16 Traffic Fatalities Recorded For Mills County Since January 1

The 16th traffic fatality for Mills County in the first six months of this year was recorded last Thursday when a Houston man was killed in a one car accident on FM Road 45 in the western part of the county. Robert Jordan Smith, 55, was pronounced dead at the scene by Justice Of The Peace E. H. Thorne. He was traveling alone. Patrolman Jack Straley and Sheriff H. G. Brooks investigated the accident which happened about 7:30 p. m. Thursday, June 22, 21 miles South of Brownwood. The 1966 Chevrolet car left the road on a slight curve and hit a tree and then overturned. Investigating officers reported.

The man reportedly was on his way from Houston to Richland Springs to visit relatives. He was brought to Roy Williams Funeral Home here and then was transferred to a San Antonio funeral home for services.

TWELVE FROM OUT OF COUNTY

While the county has a record number of 16 traffic fatalities on the scoreboard for this year, 12 of them involved out of county residents, Patrolman Straley reported. Four of the 16 were Mills County residents. They were the four teenage boys killed in the car-truck crash in downtown Goldthwaite recently.

Gov. John Connally signs Senate Bill 94 in the presence of Garth Jones, Associated Press; Sen. member of Texas Press Association's legislative committee. Rep. Bill Rapp of Raymondville, House sponsor, was unable to be present. Under the terms of the bill all meetings of official public bodies must be open to the press and to the public. Connally proclaimed the law "a great step forward for the people of Texas."

Coach Jackie Williams, 31, is a native of Lometa where he graduated from high school. He has had an outstanding and successful record while here. Under his direction the Eagles won the district football championship three out of the last four years. They won 41 games and lost 10 the past five years. In track the Eagles won four district championships, two regional and one state championship. The girls won the district basketball championship five years, under Coach Williams. At Lampasas Williams will be line coach for the A team, will teach P. E. in high school, and will be assistant basketball coach in high school. Mrs. Williams will teach reading at the junior high level in Lampasas. Both Mr. and Mrs. Williams are graduates of Howard Payne College and both have masters degrees. They are attending Southwest Texas State College at San Marcos this summer taking more advanced courses. In announcing plans to leave Goldthwaite Coach Williams issued the following statement:

"Because of the fine spirit of cooperation on the part of the boys, the school, and the town, and because of the way you have helped us to feel this is 'home,' it is with deep regret that I come to the time I must leave Goldthwaite. "The past eight years have been good years in so many respects. We could go no place where the people of the town would make us feel any more welcome than you have. Nor could we go any place where the people would support the athletic program any more than you have. Your cooperation and support have been so appreciated and have helped to make our program what it is. "There has always been a lot of hard work, but there also have been people in the community who were willing to take their time and use their efforts to do what was necessary to make our program what it is. My thanks go out to each of you for all you have done to make these years fruitful years both for the athletic program and for the community. "My family and I appreciate all the things you have done for us personally. We will always cherish the friendships made here."

50 YEARS AGO-

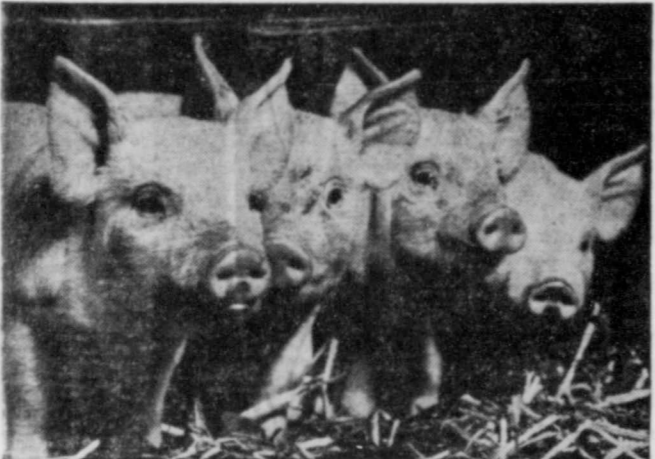



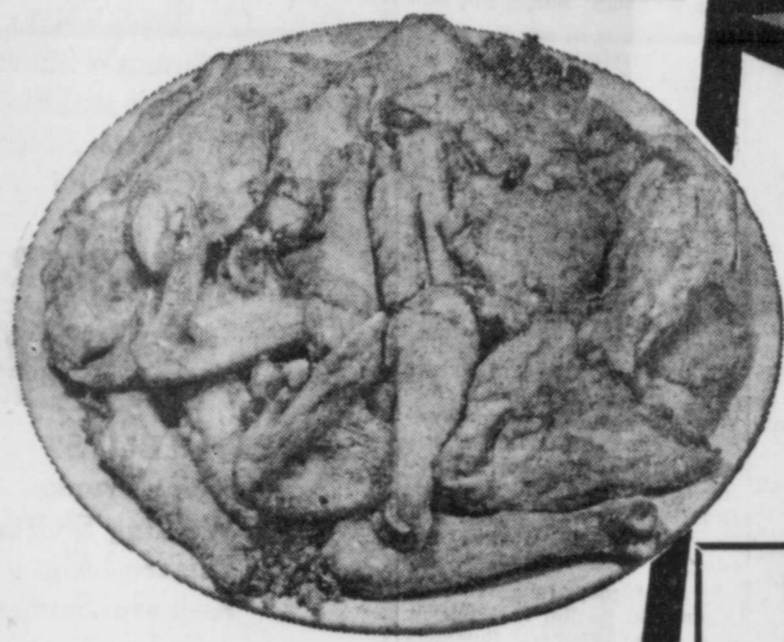
