Lampasas Firm Submits Low Bid For 36 Unit Low-Rent Housing Project

A Lampasas firm has submitted the low bid for construction of the 36 unit low-rent housing project in Goldthwaite, according to announcement by Clyde Cockrum, executive director and L. B. Burnham, chairman of the Goldthwaite Housing Authority.

Robert L. Guyler Co., Lampasas, turned in a bid of \$358,294.00 for the job. Bids were opened last Wednesday afternoon at a special meeting of the Housing Authority called for this purpose. Five bids were submitted with other bids ranging from \$16,000.00 to \$69,000.00 more than the low bid.

The meeting was held in the City Hall, Goldthwaite, with all board members of the Housing Authority present. Members are: L. B. Burnham, chairman; Houston Duren, Harold Yarborough, Doug Collier and Kellis Landrum.

Also attending the meeting were Clyde Cockrum, Executive Director and Elwin Fitch, representing Fitch & Holdredge, Architect for the project, from Houston.

The bid is now before the Housing & Urban Development office of Fort Worth, for review and approval. This is expected to be completed in about 10 days and officials announced that construction could get underway in April.

Plans for the low rent housing project for Goldthwaite have been underway for a long period of time with planning and site selection and acquisition.

The 36 unit project will include 24 units for the elderly and 12 units for low income families. All units will be of duplex design with two units to a building and of brick veneer construction.

Two sites in different locations were acquired by the Housing Authority for the low-rent housing units. The 24 units for the elderly will be constructed on two blocks of ground located between East Front and Lynch Streets. The property was formerly known as the old Greathouse Gin location.

The 12 units for low income families will be constructed on a block of land acquired from Mrs. W. E. Fairman. It is located between West 5th and West 6th Streets bounded by Rosseman Street and McIntosh on the East and West.

Mail For Servicemen" Pamphlet Now Available At Post Office

Illustrated pamphlet — the expanded program for "Mail For Servicemen," outlining the expanded program for airlifting letters, packages and

other military mail overseas at low postal rates is now available through Goldthwaite Post Office window clerks. Postmaster Norman Duren announced today.

Postmaster Duren said that "as a result of new legislation and action by President Johnson we are now airlifting more than 75 per cent of all mail going to the military men and women stationed abroad. We hope this guide will help more American families be familiar with these services and use them."

The eight-page pamphlet illustrates three services for airlifting parcels at rates the average family can afford, the speedy service now available for newspapers and news magazines to most overseas bases, the

special rates for books and similar educational materials, and how to mail sound-recorded personal messages. The guide also provides parcel wrapping instructions, information on the time it takes parcels to reach Vietnam and other overseas bases from major U. S. cities, and pointers on the correct way to address military mail.

A family sending a 10-pound package from Goldthwaite to Vietnam, for example, pays only \$3.25 on a package marked "PAL," while the air parcel rate for the same package is \$8.03, Postmaster Duren said.

On parcels weighing less than 5 pounds it might be more advantageous for a family to use the older (SAM) Space Available Mail Service, which provides surface transportation to

the port of embarkation and airlift overseas. A four-pound SAM package to a European military post from Goldthwaite costs only \$1.30. On packages weighing under two pounds air parcel post is often the patron's "best buy" for through airlift service, the pamphlet suggests.

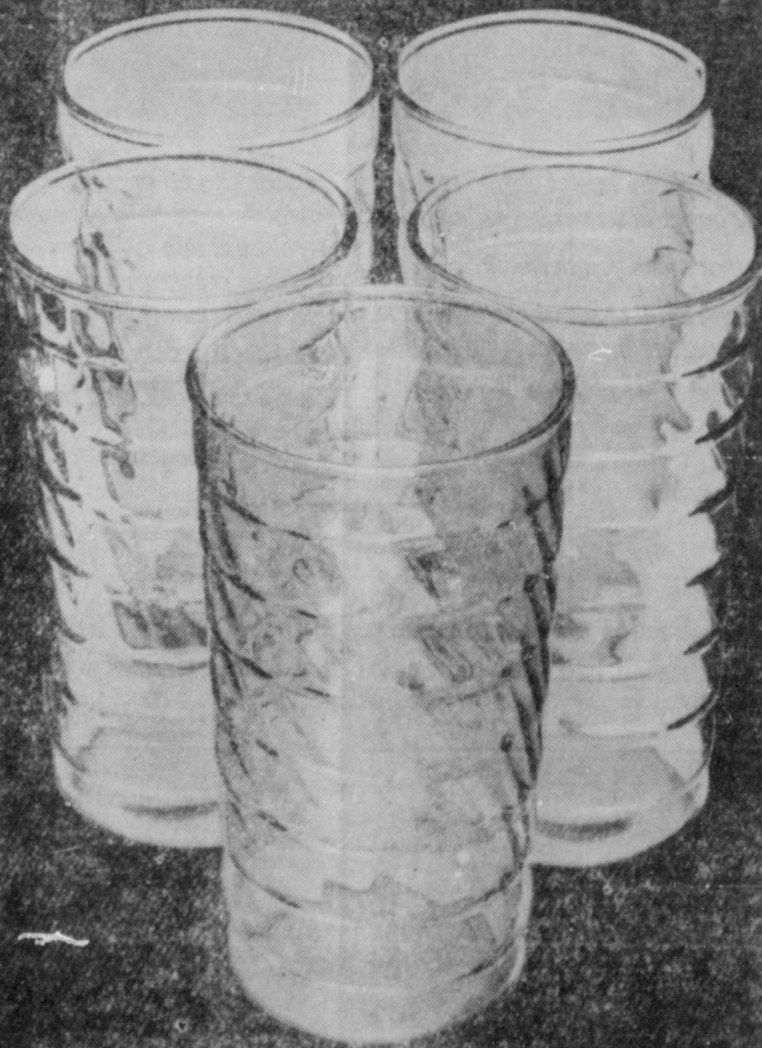

COUNTY HOME DEMONSTRATION AGENT

No cooking utensils to wash. Does this sound good to you? Here's one meal that will almost cut out the cooking utensils. Try cooking chicken in a paper bag, the brown paper sacks that come from the grocery store. Cut a fryer into halves or quarters. Brush the inside and outside with butter and sprinkle with celery salt, onion salt, garlic salt, pepper, and paprika. Place the pieces in a heavy brown paper bag, allowing plenty of room without stacking. Twist the bag shut. Cook on a rack in a 400 degree F. oven for an hour and fifteen minutes. The bag will not burn, and you can forget about the chicken until the cooking time is up. Some foil may be placed on a lower rack to catch any drippings. A suggested menu includes potatoes baked with the chicken, a wilted spinach salad, ice cream and milk to drink. Lemon and orange slices are good with the chicken. This constitutes a balanced meal that is easy to fix.
