Each veteran would be permitted to purchase under a tract of sale \$10,000 worth of land with a 5 per cent of payment, appraisal and service fees of \$50, and legal recording fees not to exceed \$100. Interest charged veterans on past purchases has not exceeded 41/2%. ments would be semi-annual and repayment wou amortized or retired over a period of 40 years. Any trac land consisting of a minimum of 15 acres may be pur ed under the program, there being no requirement a use. A veteran may also select a tract costing more \$10,000, but he will be required to pay the difference tween the purchase price of the land and \$10,000, which the maximum amount that would be paid by the Vete Land Program for each veteran.




