Exercises Scheduled Friday Night For Vocational Nursing Graduates

Mrs. Carol Cruzcosa, C. R. N., A., director of the Childress & Cruzcosa Clinic & Hospital, School of Vocational Nursing, announced that the graduation exercises of her present class will take place on this Friday, February 9, at 7:30 p. m., in the new St. Peter's Catholic Church.

Members of the third graduating class are Mrs. Lois Slagle, Mrs. Virgie Ripley, and Mrs. Eilda Martinez, all of Goldthwaite, Mrs. Irma Coffman of Center City, and Miss Nelda Swinney of Hamilton.

These five new graduates in addition to the two other classes will bring to 16 the total number of alumni of the School, established on September 1, 1964. All the graduates, except one, are actively employed in nursing in Goldthwaite. After this class, however, Mrs. Cruzcosa stated that there will be no additional classes planned in the near future.

The School was primarily established to alleviate the nursing shortage that once existed here. With the graduation of the present class, the need for nurses should be satisfied. Mrs. Cruzcosa added, however, that if additional nurses are again needed, the School will be reopened.

The two previous classes ranked favorably with the other

schools of Vocational Nursing in the State of Texas. The first class ranked fourth in the Texas State Board Examination for vocational nurses in a field of 82 schools, with Mrs. Faye Leonard, L. V. N., being among the top 10 of 1,060 graduates. The second class ranked first the following year in a field of 76 schools, with Mrs. Nan Shaw receiving the honor of getting the highest grade among 1,013 graduates. Mrs. Lola Belle Duran, a member of the same class, ranked in the top 10 in the same exam.

The School has the same high hope for its present graduates when taking the State Board Examination.

Father Frank Briganti, past pastor of St. Peter's Catholic Church, will be the commencement speaker. He is presently Chairman of the Commission for Ecumenical Affairs of the Catholic Diocese of Austin, and Chairman of the Council of Religious Women (theological formation for nuns) of this same diocese. He also is theological consultant for the updating of Catholic Sisterhoods in the United States and conducts seminars around the country dealing with the modernizing of the Catholic Church.

Refreshments will be served in the Meeting Room of the Church after the program. The public is cordially invited.

Mullin To Have City Election

Mayor Rodney Carlisle has ordered a city election to be held in the City of Mullin on Tuesday, April 2, being the first Tuesday in April.

The election is for the purpose of electing four city councilmen. Three councilmen are to be elected for a regular two year term each and one councilman is to be elected for a one year un-expired term, according to official notice appearing in this issue of the paper.

Councilmen whose terms expire this year are Alvin Spinks, Mackie Hodges and Rodney Carlisle. Carlisle's place has been open since he was appointed mayor and Doug Spinks has been serving on appointment to the post of Mackie Hodges who moved.

The other place is that of Gerry Locke who was elected last year and moved away from Mullin creating the vacancy.

Holdover members are Mayor Carlisle and Councilman D. A. Morgan.

The election will be held in the G. I. Building in Mullin, Mr. Carlisle stated.

New Wing For Heritage Home With 20 Extra Beds Is Now Open

Mr. and Mrs. A. K. Arnold, co-owners and operators of Heritage Home in Goldthwaite, have announced that the new wing which has been under construction the past three months, is now open.

Consisting of 10 additional rooms, the new addition provides for 20 more beds. It was added to the center of the present building at the back, extending west between the two other wings on the U-shaped building.

The additional 20 bed capacity provided by the new wing brings the total number of beds available in Heritage Home to 80.

The new wing was constructed with sound resistant walls. A new nurses call system has been installed with sufficient capacity to take care of the additional beds that were added in the new addition. Also, a new fire detection system has been installed, servicing the entire building. A beauty salon and recreation room for arts and crafts has also been provided and a paved parking area for employees and visitors is being added.

Heritage Home was first op-

ened here in July 1964 with 42 bed capacity. In 1966 a new wing was added providing an additional 18 beds for a capacity of 60. The new addition brings the total number of beds to 80.
