Dove Season To Open Sunday

The annual dove season in the north zone of Texas will open this coming Sunday, September 1. Shooting hours for mourning doves in the north zone, in which Mills County is located, begin at 1 p. m., Daylight saving time, or 12 noon Central Standard Time.

Officially, the state is on Daylight Saving Time and will be until October 27. So, the starting hour each day will be 1 p. m. until reversion to Central Standard Time on October 27 when it will start at 12:00 noon.

Bag limits for mourning doves will be 12 per day and 24 in possession. Use of rifles is prohibited by both federal and state laws. All shotguns must be permanently plugged to a shell capacity of three, including one in the chamber.

Hunters are also reminded to remember that shooting from public roads and hunting from motor vehicles on public and private lands is prohibited by law, according to Benny R. Schriver, Game Management Officer for Mills County.

Prospects for dove hunting in the Goldthwaite area look good, although the birds are scattered due to the abundance of natural food and waste grain. This situation should create better hunting near watering areas. Schriver asks that all hunters practice safety first and consideration for their hosts, the landowners.

Members of the Eagle staff appreciate the cooperation of reporters, community correspondents and advertisers in getting a copy in early for next week, because of the holiday on Monday.

The regular meeting of the City Council, which is normally held on the first Monday night of the month, has been rescheduled for the following Monday, September 9.

Change in the meeting date was made because of the Labor Day holiday on Monday, September 2.

Through an oversight James Reese's name was left off the Star School faculty for 1968-69 which was listed in last week's issue of the Eagle. Mr. Reese will be principal and teacher of business at Star High School.

The six-man team promises some fine action in a scrimmage with Melvin at Cherokee at 8:00 p. m., according to Tiger coach, Grant Tidwell.

Another scrimmage is scheduled for September 6, against Carbon at Blanket. Game time will be 8:00 p. m.

In speaking of this year's team, Coach Tidwell said, "We have a fine group of boys this year and they are working very hard. We're anticipating a much better season than last year."

Cen-Tex Angora Goat Show & Sale To Be Held Here Friday, Saturday

Members of the Central Texas Registered Angora Goat Breeders' Association will have their twelfth annual show and sale at the show barns in Goldthwaite Friday and Saturday, August 30 and 31.

Goats will be in their pens by 7:30 a. m. on Friday and sifting will get underway at 8:00 a. m. when 100 bucks and 25 does will be selected for the sale, from about 175 bucks and 50 does.

The top 25 bucks and 10 does will be placed starting at 1:00 p. m. Friday, from which the champion buck and doe will be selected.

The sale will begin promptly at 1:00 p. m. on Saturday. There will be a barbecue dinner served on the grounds.

The goats offered for sale have been consigned by 20 Angora breeders. The association has 50 members in Mills, Comanche, Hamilton, Coryell, Lampasas, Brown, and San Saba Counties.

