### Calibration Of Equipment Stressed By CA

What does calibration of equipment mean to a good farmer or manager, asks County Agent George G. Reese? His answer-more money in his pocket and the reputation of being a better manager.

Calibration of equipment means knowing, for example, that a fertilizer distributor will spread 1,800 pounds to the acre and not 1,000 pounds or 2,500

The calibration of sprayers is more critical than the calibration of other equipment and the results can be disastrous.

Under - planting or sowing means that you are losing a definite percentage of your soil's production capacity. How long would you keep a low production cow or a tractor that was running on 3 cylinders instead of 4? Over-planting or sowing means a waste of expensive seed and too much competition between plants.

Why not do something about the calibration of your planters grain drills, fertilizer distribuors, and chemical applicators? Operators manuals for the machines usually contain calibration instructions.






