed by Jones' 3rd.

Bobby Burns' leap of 12' 0" was good enough to earn him first in the pole vault. Other leapers of the day, Mike Conradt, took a first in the high jump as he cleared 5' 8" in that event.

Goldthwaite also led in running when they gained 20 points

from a 1st place sprint relay (James Berry, Sam Campbell, Harold Moore, and Gary Warlick). Their time of 44.9 was their best for this year.

The high hurdles event put two Eagles in the top three places when Sam Campbell placed second and Mike Conradt, 3rd. Sam pushed in a 16.8 while Mike managed a 17.5.

Gary Warlick put his name in the sprint books when he registered 1st in both the 100 and 220 yard dashes. A 10.0 was his time in the 100 while he also clocked a 23.3 in the 220.

Sam Campbell also registered his name in the intermediate hurdles when he came through the wire, a speedy 1st timed at 42.9.

## Wool & Mohair Incentive Payments To County Producers \$310,751.47

Incentive payments totaling \$310,751.47 have been made to Mills County growers under the 1966 National Wool Program, according to Lee W. Tabor, Office Manager, Mills County ASCS. Last of the checks were

mailed out Monday. These payments are as follows:  
MOHAIR \$214,165.87  
WOOL 83,301.50  
UNSHORN LAMBS 13,284.10  
Payments on wool and mohair

represent the percentage necessary to bring the producer's sales returns up to an announced support level. Lamb payments are made under the program to encourage the normal marketing of lambs with the wool on and to prevent unusual shearing of lambs.

The wool payment program was first authorized by the National Wool Act of 1954. It was extended by the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965 to cover marketings through December 31, 1969. As changed last year, the support level for wool in the future will be related to changes in production and other costs.

The 1967 support price for wool is 66 cents a pound, one cent higher than in 1966. The 1967 support price for mohair is 76.4 cents a pound, 0.6 cents a pound higher than the 1966 support price.

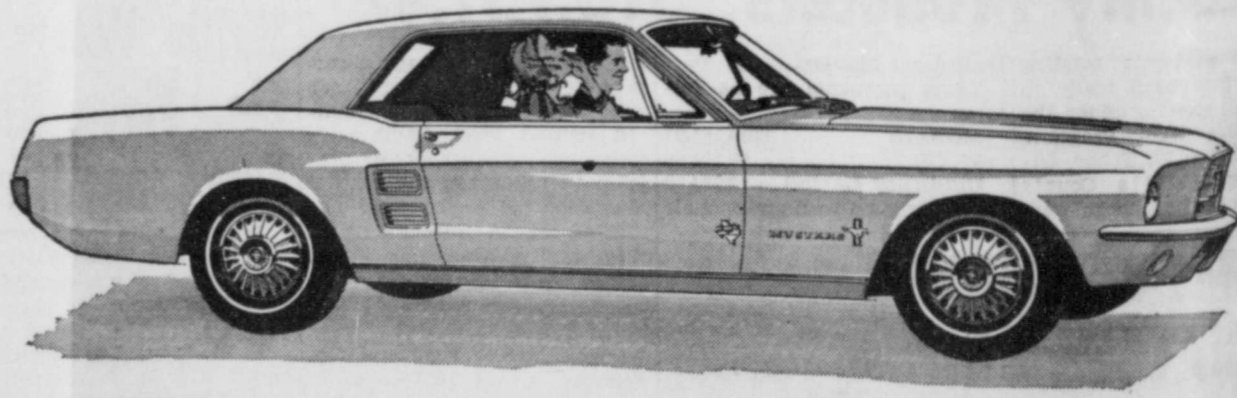

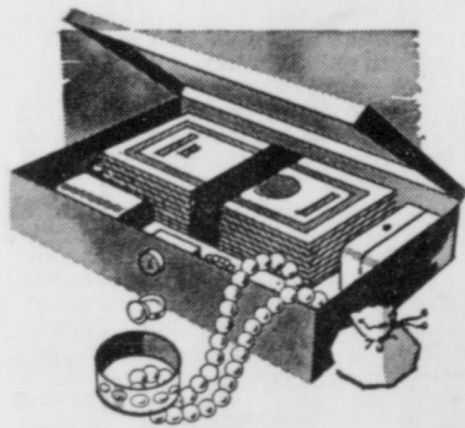

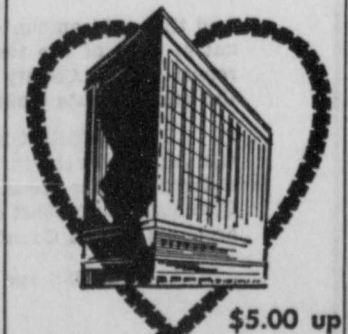

Good calves to put in the feed lots by county club boys and girls to groom for the coming year are not only hard to find, but they are hard to buy when they are found, County Agent George Reese reported this week.

Reese has traveled many miles in search of good calves to purchase for boys and girls of the county in their campaign to produce champions and the results have not been too good.

During one recent week the agent traveled approximately 700 miles in two days checking on calves and didn't make a purchase. They found four calves of the type he was looking for but some were not for sale, while others might as well have not been, since they were priced at \$750, Reese stated.

According to Reese, it is always hard to find good calves, but, this year it appears to be worse than in the past, especially when you are not looking for just calves, but some good stock.

At the present time about a dozen calves have been started under the supervision of the County Agent for this year's club projects, but, more are expected.

### STORING FROZEN FOODS

To keep food properly frozen, so that you get out of it the same top quality product you put in, requires a freezer temperature no higher than zero degrees, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Some 30 to 40 per cent of the home freezers checked recently by the USDA were not this low. Temperatures in one or two registered as high as 30 degrees. You can check your freezer simply by propping a thermometer among the food. Record the temperature at various places in the freezer. When you find the warmest spot, keep the thermometer there and try to keep the temperature at this point close to zero at all times. It will require adjusting the control as the size of the load and the temperature of the room changes.

If some of your home-frozen foods have been inferior in quality, check your freezer temperature. Too high storage temperature results in quality loss of product, even though the food may remain frozen.

### TREATMENT FOR FLAME RESISTANT FABRICS

You can make cotton fabrics "temporarily" flame retardant with two inexpensive easy-to-obtain chemicals. Because the chemicals are water soluble, the treatment doesn't last through washing, but it can still be practical to treat again, after washing, such articles as curtains, draperies, potholders, and upholstery padding.

Dissolve seven ounces of borax and three ounces of boric acid in two quarts of hot water. Thoroughly wet the cotton items to be treated and dry them by any convenient means. The items will be flame resistant (but not fireproof) until wet or washed.
