## County FFA Members Selected For Degrees At Area VII Meet

Seven Mills County FFA members were selected to receive State or National degrees at the Area VII Association Convention held in Fredericksburg, June 3. Final approval will be given during the June meeting of the State Committee in Austin.

Wayne House of Goldthwaite was selected to receive the Nation's highest degree in FFA work, the American Farmer Degree. The top award will be presented during the National FFA Convention in Kansas City, Missouri, in October of 1968.

Gaylon Jernigan of Goldthwaite, Douglas Meier, James Schrank and Donnie Stegemoller of Priddy, and Dwight Head and Robert Hunt of Star, were selected to receive the State's highest degree in FFA work, the Lone Star Farmer Degree. The top state awards will be presented during the State FFA Convention in Lubbock, July 16 through 18.

At the Area Convention, Gaylon Jernigan was elected one of the Vice-Presidents of the Area VII Future Farmers of America Association for the school year 1968-69. Other vice-presidents elected to serve with him were Ralph Donaho, Monte Anderson, Juan Alonzo and Gary Shipman. Dennis Engelke was elected Area VII President.

## Wool Incentive And Mohair Support Prices For 1969 Announced By ASCS

### Commissioners Serve As Board Of Equalization

Mills County Commissioners served as a board of equalization and met last week on Monday through Wednesday, June 3 through 5, to go over the tax roll of the county, according to announcement by County Judge Cecil Egger.

The board raised each tract or survey that was rendered under \$5.00 per acre, according to official notice appearing in this paper.

The remainder of the renditions were left as they were on record.

This is the first general session of the Commissioners' Court as a board of equalization since 1953. A small group of renditions were checked by the commissioners in 1958, according to Judge Egger.

Notices of the changes in rendition by the equalization board will be mailed to county property owners by County-District Clerk Walter A. Bryant and dates will be set for the board to meet for hearings.

Judge Egger said that approximately 1,000 parcels are involved in the changes to bring all tracts and surveys up to the minimum of \$5.00 per acre in renditions on the county tax rolls.

Officers will be elected at the next meeting of the board of directors.

Wool incentive and mohair support prices have been announced for 1969.

The incentive price for a marketing year is announced in advance so producers know the prices when shaping up their herds, according to Roy T. Cozart, Mills County ASCS Office Manager.

Shorn wool incentive support price for 1968 marketings was set at 67 cents per pound, an increase of 1 cent over 1967 level and for 1969 marketings, the support level will be 69 cents, an increase of 2 cents a pound over the 1968 level.

Mohair support price for 1968 marketings is 77.4 cents per pound, an increase of 1 cent over the 1967 support price, and the 1969 support price will be the same as the support price for 1968 marketings.

Shorn wool payments will be equal to a percentage of each producer's net proceeds received from sales. The percentage will be that required to raise the national average price received by all producers from shorn wool up to the incentive price per pound.

The percentage rate recognizes quality production and encourages producers to improve the quality and marketing of their wool.

