## \$295.00 Needed For Park Fund To Carry Program For This Year

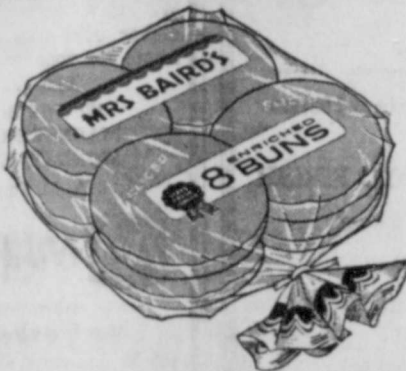

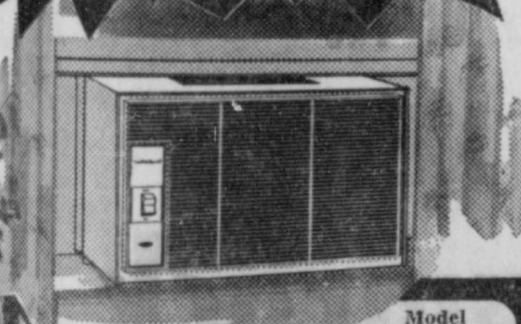

This is the season for home grown fresh fruits, and many Mills County trees are bearing in a bountiful fashion this year. For those of you who have apricot trees (and I found one in my yard last week) I have gathered some recipes that will be helpful in using this fruit in its fresh state. Of course you can always make preserves with it, but let's see what else you might do: One of my favorite uses for fresh apricots is in apricot cobbler or a two-crust apricot pie. The basic fruit pie recipe will produce fine results with these.

Mrs. Hollis Blackwell has an interesting recipe for Apricot Cream Pie. For this you use a baked pie shell — fill with a basic cream (vanilla) filling, then a layer of cooked apricots that have been mashed and/or run through a sieve — add sugar to taste — top with whipped cream. This makes a "laraping" dessert for these hot days.

Mrs. Bill Yeager says one of her favorites for apricots is called Apricot Butter. To make this you just pit the apricots, cook with sugar until the mixture has a uniform, thick consistency that is soft enough to spread easily when cold. (Make it as sweet as your family likes it). Uses for Apricot Butter are many: spread it on hot cakes, or use for a filling for cake, use as preserves for breakfast, or drop on vanilla ice cream for an apricot sundae. You can probably come up with many more uses for this one.

Mrs. V. A. Hudson says she enjoys fresh apricots in fruit salad, or served with cottage cheese for a summer salad treat.

Mrs. H. J. Leonhard offers a recipe for drying apricots to use after the season has passed. Perhaps many of you have wondered how this is accomplished. Well, here's how she does it: Wash, split and pit the apricots — place on cookie sheets and bake in a 250 degree oven for four hours. Put cooled apricots in freezer bags and store in freezer until you are ready to use them.

Another method of keeping apricots for future use is to freeze them in the fresh state. When put up in the following method they can be eaten as fresh fruit, or used for cooking to make any of the recipes mentioned above: Wash, halve and pit — place in freezer containers — cover fruit with a 40% sirup pack solution — leave head space and press

fruit under sirup with wax paper — seal and freeze.

### 40% SIRUP SOLUTION

3 cups sugar  
4 cups water  
4½ teaspoons crystalline ascorbic acid.

This yields 5½ cups sirup. If you like apricots as much as I do, I know you will enjoy trying some or all of these recipes this season. Bon Appetite!
