

Texas Public Schools Week To Be Observed By Mills County Schools

Goldthwaite, Star, Priddy, Mullin Schedule Programs Of Visitation

The 18th annual observance of Texas Public Schools Week in Mills County will begin Monday, March 4, and continue throughout the week in Goldthwaite, Star, Priddy and Mullin schools. Goldthwaite and Mullin schools will close Friday for teachers' meeting.

All patrons of each district are invited to visit their school and take part in the planned programs. The four county schools have planned special activities with exhibits, open house programs, and guided tours for visitors.

GOLDTHWAITE

Goldthwaite school patrons are invited to eat lunch with students in the two school lunchrooms and to visit in the classrooms Monday through Thursday, according to LeRoy Beard, superintendent; Hoyett Browning, high school principal, and James Dean, elementary school principal.

The following schedule has been announced by Principals Browning and Dean, in order to help balance the work load for the lunchroom employees and members of the faculty.

Elementary parents are requested to visit on the following schedule if they plan to eat in one of the lunchrooms:

Monday, March 4—Mrs. Rainey's fourth grade and Mrs. Page and Mrs. House's third grades.

Tuesday, March 5—Mrs. Mankin, Mrs. Elliott, and Mrs. Skippling's first grades.

Wednesday, March 6—Mrs. Campbell and Mrs. Nickols' fifth grades and Mrs. Barnett and Mr. Dean's sixth grades.

Thursday, March 7—Mrs. Davis' fourth grade and Mrs. Letbetter and Mrs. Cockrum's second grades.

Those who do not plan to eat lunch are welcome to visit any class on any day.

High school parents are invited to visit school on the day of their choice and to eat lunch if they desire.

All interested residents of the school district are welcome to come and visit school and eat lunch there whether they have children in school or not.

Tuesday through Thursday will be special visitation days at Priddy School, according to Supt. H. Earl Culp. Parents are invited to visit the school and see what the students are doing.

School Trustee Filing Deadline Is March Sixth

Next Wednesday, March 6, is the last day on which candidates may file for the school trustee election and have their names printed on the official ballots. Filing deadline is 30 days before the election which is scheduled for Saturday, April 6.

Three trustees are to be elected to the board for the Goldthwaite, Mullin and Priddy school districts for a regular three year term. In the Star School district three trustees will be elected for a regular three year term and one trustee will be elected for a one year un-expired term. Three members will be elected to the County School Board, one from each of commissioners' precincts one, two and four. Candidates must file with County Judge Cecil Egger.

Names may be placed on the official ballot by the candidate signing up in person or by petition signed by five regularly qualified voters of the respective districts.

Candidates nominated by petition also must sign the affidavit for candidate for public office in the office of the County Judge 30 days before the election in order for the names to be placed on the official ballot.

Bruce is an incumbent and seeking re-election. The other two council members whose terms expire this year are V. A. Hudson and Dr. C. S. Cruzcosa who have not filed for re-election.

This week Saturday, March 2, is the last day for candidates to file and have their names placed on the official ballot. The city election is scheduled for Tuesday, April 2, and the filing deadline is 30 days before the election.

Construction Bids Are Asked For Unit Low-Rent Housing Project

After a long period of planning the Housing Authority of the City of Goldthwaite, will receive bids for construction of a Low-Rent Housing project consisting of 36 dwelling units, it was announced this week by L. B. Burnham, chairman of the Housing Authority and Clyde Cockrum, executive director.

Construction bids will be received until 2:00 p. m. on Wednesday, March 20, 1968 at the City Hall in Goldthwaite, at which time and place all bids will be publicly opened and read. Official invitation with complete details for bids appears in this issue of the paper.

Proposed forms of contract documents, including plans and specifications, are on file at the office of the Housing Authority of the City of Goldthwaite.

The 36 unit project will include 24 units for the elderly and 12 units for low income families. All units will be of duplex design with two units to a building and of brick veneer construction.

Two sites in different locations were acquired by the Housing Authority for the low

rent housing units. The 24 units for the elderly will be constructed on two blocks of ground located between East Front and Lynch Streets. The property was formerly known as the old Greathouse Gin location. The 12 units for low income families will be constructed on a block of land acquired from Mrs. W. E. Fairman. It is located between West 5th and West 6th Streets bounded by Roseman Street and McIntosh on the East and West.

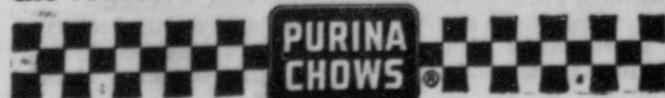

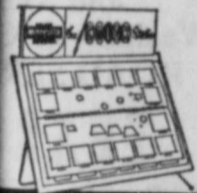

Goldthwaite Public Schools

Payroll during the year totals \$204,131 which is paid to 50 members of the faculty and employees.

Annual budget for Goldthwaite school system this year is \$250,446. This does not include lunchroom operations.

There are 31 teachers and administrators in the school system.

The school system operates seven buses and one private carrier driving approximately 102,000 miles per year.

Estimated value of school buildings, land and equipment and all physical facilities of the district would run in the neighborhood of \$750,000. These include Elementary School, High School, Gymnasium, Stadium, Agriculture Building, Storage Building, High School Lunchroom, and approximately 80 acres of land.

Total enrollment for the 1967--68 year has now reached 475 pupils for both high school, junior high and elementary school.

Goldthwaite Schools operate two modern lunchrooms serving an average of 360 meals daily and total expected for the year of 65,000.

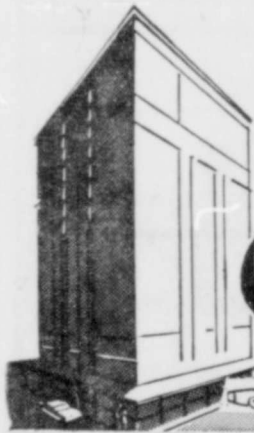

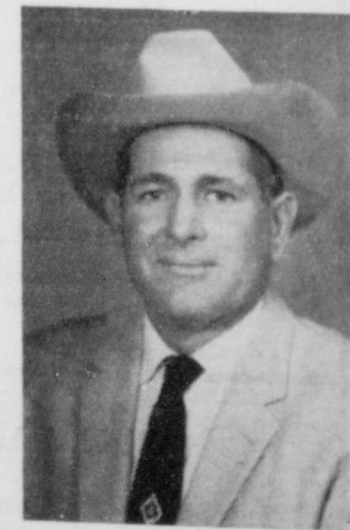

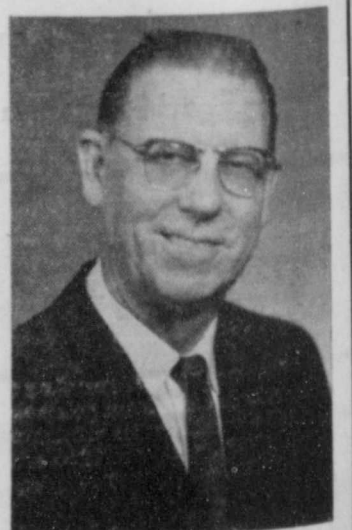
