18 Park Boosters Contribute \$276 To Launch Maintenance Fund Drive

Eighteen boosters of Mills County Park contributed \$276.00 during the past week since announcement was made by the park committee that funds were needed for park up-keep this year.

The park committee has provided funds for caretaker to insure park maintenance for the past several years through voluntary contributions from interested citizens.

When the committee originally started the drive it was with the idea to enlist a mini-

mum of 100 interested persons to donate on the basis of \$1.00 per month, or \$12 a year, to do the job.

In the past a number of boosters have contributed more than the \$12. This has been a big help and has made the drive successful without personal solicitation campaign.

Last year the committee raised \$1,272. This took care of park maintenance for the season and provided a few extras that are always needed.

Last week the committee

opened the 1968 fund drive with an appeal for "At least 100 persons to contribute a minimum of \$12 to insure park maintenance for this year."

The response has been gratifying, according to committee chairman, W. P. Duren, and the committee is hopeful that the \$1,200.00 will be forthcoming in a 30 day period. The drive this year was started late so the need is urgent.

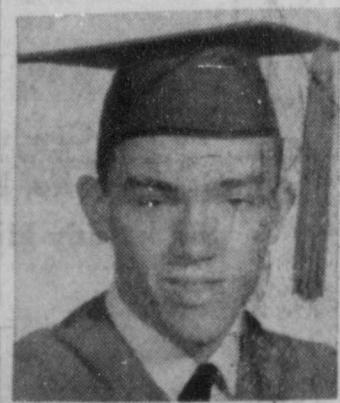
With 18 interested parties giving \$276.00 the first week, the committee feels that the goal will be reached in the 30 days.

Work Progressing On New \$50,000 Shamrock Station In Goldthwaite

Work is progressing on the new Shamrock station that is under construction at the north Y in Goldthwaite.

The station is being built by J. Allen Ritter Construction Company of Amarillo for the Diamond-Shamrock Corp. Superintendent for the job is Ben Wilson.

When completed the station will be under lease to Wylie Oil Company of Lubbock, the jobber for Shamrock Products for this area.

The 1.3 acre site was purchased from Robert Burdette.

Construction plans call for the job to be completed about June 15, according to Mr. Wilson.

The station, costing about \$50,000, will be an all service type operation, with three islands for traffic. One island will be under a 30 ft. by 40 ft. canopy while one will be open for large trucks. A 40 ft. ramp around the pump area will be concrete paved while the balance of the driveway area will be blacktop.

A large Shamrock sign, about 40 feet high, is being erected at the southeast corner of the property and a smaller identification sign will be at the

north edge of the lot. Plans call for selection of a local resident for operator of the new station.

Swimming Pool To Open May 30

Mills County Swimming Pool in Goldthwaite will open for the 1968 season on Thursday, May 30, it was announced the past week by the Pool and Park Committee.

The opening will be on Memorial Day Holiday.

W. C. Barnett, city manager, announced at the park board meeting last week that plans are underway for extensive repainting at the pool and bath house for the new season.

Hoyett Browning, GHS principal, will manage the pool again this season. He has managed the pool the past several seasons.

Mr. Browning announced Tuesday that Ronnie Saylor will serve as life guard this season.

Plans call for the pool to open at 2 p. m. daily.

PCA Stockholders To Have Annual Session In San Saba This Saturday

The stockholders of the Production Credit Association will meet at the San Saba High School Auditorium this Saturday, May 18th, at 10:30 a. m. for their 34th Annual Stockholders' Meeting, according to Charles Conrad, Vice President in charge of the Goldthwaite field office.

Mr. W. H. Calkins, Vice President of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Houston, will be the featured speaker. Mr. Calkins has been with the credit bank at Houston since 1933 and is an authority on agricultural credit. He appears many times each year before various credit groups to make addresses on agricultural credit, fiscal matters, and the economic outlook for agriculture. Calkins is responsible for the credit activities of his bank, and through his office over 200 million dollars of credit is provided for Texas agriculture annually.

"The San Saba Production Credit Association, serving eight Central Texas counties with offices at Brady, Goldthwaite, Lampasas, Llano and San Saba, has had a successful growth and has played a major role in agricultural credit in the territory it serves," stated Vice President Conrad.

A comparative statement of condition for the years 1948, 1963, and 1968 appears elsewhere in this paper. "It is interesting to note," comments Conrad, "that during the 12 months just ended we have

loaned over 26 million dollars against a little over 6 million in 1948."

"We attribute our rapid growth to the larger type operations, the increased demand for our budgeted type loans which result in lower interest costs to our borrowers, and our making the type loans designed to fit agricultural needs, and the fact that a borrower can carry up to \$35,000 credit life insurance on his PCA loan," Conrad says. "Although money costs to the Association have continued to rise, it is interesting to note that the average cost to our borrowers for the past 12 months has been only \$2.38 per \$100 borrowed."

The Stockholders of the San Saba Production Credit Association will hear in addition to the address by Mr. Calkins a financial report of the Association's business by Newell A. Oliver, President; a report from the Board of Directors by its Chairman, Mr. J. C. Ellison; and will elect two directors for three year terms.

Mr. James M. Green of Mullin serves the Goldthwaite office territory as one of the five directors of the Association, and also serves as a member of the Association's loan committee. Mrs. Margaret C. Duren is employed as assistant to Mr. Conrad in the Goldthwaite PCA office.
