opted: "(1) The Federal grades should reflect the proportion of saleable red meat in a carcass. "(2) There has been too much

variation in lamb cutability among carcasses in the same quality grade without reflecting monetary rewards for the high yielding lamb.

"(3) These grades can be used as a standard for improvement of flocks and the ultimate carcass yield structure of the

"The Association feels," he said, "With the use of these grades we will have a more acceptable product for the consumer because he will be carrying home less fat and more red meat.

"The proposed rules seem to be sound and valid.

"The proposed grades will more accurately measure value differences in lamb carcasses and will benefit not only the producer and processor, but also the consumer," Whitehead con-
