Kerrville Firm Bidder For Blanket Cr. Site

Contract was let Tuesday for the Blanket Creek Watershed project in the Blanket Creek watershed.

Jenckle, of Kerrville, submitted the low bid of \$139,000 according to announcement by E. J. Hughes, Area Conservationist, Soil Conservation Service, Brownwood. Jenckle is one of five contractors who submitted bids at Temple on the Blanket Creek Watershed prevention structure. Construction is to get underway in 30 days.

The 5th flood prevention structure to be built in the Blanket Creek Watershed, located on the Dick Jones road, about 10 miles north of Mullin, will reduce flood damage in the watershed by more than 6,000 acres of bottomland, numerous crops, fences, bridges and roads. For every dollar spent in the 5 dams there is \$120 worth of benefits and a total of \$72,837 in benefits, SCS officials said.

Last large flood which occurred in 1959 and prior to the construction of the flood prevention dams caused an estimated \$110,000 damage to crops, livestock, fences, railroads, bridges and other structures in the floodplain of the Blanket Creek. The Unit Conservationist, Goldthwaite office, stated Wednesday morning when he reported on this project.

Mills County State Bank Tops \$10,000,000 In Assets This Month

The County State Bank reached a remarkable milestone this month when the assets went over the ten million dollar mark.

P. Duren, president, announced that the bank's assets reached a peak of \$10,116,165.29 on Tuesday, June 4.

This new high in total assets, as well as in deposits and loans, reflects a tremendous growth over the past 7 years.

It was seven years ago, in June 1961, when the bank moved from the old Trent building location at the corner of Fisher and Fourth where it had been many years, to their new home on the west side of the courthouse square on Parker Street.

Record of growth from June 1961 to June 1968 is shown in comparative statement appearing in a special Progress Report advertisement in this paper.

This shows that loans, deposits and total assets all more than doubled during the seven year period.

Deposits on June 4, 1968 hit a peak of \$9,090,975.85 while on June 10, 1961 they were \$3,852,494.84. Loans were \$4,521,542.87 while seven years ago they were \$2,037,190.05. Total assets on June 10, 1961 were \$4,400,018.92 and on June 4, this month they topped the 10 \$ million mark for a record high of \$10,116,165.29.

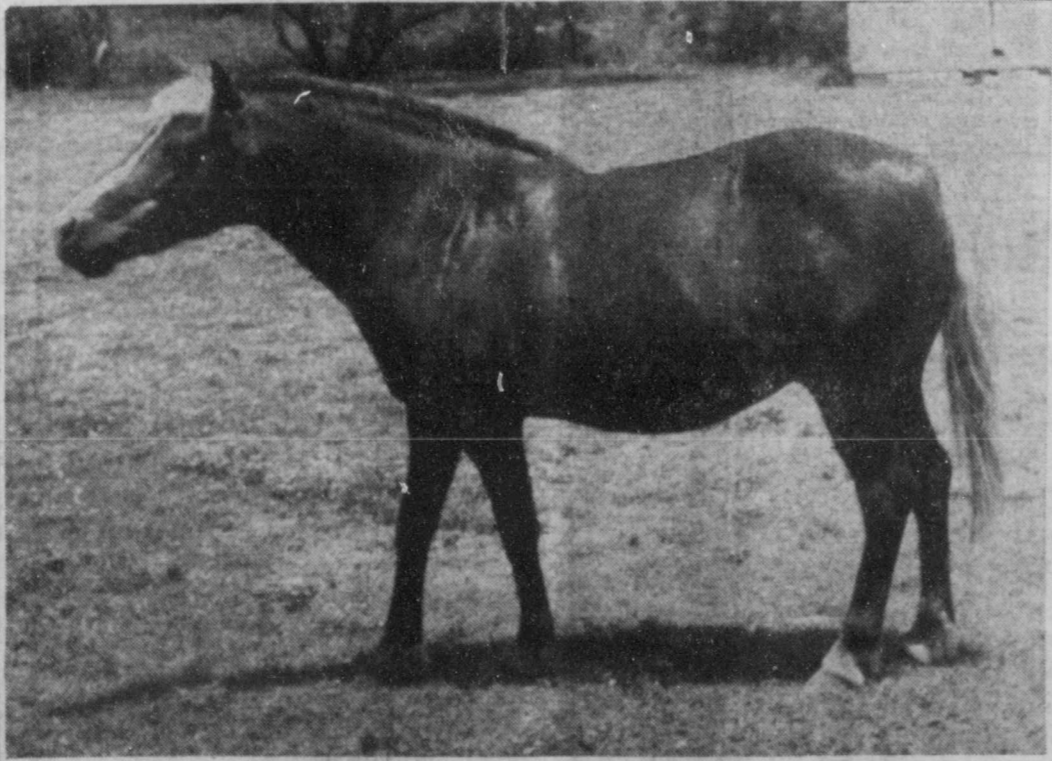

Hunting Lease Project Undertaken By Jaycees For Benefit Of County

A recent project set up by the Mills County TAP Committee and undertaken by the Goldthwaite Jaycees shows promise of bringing outside money into Mills County. Quite a few out-of-town people seek hunting leases in Mills County each year, and the purpose of the project is to see that their needs are met.

According to Doug Sellars, Chairman of the Mills County Technical Action Panel, the project is to compile a list of landowners who are interested

in leasing hunting rights. Once the list is compiled, a brochure containing landowners' names, their acreages, the types of game they have and the accommodations available will be printed for public distribution. Advertisements will then be placed in out-of-town newspapers in an attempt to bring outside hunters into the county.

Hollis Wiggins, President of the Goldthwaite Jaycees, reports that similar projects have been very successful in other counties. It has enabled some landowners to add over a dollar per acre to their income with very little added cost in operations. Those who develop camping facilities are able to get more. Wiggins states that their referral service will be provided by the Jaycees at no cost to the landowners.

This week the Jaycees received their first inquiry for a hunting lease. The inquiry was for 1,000 acres plus cabin facilities for a three-family group from Temple. "Promotion of our Mills County Wildlife resources and available hunting leases could result in many more inquiries," says Wiggins.

All who are interested in having their names, hunting leases, and facilities placed on this list should contact members of the Goldthwaite Jaycees, the Soil Conservation Service, the ASCS Office, or Benny Schriver of the Texas Fish and Game Department.