The Central Texas Angora Goat Breeders' Association organized for the purpose of improving the commercial and Registered Angora flocks in the area and for the convenience of those in need of better stud and range bucks and top quality does, according to Dr. T. 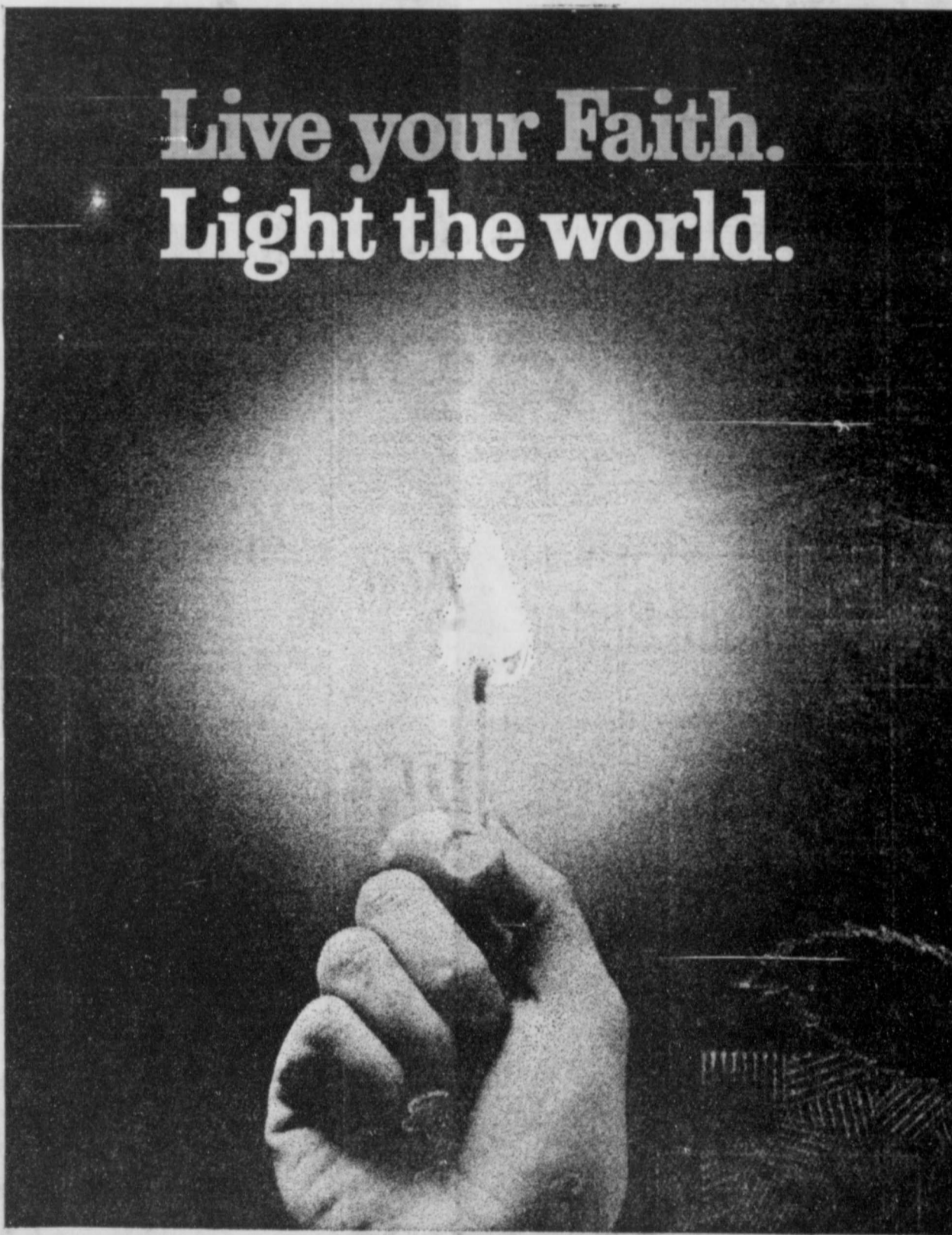

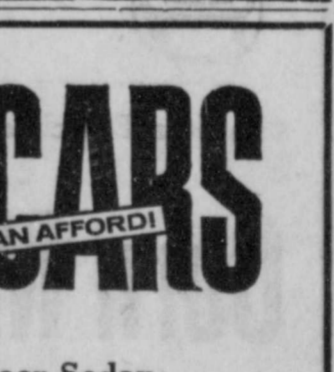

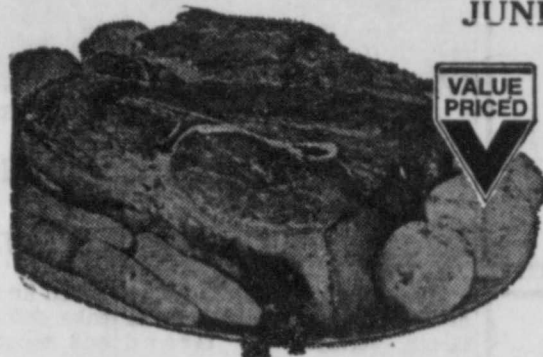
