## \$269.46 Needed For Park Fund To Carry Program For This Year

Another \$269.46 is urgently  
needed for the Mills County  
Park Fund, it was announced  
Monday by W. P. Duren, chair-  
man of the park committee.  
This would provide the funds  
necessary to insure a caretaker  
through this year.

Minimum requirement for this  
maintenance job is \$1,200.  
Park Fund contributions to  
date this year total \$930.54, the  
chairman announced.

Support during the last two  
weeks has slowed down to a  
pace and the committee is  
urging those who have not sent  
their checks to do so now so  
that the job may be completed.  
Members of the park commit-  
tee have hopes that enough in-  
terested parties will come  
through with enough support to  
carry the program over the top  
this year.

Checks may be made out to  
Mills County Park Fund and  
mailed in to Duren at Mills  
County State Bank or given to  
any member of the park com-  
mittee.

The committee has a goal of  
200 supporters at a minimum of  
\$2.00 each to provide the funds  
needed for a year's upkeep.

Every contribution will be  
welcomed by the committee.  
Twenty-five have given to date. A  
number of them have given  
more than the suggested \$12  
which is a big help, the com-  
mittee pointed out.

## METHODIST CHURCH AT DUREN SLATES REVIVAL FOR JUNE 25 - JULY 2

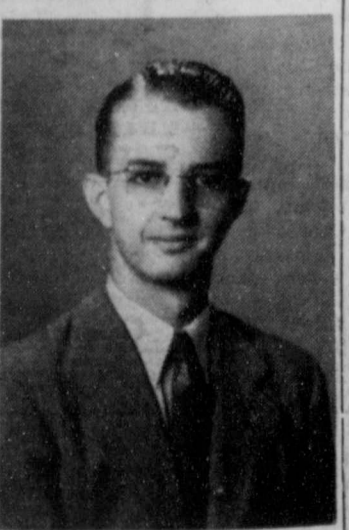
A revival will be held at the

Ross Rowlett, math teacher in  
Cross Plains High School, is at-  
tending the University of Texas  
where he was awarded a Na-  
tional Science Foundation grant  
for summer institute.

He was given a choice of two  
such institutes—the other at  
Sam Houston State College, but  
chose the one in Austin which  
will be a nine-week affair, be-  
ginning June 6 and continuing  
through August 8.

Rowlett will earn nine semes-  
ter hours of credit, three in each  
of the following areas: (1) Sem-  
inar on recent advances in sci-  
ence and mathematics. (2)  
Study of SMSG (Science and  
Mathematics Group) material  
for the first course in high  
school algebra and (3) an an-  
alysis class.

Rowlett attended a summer  
institute at the University of  
Houston in 1964. He holds Bachel-  
or's and Master's degrees from  
Howard Payne College and has  
taken administrative education  
work at Hardin-Simmons Uni-  
versity.

of Priddy.

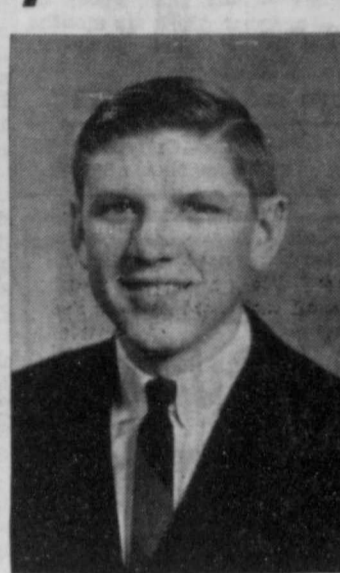
In Boys' State, the American

## Prices Are Announced For 1968 Wool Incentive And Mohair Support

A shorn wool incentive price  
of 67 cents a pound for 1968  
marketings, an increase of 1  
cent a pound over the present  
level, was announced today by  
the U. S. Department of Agri-

culture. At the same time, US-  
DA also announced the support  
price for mohair would be 77.4  
cents a pound, also an increase  
of a cent a pound over the pres-  
ent support price.

Center Point Ex-Students and  
Teachers Reunion has been set

County.

Shorn wool payments will be  
equal to a percentage of each  
producer's returns from sales.  
The percentage will be that re-  
quired to raise the national av-  
erage price received by all pro-  
ducers from shorn wool up to  
the announced 67 cents a pound  
incentive price. Mohair pay-  
ments will be determined in a  
similar manner.

The 1968 support program  
will be carried out under the  
National Wool Act of 1954, as  
amended by the Food and Agri-  
culture Act of 1965, which ex-  
tends the wool and mohair pay-  
ment program through 1969 and  
prescribes a formula which sets  
the support price for wool.

The Wool Act requires support  
of mohair within a range of 15  
per cent above or below the  
comparable percentage of parity  
at which wool is supported.  
The 1968 mohair support price  
is a cent a pound above the legal  
minimum level.

Payments to producers on the  
1968 calendar year marketings  
will be made beginning in April  
1969. Applications for such pay-  
ments must be filed not later  
than January 31, 1969.

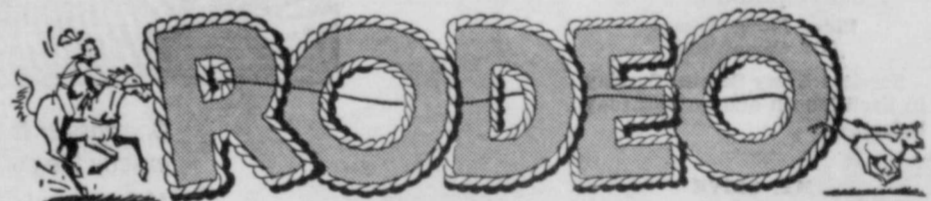

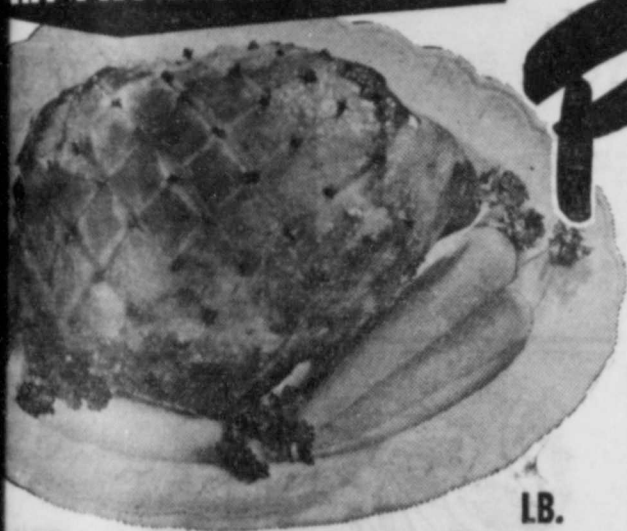
