Jerra Crain of the Soil Conservation Service in Goldthwaite recently attended a two day training session on Civil Defense and radiological monitoring. The session was held at Civil Defense Center at Denton, Texas.

Crain reports that the Civil Defense Center in Denton is a very impressive building. In the event of a nuclear attack it can house 500 people underground for a period of 30 days and is completely self sufficient. All emergency planning operations for the immediate 5 state area will be conducted in this building should a nuclear bomb attack occur in this 5 state reg-

The Soil Conservation Service has the responsibility of detecting and measuring radiation from radioactive fallout on ag ricultural land and on agricul tural products in the event of a nuclear attack. In order to carry out this responsibility each SCS employee is required to be proficient in radiological monitoring. Training sessions for this purpose are held periodically at the Civil Defense Center in Denton