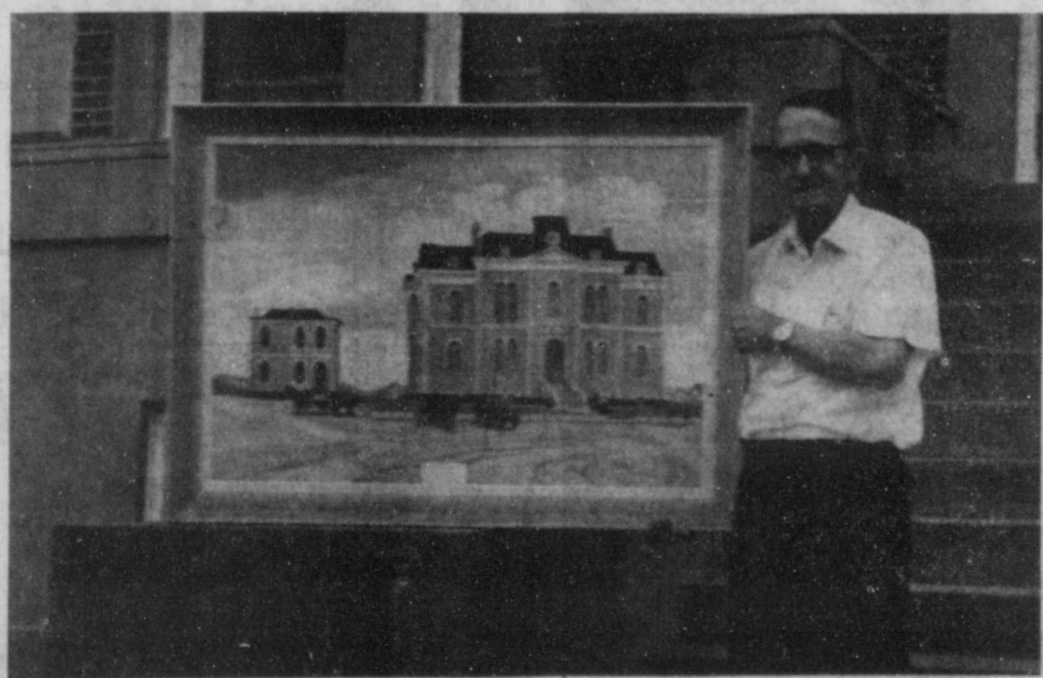
The higher the price the individual receives, the greater his payment. Mohair payments are determined in a similar manner.

The support price for unshorn lambs is established at a level in relationship to the support price for shorn wool that will maintain normal marketing practices. This means primarily to avoid unusual shearing prior to marketing in order to obtain the payments on shorn wool. This is accomplished by making payments on unshorn lambs sold to give the producer or feeder essentially the same net return that he would receive if he sheared the animals and obtained the payment on shorn wool.

The wool payment program was initiated as the most practical method by supporting producers wool prices thereby increasing income with the goal of a continuing domestic production of wool.

The total wool payment earned in Mills County for the 1967 marketing year was \$214,497 and total mohair payment was \$352,123 for a combined total of over one-half million dollars for the county.

Payments to producers for the 1968 calendar year marketings will be made beginning in April 1969. Applications for such payments may be filed anytime during the year as sales are made but no later than January 31, 1969.

"There is not a Member here who would not assume that I am opposed to the pending bill but let me say to those of you who support it that you would do well for the country to wait for a more sober and a more calm atmosphere to act than is the obvious case at the present time.

"I think if I were for this so-called civil rights bill, with its open housing feature, I would not want to cast my vote for it while soldiers and marines are having to stand guard in front of this Capitol. I resent threats of force and duress in anything and if I had to legislate under such conditions I would walk out of this Chamber and not return.

"There is a way to honorably and with courage meet this issue, since apparently it is going to be acted on within the next hour or so. That is, to send this measure to conference with the Senate. Let differences between the House and Senate bills be resolved and brought to each body for approval or disapproval under more calm circumstances.

"This matter has no deadline except the threats of those groups who look for any excuse to riot and demonstrate. If it is not this, it likely will be something else. When the drums call they will be there and it is high time we challenge the drummer.

"It is a sad commentary on this Congress if it yields to the pressures of the moment. I for one had rather yield my seat in this House than to do so."

The results of this Legislation referred to is now well-known to everyone from press reports. As one who has always taken pride in the House of Representatives of the Congress as the greatest deliberative body in the world, there is reason to

day to be ashamed of its actions. The shame is not because the results of the vote but because the House legislation under pressures and through wholly and completely un-American.

On the vote, 89 Democrats and 106 Republicans stood against approval. 152 Democrats and 77 Republicans voted to pass the Bill. As a part of the influences under which this legislation should not have been considered was the fact that flags all over the Nation were flying at half-mast for a man who had never held any official position and the Presidential Proclamation ordering the nation was without precedent.

The flags were not lowered for Travis Crow, age 19 of Tallahassee, Florida, who was burned to death defending his father's small grocery store. The only use of the flag for a man killed in Vietnam is to cover his casket. Travis Crow and his boy shipped back from Vietnam have not said they would support only the laws which they thought were good and dignified those which in their opinion were bad.
