Eagles Defeated By Clifton 40-0; Go To Marble Falls Friday Night

In a hard-fought game here Friday night the Clifton Cubs defeated the Eagles 40-0.

The Cubs received the ball in the end zone on the kick-off and on a first down with about 50 seconds gone in the game, Bob Ledlow (22) gained six points for the Cubs on a 75-yard pass play. The kick for an extra point was good, making the score 7-0.

Mike Wright and Sam Campbell gained two first downs for the Eagles in the next few plays, only to be disappointed on a fourth-down punt. Mike Con-trard kicked the ball, which was blocked and caught by Bobby Golden (50) who ran 10 yards for a TD. Another extra point put the Cubs ahead 14-0.

Throughout the whole game, Mac Rowlett, Danny Humphries,

Kent Geeslin, and Charles McCasland displayed some exceptionally fine tackling. Early in the second quarter, Gary Warlick intercepted a pass and gained yardage for the Eagles, with fine blocking from Lynn Berry.

The Cubs' third TD was a six-yard run by Gary Anz (44). Geeslin blocked the kick for an extra point, leaving the score 20-0.

With determined spirit, Ronnie Auldridge, Paul Kirkpatrick, Dale Straley and Danny Spradley continued to hit the Cubs with all their strength. Despite their efforts, on the third quarter kick-off, Wayne Prescher (26) ran back the punt 91 yards, making the score 27-0, with an extra point.

The Cubs fifth TD was a 9-yard sprint by Gary Anz, (44). The kick was successful for an extra point, and the scoreboard read 34-0.

Early in the last quarter, Glenn Haywood (20) received a 26-yard pass for the final touchdown of the game. The attempt for extra points was no good ending the score at 40-0.

About halfway into the fourth quarter, Eagle Quarterback, Ted Roberts was injured, and Byron Harper substituted the rest of the game with Ted Jones as center.

Application For Charter To Be Approved And Directors Named

An un-official meeting of stockholders of the proposed Goldthwaite Industrial Foundation has been called for tonight at 7:30, in the Community Room of Mills County State Bank.

Ray Duren, temporary chair-

man, announced Monday after a committee meeting that the purpose of the stockholders meeting is to approve charter application for the organization, and to decide on the number of directors.

Directors will be selected at this meeting to serve the organization until the first annual meeting. Date of the first annual meeting will be established when the by-laws are formed and approved.

It was announced at the meeting Tuesday that sixty-nine stockholders have pledged their support to the Foundation, in the amount of \$25,400.

The drive for stockholders has not been closed and some contacts are still to be made. If additional support is forthcoming, the capitalization for the Foundation may be boosted to \$30,000.

A group of interested citizens in an open meeting a few weeks ago, voted to organize the non-profit organization with a capitalization of \$25,000.

Financial participation is through stockholders on a minimum of \$100 per share with persons, or firms, allowed to take any number of shares. This is payable in cash, or ten percent with pledge and the balance on a 30, 30, 30 basis which is payable on call from the board of directors as need may arise.

All who have pledged financial support as stockholders will be officially notified of the Thursday meeting, and the steering committee is hopeful that a large number will be present.

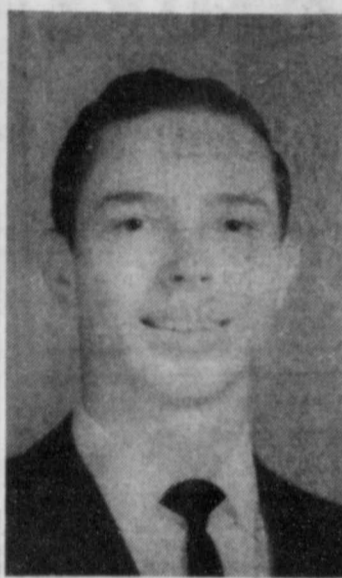
Lions Club Broom And Mop Sale Is Re-Scheduled Today

Questions And Answers Asked At Draft Boards

Editor's Note: Below are questions now being asked at draft boards. The answers are by Col. Morris S. Schwartz, State Selective Service Director, 702 Colorado Street, Austin, Texas 78701. He will welcome your questions.

Q—I received my bachelor's degree in June. I have been accepted for graduate study in history in September. Will I qualify for II-S deferment?

A—This depends on your draft board's decision. If it defers you, the new regulations permit it to do so for one year only.

Q—I have completed three years of college and have earned 75% of the units required for my degree, but my class standing is very low. Can I be deferred for my senior year?

A—Yes. You must be classified in II-S (college student) if you are full time and satisfactory. Class standing doesn't matter any more.

Q—I've heard that the deferment of graduate students in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, osteopathy, and optometry is now mandatory. Is that right?

A—Yes, if the student is satisfactory in his studies.

Q—Who decides he is satisfactory?

A—The school in which he's enrolled.

Q—Who gets classified in Class I-Y?

A—A man who takes the Armed Forces physical and mental examination and is not found qualified for service, but could be later if Congress declared war or national emergency.

Q—Does Selective Service establish the physical, mental and moral standards for entry into the Armed Forces?

A—No. These are prescribed by the Secretary of Defense.

Q—Who conducts the examinations to determine a man's acceptability?

A—Army personnel acting as the agent of the Department of Defense.

Q—Who says I am liable for service in the Armed Forces?

A—The Congress of the United States.

Q—Who says I'm available for induction into the Armed Forces?

A—The Department of Defense.

Q—I thought the Department of Defense ran Selective Service. Isn't it a part of the Defense Department?

A—No. It's an independent agency of the President. The Director of Selective Service is responsible directly to the President and not to the Secretary of Defense.
