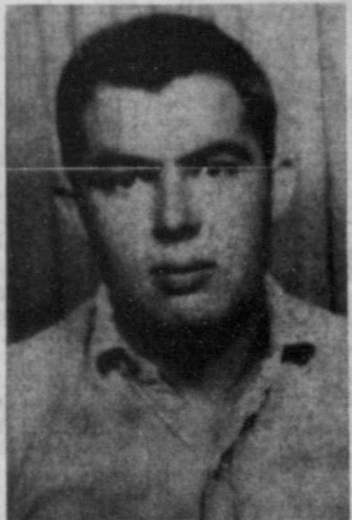

Postmaster Norman Duren Explains New Saturday Post Office Schedule

Postmaster Norman Duren notified the Eagle this week that beginning Saturday, July 27th and each Saturday thereafter the Goldthwaite Post Office (like all 1st and 2nd class post offices) will be closed for all financial transactions.

This means no stamps will be sold at the window, no money orders written and no postage sold for packages.

The stamp vending machine will be open and will deliver 5 cent and six cent stamps.

Postmaster Duren stated there would be a two hour (9:00 A. M. To 11:00 A. M.) window service for General Delivery and "left notice" and "hold" mail.

All Saturday collection service will be adjusted to conform generally with existing Sunday collection service. This is 6:15 a. m. from both outside boxes and 4:50 p. m. for out of town mail in the outside box at the rear of the Post Office.

Duren said: "Do not mail local or mail addressed to 'City'"

Sheriff Brooks' Roadblock Nabs Five Filed Against For Shoplifting

Fast work on the part of Mills County Sheriff H. G. Brooks last Friday afternoon resulted in two men and three women being arrested and charges filed against them for shoplifting incidents reported by San Saba and Goldthwaite authorities.

It all began when Brooks received a radio message from San Saba County Sheriff Brantley Barker giving him the license number of the suspects' car headed toward Goldthwaite. This followed a shoplifting complaint in San Saba about 1:30 p. m.

Sheriff Brooks hurriedly drove out the San Saba highway about five miles where he set up the roadblock. The car was stopped and three of the people,

two men and one woman, got out of the vehicle. Two women who remained in the car attempted to drive away when Brooks shot one of the tires causing the car to stop some distance down the road. Neither of the women was injured.

In the meantime the Sheriff had sent out a radio message that he was having trouble and within 12 minutes officers from San Saba, Lampasas and Brown Counties and Deputy Sheriff Edwin Bessent were on the scene, according to Brooks.

The five, Wanda Scott, 28, of Amarillo; Lesta Jo Cates, 30, of Dallas; Jasha Marie Collins, 25, of Mexia; James Edward Dora, 27, of Lubbock; and Booker T. Thomas, 24, of Lubbock, were placed in custody in Mills County jail.

Charges of shoplifting were filed in Justice of the Peace Court of E. H. Thorne in Goldthwaite against all five. Bond was set for \$1,000.00 for each one. Four were released on bond while one, James Edward Dora, was still being held in lieu of bond Tuesday, Brooks announced.

The four were also released on bond of \$1,500.00 on charges filed in San Saba County.

The cases will be brought before the Grand Jury in the regular November term of District Court on the first Monday in November, Brooks' stated.

After the five were apprehended officers discovered clothing in the car identified as coming from The Man's Shop in San Saba valued at \$500. Also clothing valued at \$100.00 was discovered and identified as coming from Hoover's Western Store in Goldthwaite which had been visited earlier in the day.

About 95 per cent of the items discovered in the car was men's clothing, according to investigating officers.

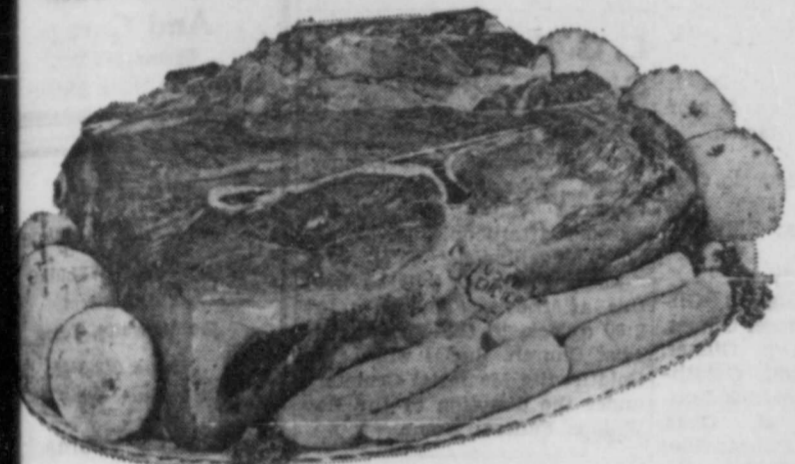

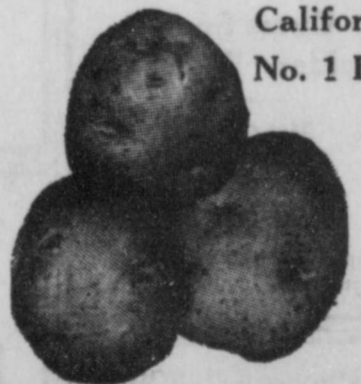

That was our 4-County Camp Day in which we hosted the day and had Comanche, Brown and Eastland county H. D. members as our guests. It was an all day affair held at the Mills County Youth Center. To our great joy, 98 women registered, but more than that attended all or part of the day's activities.

There were exhibits of arts and crafts from each county attending. During the day a demonstration on "how to do" one of the crafts exhibited was presented by each county.

Eastland County showed how

to make flower arrangements out of buttons, and this is truly fascinating.

Brown County showed how to make a purse out of upholstery webbing, and a few other items.

Comanche had a pin cushion made from a tuna fish can. It turned out to be a real cute little velvet chair trimmed with lace, or whatever you would like to put on the edge. Of course the seat part was the pin cushion.

Mills County gave up their time to other parts of the program. We had singing, recreation, a dramatic skit and an exchange of gifts at the close of the program.

There was also a drawing for 10 door prizes that had been donated by our local merchants. The ladies enjoyed all these things. I did too, but thought the highlights of the day were our two guest speakers. During the morning session we heard Mr. Charles T. Lee, from Texas Power and Light Company out of Dallas. The title of his talk was "You Name It, and I'll Sell It." He misled us into thinking he was going to tell us how people sell us things we really don't need or want. As it turned out he is a sneaky person who is selling us on our own wonderful county — making us aware of the freedoms we enjoy in America. He was "waving the flag" as he put it, and it was a most refreshing approach to patriotism.

I do not think any of us who attended this meeting will take our freedom for granted again for a long time.
