Waller Family Crash Victims Returned To Alabama For Burial

The seven members of the Waller family who lost their lives in the tragic car-truck crash at Star last week Tuesday were returned to their home town, Athens, Alabama, last Friday where they were to be buried.
Relatives of the Waller family arrived in Goldthwaite last Thursday night and helped to clear up the tragic situation that struck Mills County when eight people were killed.
Those making the trip from Alabama to Goldthwaite included Mrs. Hazey Kyle, Mr. and Mrs. Homer (Marie Kyle) Bivens, Emmons Kyle and Ira Lee Kyle, mother, sister and brothers of the dead woman.
They made positive identification of the dead and injured members of the Waller family. Through their identification the dead are: Earl Thomas Waller, 36, his wife Pauline, 31, and children Eugene, 11, Brenda, 10, Linda, 5, Frank, 3, and Michael 2.
Also killed was Robert Anderson, 40, of Hickory, N. C.
McConnell Funeral Home personnel and Sheriff M. W. Evans arrived here last Friday and took their bodies back to Athens, Alabama Friday afternoon.

People Respond With Open Hearts And Pocket Books When Need Arises

People in Goldthwaite, Mills County and from distant points will respond with open hearts and their pocket books when the need arises. This was demonstrated here during the past week as contributions poured in to help salvage the remains after tragedy hit in a car-truck crash at Star that took eight lives, and hospitalized four.
Seven out of 10 members of the Earl Thomas Waller family from Alabama and a truck driver, Robert Anderson of North Carolina, lost their lives in the accident.
Shortly after the accident it became apparent that the Waller family was without funds and it appeared that they would be buried in Goldthwaite.
There was immediate response from people of the community offering moral and financial support for the accident victims.
Contributions have been coming in at a steady pace since last Wednesday and the total as of Monday had reached \$2,042.44 with more coming in by the hour.
Douglas LeCroy, Minister of the Church of Christ, started soliciting voluntary contributions and was responsible for a large part of the funds donated to date. He turned in \$850.00 to County Judge Cecil Egger who is in charge of the special fund.
Minister LeCroy stated Tuesday that he is really sold on the people of Goldthwaite for their spirit of cooperation in time of need. "They were just wonderful, the way they rallied to the cause to help when I contacted them," he said.
Other contributions came from far and wide. They ranged from 22 cents to \$100. None were large donations, just average amounts from a lot of interested

Austin, Texas, May 2 — State Draft Boards will be called upon to furnish 975 men for the armed forces in June, Colonel Morris S. Schwartz, State Selective Service Director, said Tuesday.

This compares with quotas of 885 for May, 675 for April, 761 for March, 674 for February and 1,100 for January.

The Selective Service Boards will forward approximately 4,000 men in June for pre-induction examination, Colonel Schwartz said, and they have scheduled 3,000 for this examination in May.

Local Board quotas for induction and pre-induction examination in June are scheduled to be mailed from State Selective Service headquarters on or about May 10. May calls for the local boards already have been assigned.

Savings Bond Sales For First Quarter

During the first quarter of 1967 the citizens of Mills County purchased \$28,386 in Series E and H United States Savings Bonds, according to a report received from W. P. Duren, Chairman of the Mills County Savings Bonds Committee. Thirty-two per cent of the 1967 goal of \$90,000 has been achieved.

During the first three months of 1967 the sale of U. S. Savings Bonds in Texas totaled \$42,572,284. This is an increase of 10 per cent over the same period of 1966 and 23 per cent of the state's goal of \$181.3 million.

"The new Freedom Shares which went on sale May 1, 1967, will be issued to individuals only, with the simultaneous purchase of Series E Bonds on the Payroll Savings plan or Bond-A-Month plan at your bank. These new notes will have the same tax deferral privilege as the E Bond. Payment of income tax on the interest may be deferred to redemption or maturity, and the interest is not subject to state or local income taxes," Chairman Duren pointed out.

But, it was also immediately apparent that there was never a question among a number of local citizens but what the accident victims would receive a dignified and Christian funeral if buried in Goldthwaite or any Mills County community.

This was the feeling here even though during the same hour a television newscaster from the Central Texas area closed his announcement of the event with the assumption that the accident victims would be buried in "Paupers Graves."
